We started our Airstream Life in 2018 when I was discussing attending the Telluride Bluegrass festival with my wife Terri. It was kind of a bucket list bluegrass festival with a focus on camping in a spectacular location. Terri refused to tent camp and I asked if she would attend if we had an Airstream.... She said yes! Within a week of this conversation neighbors put their Airstream up for sale. We started talking with them and they suggested we checkout the various sizes at the Airstream dealer. Which we did and left the dealer as the owners of a used 2014 22FB! We bought tickets and an RV pass for the TBF and off went on our first big roadtrip adventure!

The excitement and travel opportunities of our Bambi kind of pushed me into full retirement joining Terri. With a background in Electrical Engineering, I set about adding solar, Lilon and an inverter to the Bambi which worked great for a couple seasons of travel.

But the narrow width and crosswise layout of the queen bed convinced Terri it was time to go bigger! So in late 2020 in the grips of the pandemic, with no Airstream on any dealer lot, we decide to look at upgrading! We found several lightly used 25ft models but they were snapped up pretty quickly and at a premium price. We talked with the dealer and were able to secure a new 25FB Flying Cloud at a pretty reasonable discount. So 6 months later in June of 2021 we took delivery. The 2014 Bambi was sold in under 6 hours, with multiple backup offers.

Our Airstream calendar is generally organized to leave Texas in August and return in October. We have covered large swaths of the west including a trip through Yellowstone to Seattle where our daughter lives. And then continued all the way down the west coast to San Diego before turning towards Texas. Last summer we went east visiting the southern states including a stop at Frank Lloyd Wright's "Falling Water" Pennsylvania, and a stop at our newest National Park in West Virginia, The New River Gorge.

2023 will see us visiting various Texas locals in February, enjoying the Old Settlers Music festival (Dale, TX) in April, and attending the International Rally in Wyoming in June. Other Airstreaming plans for the year are still in the works. You can expect to see us at a rally or two as our schedule allows!

There was a lot of great food at the rally. Here are a few recipes to share:

Zephyr Marek made these Biscuits & Gravy Casserole for breakfast. YUM.

Preg: 10 mins, Cook: 35 mins, Total: 45 mins, Servings: 6, Yield: 1- 9x13 baking dish

Ingredients:

- 1 (10 ounce) can of refrigerated biscuit dough (such as Pillsbury Grands)
- 1 (1 pound) bulk pork sausage
- 1 1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided
- 6 eggs

1/2 milk (I used 1/2 & 1/2)

- Salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 1 $\ensuremath{^{\prime\prime}\!_{2}}$ cups cold water, or more as needed
- 1 (1.5 ounce) package pork gravy mix

Directions:

Step 1: Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 9x13 inch baking dish.

Step 2: Line the bottom of the prepared baking dish with biscuits. (I cut them in 4 pieces.)

Step 3: Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat. Cook and stir sausage in the hot skillet until browned and crumbly, 5 to 7 minutes; drain and discard grease. Scatter sausage over biscuit layer and top with 1 cup cheddar cheese.

Step 4: Whisk eggs, milk, salt, and pepper together in a bowl and pour over cheese layer.

Step 5: Mix water and gravy mix together in a saucepan; bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until gravy is thickened, 1 to 2 minutes,

adding more water for a thinner gravy. Pour gravy over egg layer. Sprinkle remaining ½ cup cheddar cheese over casserole.

Step 6: Bake in the preheated oven until egg is fluffy and cheese is bubbling, about 30 minutes.

Susan Fegley made these two soups—really good especially when it is cold:

Chicken Tortillia Soup

Ingredients:

- 1/2 onion chopped
- 1 can corn
- 1 can Rotel tomatoes
- 1 can Ranch Style beans
- 1 can chicken breast (I used shredded chicken from the meat dept)
- 1 can Cream of Chicken soup
- 1 can chicken broth
- 1 tsp cumin

Crockpot White Chicken Chili

Ingredients: 1 lb boneless skinless chicken breast trimmed of excess fat 1 yellow onion diced 2 cloves garlic minced 24 oz chicken broth 2 15 oz cans Great Northern beans 2 4 oz cans green chilies 1 can whole kernel corn 1 tsp salt 1/2 tsp black pepper 1 tsp cumin 3/4 tsp oregano 1/2 tsp chili powder 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper small handful fresh cilantro chopped 4 oz reduced fat cream cheese softened

Possible toppings sliced jalapeños, sliced avocados, dollop of sour cream, minced fresh cilantro, tortilla chips, shredded Mexican cheese blend

1/4 cup half and half

Directions:


Step 1: Add chicken breasts to bottom of slow cooker, top with salt, pepper, cumin, oregano, chili powder and cayenne pepper.
Step 2. Add diced onion, minced garlic, Great Northern beans, green chilies, corn, chicken broth and cilantro. Stir.
Step 3. Cover and cook on LOW for 8 hours or HiGH for 3-4 hours.
Step 4. Remove chicken to large bowl , shred, then return to slow cooker.
Step 5. Add cream cheese and half and half, stir , cover and cook on

Step 5. Add cream cheese and half and half, stir, cover and cook on high 15 minutes until chili is creamy and thickened. (To ensure a smooth blend of the cream cheese, add the softened cream cheese to a small bowl and add a ladle of the chili and whisk until smooth. Then stir that mixture into the slow cooker and add half and half.) Step 6. Stir well and serve with desired toppings

Directions: Combine all ingredients in saucepan and heat. Serve with shredded cheese, diced avocado, crumbled tortilla chips


Step #1 after logging into airstreamclub.org. Select 'Explore' then 'Find a Club' from the drop down list.





- If there is questionable weather, this rally will be cancelled. If it is cancelled, change your reservation dates to ensure you don't lose your \$\$.
