Memory Lane

Memories of Myron and Kathryn Fischer in the THLU May13, 2022

Our passion with the Airstream product started in the mid 80's with the purchase of a 1973 Argosy. We kept it for several years and sold it when our daughters were in their teens. Then in the early 90's, I was approaching retirement and found a 1981 Airstream, 31' in Waxahache. We bought it and had it delivered since at that point I did not have a tow vehicle. I retired in 1993 and by that time, we had bought a 1992 Dodge Diesel- 3/4 ton truck. This began our Airstream journey.

We traveled several years prior to joining WBCCI, we joined in July of 1997. The THLU in Austin was not aggressive in getting members to join so I called WBCCI headquarters and they told me who to call in Austin. I called a lady who was the membership chairman of the Texas Highland Lakes Unit and she invited us to their monthly luncheon. As we were in our late 50's, we thought these folks were awfully old but decided to join at their next monthly luncheon. Don Bachman signed us up and he and his wife became our good friends. We missed going to the1st year International which was in Boise, Idaho due to Kathryn's father being very ill who died in 1998.

However WBCCI sponsored an Alaska cruise that year so we joined our fellow THLU members and went on this cruise. There were about 600 Airstreamers on this trip. We joined 4 couples from our unit, Don and Betty Bachman, Cal and Barbara Rueping, Bob and Muriel Strange and Lillo and Jackie Etheredge and had a great time. We got to know them very well and that began our 25 year friendship with the THLU. After being in the club less than a year, I was talked into being an officer in the club. At this time we may have had 30-35 unit members and by that I mean rigs or couples. I ended up as President in 2000-2001 and that year we had 35 rigs. At Region 9 that year I had 60% of our membership at the Waco Region 9 Rally, It was a great year except for 911. We had led a Caravan to Ruidoso in September and after we got there, 911 happened. This dampened our Spirits but we continued to grow as a club.

In 2003, we hosted the first Vintage Rally on our 3 acre place and it began the 10 years of THLU hosting this rally. Our funds for the club were limited as we were relying on unit dues to keep us out of the red. It was obvious that was not working and I introduced advertising for our club as a means of raising funds to operate on. Camper Clinic in Buda was our first big contributor at \$450.00 a year and later the Manager at Camper Clinic raised that to \$500.00. I still have the letter where I checked with WBCCI Headquarters to get permission to do this and they said as long as you do not exceed \$1,000. per year you would not get in trouble with IRS. There were times that the Treasurer told the campground that we just had a rally and to hold the check until Monday or Tuesday of the next week so that we could make a deposit to cover our expenses. I served in different positions in the THLU Unit, ie Membership Chair, 1st VP, 2nd VP, President, Treasurer and then at Region 9, I served as Treasurer and at International I served as International Treasurer.

We took 10 plus caravans, numbered and unnumbered over the years and have made many friends. We have courtesy parking and this keeps us alive with an Airstream parking in our back yard from time to time. In 1994 we bought our 1st New Airstream from the RV Show in Austin at the convention center from the local dealer who was at that time located on Hwy 290 West.. Then 10 years later we bought our second new Airstream from Camper Clinic in Buda, it was a 2004 Airstream Limited 30' and we logged 145,000 miles on that one. We sold that Airstream in November of 2020 to some friends of ours and sold my truck several months later again to some friends of ours.

Over these 25 years we have made many dear friends and have so many good memories which are precious. Remember we have courtesy parking for anyone in the future. Texas Highland Lakes Unit which has now changed their name to Texas Highland Lakes Airstream Club is still prospering and I understand is the largest club in the United States. This is due to good leadership. Kathryn and I hope for the very best for our club and keep the shiny side up and enjoy your Airstream. We hope for the very best for all the Airstream Clubs and WBCCI International.



THLAC Waco Rally Airport Park, Waco Lake Campground, US Corps Sept. 29 – Oct 2, 2022

The THLAC Waco Rally dates have been changed to Thursday, September 29 –Sunday, October 2, 2022. (Please note the date change). Due to the current US Corps reservation policy, THLAC could not book a block of sites for this rally (the maximum is 4 sites per person). So, if you are planning on attending this rally, you will need to make your own reservation. Plan on booking early; the sites fill up fast.

The park has 46 sites with 50-amp electric and water hookups - 22 of these also have sewer hookups. The current price per night is around \$28. You may use your National Parks Senior Pass for discounted camping fees since you are booking individually. I recommend that you book your site within the next few weeks if you plan to attend the Waco rally.

About the Area

Airport Park is located in Waco, Texas, on Lake Waco. Current rally plans are to tour the Mammoth Dig, visit the Homestead Heritage, tour the Dr. Pepper and the Texas Ranger Museums, and shop at Magnolia Market. (the park is 10 miles from Magnolia Market). More information and a rally agenda about this event will be coming out as the rally dates get closer

So how do I register?

Search for "Airport Park, Waco Lake – recreation.gov" on your computer. You may search for a campsite under the heading "Campsite List." Use the map to help you see where your site is located. There are still a few available.

Then once you've booked your campsite, RSVP through Constant Contact. Debbie Trimble, THLAC Webmaster, has sent out an invitation with rally registration information. If you missed the message, contact her at debbst@gmail.com to request a copy.





Dear Rivet, I am going on a six week caravan this summer. Do you have any packing advice?

Overloaded

Dear Overloaded, I sure do! Remember less is more and follow these tips.

Choose clothing items that you can mix and match so they can be worn with anything you brought. Shirts in neutral colors like white, black and tan are likely to match with almost any bottoms. Just remember that darker colors provide more sun protection. If you are traveling during the warmers months, be sure to bring clothing made of lighter fabric, such as a poly blend, which is easily packable, durable, and dries quickly. During cold months, plan on layering.

Pack a week in advance to keep from panicking the night before your trip. This will give you enough time to make a trip to the store if you are missing something.

Spread out everything you are planning to bring onto your floor. Having all the items you're packing in front of you visually may even help you make some eliminations saving valuable room in your rig. Analyze each item individually to determine the likelihood of using it during your trip, Do ample research on the destination so you're fully aware of what you will and won't need once you arrive. Talk to friends who have been to the place you're visiting and see if they have any recommendations for what to bring.

Learn how to pack clothing items efficiently. This will maximize space and minimize wrinkles. Rather than folding clothes the way you typically would, rolling shirts and pairs of pants make them easier to cram into every free nook and cranny. Don't worry, they'll be wrinkle-free when you do take them out to wear. To roll shirts, fold them in half and place the sleeves onto the body. Begin rolling. With pants just simply fold them in half with the back pockets touching, and roll from either end, making sure not to form any creases. To maximize space you can stick the rolled items into a compression bag, available at most travel stores. This saves room by eliminating the air between clothing.

Bring only a few pairs of shoes. Bring two pairs of comfortable walking shoes / athletic shoes, a pair of flip flops (for shared shower facilities), a pair of hiking boots and a pair of dress shoes /going out shoes. If you find yourself packing more shoes, be ruthless and decide if you really need them! They take up a lot of space.

Pack waterproof shoes/boots and a rain jacket that can also double as your regular walking shoes and coat. This means you won't have to waste any extra space for your rain gear, but will still be equipped should it start to drizzle.

Be sure to remember these items. A hat or sun visor, bandana/scarf, swimsuit & beach towels, cashmere wrap for the ladies, and a jacket together with a warm hat & gloves for unexpected chilly weather. Finally, long underwear for really chilly weather.




