Shop

Shopping in historic Hico is a one-of-a-kind retail experience. Satisfy your sweet tooth with award winning handmade chocolate, stock up on local farm fresh produce, or take home a bag of specialty popcorn. Blue Star Trading, located in a beautifully restored building from the 1890s and Hico Mercantile inside an 1895 Opera House are favorites.

Drink tasting

Visit Pecan Street Drink Shoppe for wine, beer or whiskey and have your tasting paired with local cheese and nuts. Nearby, Silver Spur Winer is a boutique winery where you can relax in a comfortable atmosphere and taste some great wine.

For a little more **adventure**, check out:

Dinosaur Valley State Park, with beautiful views and hikes is only a 30-minute drive.

Take a leisurely stroll on the tree-lined walking trail that meanders along the Bosque River

Try a climbing gym inside and outside of old grain silos at Siloville Climbing Gym.

The Bluebonnet Country Club boasts a well-manicured 1920's 9-hole course.

Test your frisbee throwing skills at the City of Hico's 18-hole disc golf course. Surrounded by large pecan trees, and overlooking the Bosque River, the course is over 6,000 feet long.
