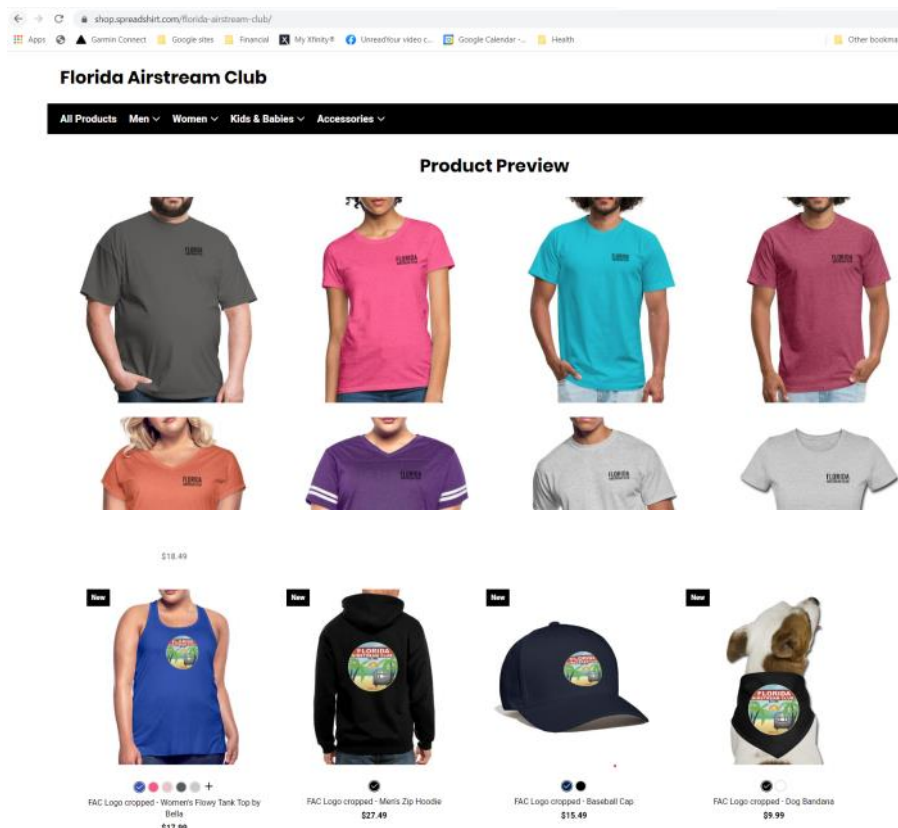

Tech Tips for Cooler Air

It is summer and of course it is hot. Not too long ago we noticed our 30' Classic (2018) trailer was hotter inside than usual. We were sitting in the full sun with 30 amp service, so we could only use one AC unit. We checked the diffusers and the vents were open (pictured right). We looked at the return air grills (lower left) and there was no visible dust since we brush or vacuum the outside regularly.

Later, when we got home, I did a closer inspection. I held my finger up to the return air grills and felt no movement. So, I removed the screws holding the return air grills in place and pulled them off. Be careful, the screws are little and easily dropped. Use a screw driver not a screw gun. You don't want to strip any threads.

Fine dirt had collected on the inside of the screens and the filters were clogged (lower right shows before and after cleaning). It needed washing with soap and water and light brushing with a toothbrush. The screen snaps into little tabs on the back of the grill. Be careful with those because they are soldered on and can be broken off. Also clean the screens for the second AC if you have one.

So, remember, check the diffusers and both sides of the return air grills regularly. Clean 'em, and reinstall 'em. Have a *cool* day and night!

Through *RV Lifestyle*, I purchased their personally curated *7-Day Adventure Guide for Southern Utah*, so that we could plan for a great stay in that magical state. We spent nearly two weeks in the southern part of the state, and next time I would plan for four! If you are heading that

way, may I suggest not missing out on Kodachrome Basin SP, and Coral Pink Sand Dunes SP, both were just fantastic. Lastly, Harvest Hosts has enriched our journey, and provided a safe and interesting place to rest in the gaps, when we had no reservations and needed to add in some flex time between stays at campgrounds.

We are currently in Idaho, in the heat wave. But it's a dry heat! Our son, who lives in Boise, took us on quite the adventure yesterday, kayaking down the Boise River. Our kayaks took a beating, I have more grey hairs now, Gigi had a spill in 59 degree river water, but we stayed cool as the air temps were nearing 100. Making family memories...

One last tool...*Mountain Grade Directory*. It maps out and describes the mountain grades, so you can plan ahead, which is helpful for those Nervous Nellies like me. Listening to a good book is a great way to unwind when you have finally arrived at your destination and ready to de-stimulate from the day's excitement.

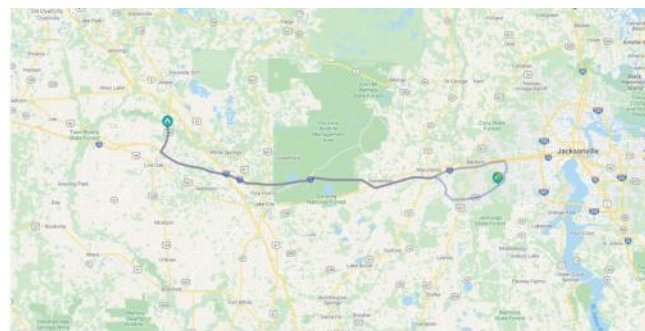

We have decided to have an alternate campground as well, since the state park is tough to get into. 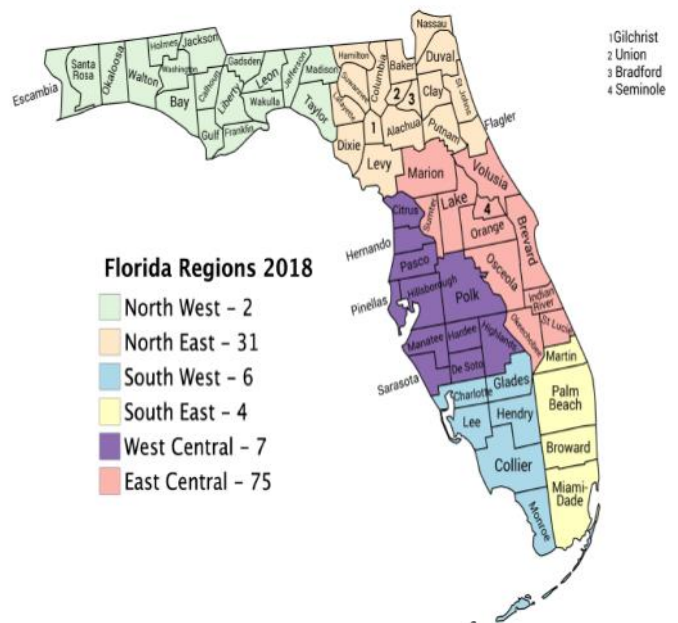
