Nuts & Bolts

Power Conversion in my Airstream

What exactly does a converter do, you may ask? The converter takes 120 volt AC power from your shore power connection and turns it into 12 volt DC. This is what keeps your batteries charged and powers 12 volt systems and devices in your Airstream. The system also maintains constant output voltages flowing from your shore power connection or generator.

Airstream uses different converters depending on whether your model has a 30 or a 50 amp power system. Remember that most if not all of the lights in your Airstream are 12 volt. It is also worth noting that the control voltage for your furnace is 12 volt. Older model 2 way refrigerators and water heaters also use 12 volts as their control voltage.

You should familiarize yourself with your converter owner's manual. Not all converters are created equal and it is important to know what the particular converter in your Airstream will do. For example, it would be good to know if your converter is capable of charging lithium batteries before you decide to change over to lithium. Most newer converters produced nowadays have the capability to charge lead acid, AGM and lithium batteries. It is just a matter of changing a setting on your converter to accommodate the type of batteries that you have installed in your unit.

After my brief and simple intro to what a converter does, your next question may be, (How do I know if my converter is working?) If the battery maintains a consistent charge between 12.3 and 12.9 volts, it is working properly. Anything less is a bad sign. Some of the warning signs of an RV converter not working are abnormal flickering or dimming of the lights, and systems that require 12 volt DC do not operate correctly. Just a little test here because I mentioned some of those systems earlier.

Finally, if your batteries cannot hold a charge, the problem is either the batteries or the converter most of the time. To test your converter you will first want to test your batteries. To do this you should disconnect from shore power or the generator. With a digital multimeter test each battery. Again you should see a reading between 12.3 and 12.9 volts. Reconnect to shore power and test the output of your converter. This can be done at the battery box with a digital multimeter. Place the red lead of the meter on the positive post of the battery and the black lead on the negative post of the battery. If the converter is working properly you should see a reading between 12.3 and 12.9 volts.

I hope this bit of information is helpful. Just a few simple steps to follow to hopefully troubleshoot and solve a problem. Maybe we could do this as a Nuts and Bolts at a rally sometime. It doesn't take that much time.

As always, safe travels to all and see ya at a rally in the near future.

Come join us in September 2023 for a first "quad club" rally in many years at the Palmetto Cove RV Park!





Rumkugeln (Rumballs)

Ingredients:

2-1/4 cups (500 grams) powdered sugar

3 + shot glasses Captain
Morgan's Spiced Rum
(depending on how much you like)
or you can substitute for
Rum Flavoring (not a fan)

1 cup (250 grams) butter, softened ½ cup (100) grams) cocoa powder

Chocolate sprinkles, chopped nuts or unsweetened coconut flakes.
