SAFETY UPDATES

Effective Monday, May 4, the Department of Environmental Protection will implement phase one to reopen the Florida State Parks. As these parks are reopening, DEP will be taking measures to ensure the protection of staff and the public. During this early phase of reopening, visitors should expect limited hours, capacity and amenities.

Phase one includes approximately 80 parks and trails throughout Florida. Portions of these parks and trails have been identified that can be reopened for day use with limited risk to visitors and staff. (No camping at this time.)

For example:

Amelia Island State Park is open for day use, 8 a.m. to sunset, for active recreation only, such as walking, jogging, swimming and fishing. Beach hours of access will follow local county ordinance. The beach area will be available 8 a.m. to sunset. Restrooms and trash cans are unavailable, all other park facilities are closed. Normal park fees apply. Visitors are expected to maintain safe social distances of at least 6 feet apart and limit group size to 10 people.

News from WBCCI and Region 3

**Approved March 31,
2020: Resolution of The International Board of Trustees of the Wally Byam Caravan Club International (WBCCI) Declaring A Proclamation of Emergency Due to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).**

This Emergency Resolution was adopted after the June International rally and International Board of Trustees meetings were cancelled. Briefly this resolution contains five main points: in-person attendance or participation will be waived; an electronic version for the current delegate

voting process shall be established; meetings shall be conducted electronically; specific voting and other emergency business processes shall be made by the Executive Committee; and the Emergency Resolution will be in effect for 6 months.

Since the Region 3 Rally in April was also cancelled, they will be following similar processes. Region 3 serves the southeastern coast of the United States from Virginia to Florida and contains seventeen units, including the Florida Airstream Club.

Normally elections and installation of next year's officers are done during the Region 3 Rally. As your president, I will be participating in the voting process, and if necessary, our alternate delegate Bob Masters will.

For your information, short biographies are included below from Bill Wild, Christine Baum, and Jerry Peterson, candidates for Region 3 President, 1st VP, and 2nd VP, respectively. All three candidates are solid folks and will be fantastic leaders. Region 3 will be in good hands.

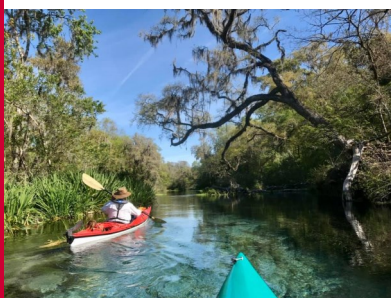

~~Salt Springs Rally~~ – **Cancelled** May 14-18, 2020

As of 4/28, the campground notified all who have reservations that it will remain closed until through May 18.

The May 2020 rally will be in Salt Springs Recreation Area in the Ocala National Forest, near Fort McCoy, FL.

From the website: “Salt Springs Recreation Area is one the recreational jewels of the Ocala National Forest, with a spectacular natural mineral spring that gives the area its name. Plenty of outdoor activities keep campers and day-use visitors busy, including swimming in the springs, fishing, snorkeling, hiking and boating. Salt Springs is located between the St. Johns and Ocklawaha Rivers, 35 miles east of Ocala, Florida.”

We hope to paddle the Ocklawaha River and explore the forest (there are three other beautiful, accessible springs, a

cross-Florida barge canal and Rodman Dam). Bring kayaks, bathing suits, masks and snorkels, bicycles, skateboards, fishing poles, hiking shoes, fire wood. Sorry, no golf carts. There is a boat ramp in the park and a marina to launch your boat or rent kayaks. The Salt Spring run leads into Lake George. Since the spring is a constant 72 degrees, and is shallow, it is always swimmable.

Reservations are through <https://www.recreation.gov/camping/campgrounds/233920>. A National Park senior pass secures a \$16/night full hook up. The **host camp site will be site 44** (hopefully) – see campground map online. There is an open-sided pavilion we will try to reserve with electricity and tables for group meals. This campground offers plenty of “walk up” sites for late joiners. Itinerary will follow.

Anyone who desires to attend should e-mail me for the link and password for our exclusive WBAC BalloonFest Rally RV Parking Application. We will have exclusive access to sign up for parking until the end of May. After that it will be first come-first served.

Please join members of the Southeastern Camping, Carolinas Airstream, South Carolina Coastal, Piedmont NC, Florida, and other Airstream Clubs from Region 3 and beyond for the Carolina BalloonFest Rally in Statesville, NC, October 16-18, 2020. We will have parking convenient to the entrance to the festival grounds.

New this year there will be a password-controlled page for us to sign up and pay online. It will still be possible to mail in a check and it is required to mail in a signed copy of the parking application. The application will also include a privacy release allowing the festival to release names of those signing up to the rally organizers

(me) so that I can know who has signed up. Last year they stopped providing that information toward the end of the rally due to privacy concerns. There will also be (only on the password-protected page for us) a listing of those who have signed up so that members can see who is coming.

We will have access to sign up before the general public. ***In order to guarantee a space with the club, our applications and deposits will have to be received by the end of May.*** After that the festival, as last year, will start assigning spaces with WBAC starting at space 1 and the general public starting at the other end (whatever that may be, this year it was 75).

This will be a no-frills rally with no rally fee. We attempt to plan our happy hours and meals around the festival events which requires some flexibility as the event timing is dictated by weather conditions. Note:

1. Reservations are not refundable, but the festival has committed to support transfer of a reservation to another person as needed.
2. This is boondock-style camping. Arrive full of water, batteries charged, and holding tanks empty! Generators are allowed and pets are OK in the camping area. There will be food trucks on site. Exit and re-entry are possible, but not convenient.
