Happy new year to everyone. I hope that everyone had a wonderful holiday season and have remained safe.

For this month's update I wanted to update you on the dues increase for 2024 from \$1 per year to \$5 per year. As you can imagine when there is change in anything that we hold as normal or the "status quo" some people have more anxiety with that change than others do. Change can be a wonderful thing given that we have the proper context to understand the reason for the change. Let me see if I can outline this so it makes some sense and gives everyone a bit more peace of mind on the increase.

As you may be aware, SECU has enjoyed one of the lowest if not the lowest dues for a club within all of WBCCI at \$1 per year. It has been a wonderful thing, but we are at the point that \$1 for dues with a member base of APPROXIAMTELY 200 airstreams does not generate very much - if any - excess cash to do anything for our members.

First let me outline for everyone the type of annual expenditures that the club has. Please keep in mind that we currently take in ABOUT \$200 a year in dues. Some of theses expenditures include:

- A past president flag for our outgoing president which is approximately \$95 or approximately 48% of annual collected dues.
- SECU's annual 990N IRS filing which is \$40 or 20% of annual collected dues.
- Annual bank maintenance fees which are billed monthly. \$96 per year or 48% of annual dues. This has been waived by the bank, for now, but will officially become effective in mid 2023.
- Additional SECU banner purchase for use at future rallies which is approximately \$50 or approximately 25% of annual dues.
- Unplanned expenses during the year for items such as SECU badges, business cards, advertising, food, gifts, and the occasional SECU sponsored lunches or happy hour at rallies including International and IBT.

In the past many of the items to get the unit up and running included:

- A SECU flag and logo including designing costs.
- Volunteer members fronting **their own** money for flags, caps, stickers, shirts etc. for member purchase, all at cost. Please understand that if these items never sell then that member is out of pocket the money they fronted to purchase the items and this practice is simply **WRONG**.
- SECU led rallies generally have a host sponsor and those host volunteers front much of the cost for any rally meals, gift bags and any type of entertainment. This can cost the host volunteer in the \$100's of dollars for one event.
- The Bloody Mary Event at Canopener is where a number of members contribute various supplies for the event. Even though there is a jar for donations, all of this money is donated back to the state park for allowing the event to happen. The cost for this event is contributed by SECU members who step up and volunteer to donate.

Members volunteering their time and resources (both financial and non-financial) has been a wonderful reason to be a part of SECU. What I have personally witnessed in the last 4 years in the club is that it is always the same 15 to 20 people that do all the work. These individuals are often paying out of pocket for expenses and are <u>not</u> being reimbursed by the SECU treasury for their costs. This practice is a bad habit that is **WRONG** for the club and its members who volunteer. Up to this point, we have been able to get by on the \$1 annual dues, but in the future these volunteers need to be reimbursed for their costs. The ability to reimburse members for the costs they put out may actually drive others to step-up to volunteer. We also need to move the club forward with other activities and events. Although we have relied heavily on volunteers, various donations, and financial investments in the past, it is not guaranteed that that will continue into the future.

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Just a few of the ideas for what the increase in dues will be used for going forward:

- SECU 'special' badges. These cost about \$1.50-\$2.00 and going forward those will be free as the cost will be absorbed by the treasury.
- Hard goods that have been purchased by volunteers members in the past and sold to SECU members at their cost. These type of items included hats, stickers, shirts, flags, etc. These items will be purchased from the volunteers and inventoried by the board. We will then continue to make those few items available for purchase through a future 'yard sale'. Any inventory that does not get purchased by our members will have to be absorbed by the treasury, this is simply the right thing to do. Going forward, we are working on partnering with a retail company that can provide caps, shirts, and other merchandise with the SECU logo that members will be able to purchase at their leisure. Doing this will not require us to maintain an inventory or have a specific amount of individuals interested in the product before we can place an order.
- There is a rally that is being held in February that is a boondocking rally, the G.O.A.T. Rally. There is an option to collect a rally fee to cover the cost of the porta potty or have the treasury assume that cost. These are the types of decisions that will be decided by the budget subcommittee that Lisa mentioned in her 'Piece of Mind'.
- Future SECU sponsored rallies where an occasional meal/entertainment would be provided. In the past, all expenses for this type of option was assumed by the rally host with no financial compensation.
- A fund for rally hosts to access for gift bags, door prizes, or welcome gifts that can be given away at the start of a rally.
- The occasional lunch, pizza party, or appetizers for a cocktail party at scaled events like IBT or International.

These are all ROUGH ideas that we can now begin to think about with the implementation of the modest \$4 increase in fees.

I will close by saying that I know there have been some people that have had an issue with the \$4 increase. I do understand that. But please understand that your board is trying to progressively move this unit forward. The things we would like to implement for the future will not cost a fortune, which is why the board implemented the change for 2024. The roughly \$800 additional in the SECU bank account is significant to SECU. If the impact of the \$4 is an issue for anyone then please reach out to me privately and I will be happy to cover the increase for the first year for anyone who requests it. I am passionate about this club moving and growing into the future. Please remember everything that is done within SECU is done by VOLUNTEERS. Remember to please be kind to one another and lets all treat each other with some respect when we are voicing differing opinions. Personally, I have been insulted because of this change on a few occasions. We should all strive to do better.
