

Look at the photo carefully and you will see the original name across the front.

Now headquartered in Sacramento, BDG is the world's largest almond processing and marketing company. Founded in 1910, the cooperative is owned by half of the state's almond growers, who produce over 80% of the world's almond supply. In 1915, The Exchange adopted the blue diamond -the rarest in the world- as the symbol on its label, representing its high quality nuts and distinguishing them from Spanish and Italian imports. In 1980, the California Almond Growers Exchange officially becomes known as Blue Diamond Growers. In 1986, the marketing slogan "A can a week, that's all we ask" was launched. And that's the rest of the story!

Skillet Apple Pie

TOOLS

1 cast iron,10" skillet (deep). Preheat oven to 400° and arrange rack in the center of the oven between 7 and 9 inches above the heating element. Use both sweet and tart apples.

INGREDIENTS

1/2 cup fresh apple cider (No cider, reduce a cup of apple juice to about 1/2 cup.)

1/3 cup maple syrup

2 Tbs fresh lemon juice

2 tsp corn starch

1/8 tsp cinnamon

2 Tbs unsalted butter

2 1/2 lb sweet apples and tart apples (about 5 apples), peeled, cored, halved and cut into 1/2 inch wedges 1 box of Pillsbury frozen Pie crust (you can make your own crust)

1 egg white lightly beaten

2 tab sugar

FOR THE FILLING

Whisk cider, syrup, lemon juice, corn starch, and cinnamon together in a medium bowel until smooth. Heat the butter in a the 12 inch skillet over medium high heat until the butter stops foaming. Add the apple slices and cook stirring 2-3 times until they start to caramelize, about 5 minutes (do not fully cook the apples). Remove the pan from the heat, add the cider mixture, and gently stir the apples until well coated. Set aside to cool slightly.

TO ASSEMBLE

Using the frozen pie crust, prepared according to the box, Place the crust over the apples in the skillet. Brush the crust with the egg white and sprinkle the top with the sugar. With a very sharp knife gently cut the dough into 6 pieces by making 1 vertical cut followed by 2 evenly spaced cuts perpendicular to the first cut. Bake until the apples are tender and the crust is a deep golden brown, about 20 minutes. Let stand for 15 minutes to cool and serve with vanilla ice cream or whipped cream. (Can also be reheated.)


