Canadian Maritimes By Mike and Cheryl Sisk



What and where are the Canadian Maritimes? It is a region of Eastern Canada consisting of three provinces -New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island (PEI). After the International Rally in Fryeburg, ME, we were able to join a caravan of four rigs (from the MO-KAN Club) that was headed to the Maritimes.

Our first stop in Canada was near Bayside, NB at the Island View Campground. We went to nearby St. Andrews which was a beautiful village with many touristy shops, and on to St. John, NB which is Canada's oldest incorporated city. It is the only city on the shore of the Bay of Fundy, home to the world's highest tides. From there we went to Hopewell Cape, NB camping at Ponderosa Pines Campground. We visited the Hopewell Rocks which are scattered along a mile of coastline and are an extraordinary area shaped rocks. It is a damp area, but easy to walk on - and incredible to see the tide levels! From there we went to Woodhaven Campground in Hammonds outside of Halifax, NS. We toured the Citadel, a fort in Halifax cannon is fired every day noontime. Unsuspecting tourists jump at the cannon as it can be heard all over Halifax. After spending in the area, including time at Peggy's Cove (picture at left), we

moved on to Orangedale, NS and stayed at Time Out Campground. Two of the trip's highlights were the Maragree Highland Games and whale watching in the Bay of St. Lawrence. We had front row seats at the Highland Games, where events included caper toss,

weight tossing (pictured at right), hammer throwing, and stone tossing. On our whale-watching boat tour we were fortunate to see over one hundred Pilot whales!

Our final stop was in Summerside, PEI for a week at the Linkletter Provincial Park. Cheryl and I were able to use our inflatable kayak in the ocean, where the water was surprisingly warm and clear. Many side trips included North Rustico, North Cape, Victoria-by-the-Sea, Cavendish, Green Gables and Stanley Bridge for a Ceilith (pronounced kay-lee)- music, dance and humor.

What an adventure this trip was! We heartily recommend this area as a destination for its natural beauty, locales and friendly people.

SLOW COOKER CREAM CHEESE CRACK CHICKEN CHILI

Author: Plain Chicken

Yield: 8 people Prep Time 5 mins Cook Time 6 hrs Total Time 6 hrs 5 mins

Slow Cooker Cream Cheese Crack Chicken Chili - this stuff is AMAZING! We've made it 3 times this month! We can't get enough of it!!! Chicken, corn, black beans, chicken broth, diced tomatoes and green chiles, cumin, chili powder, onion, ranch seasoning, bacon and cheddar cheese. We served the chili with some cornbread and Fritos. PERFECT! This is already on the menu again this weekend! YUM! #crockpot #slowcooker #chicken #chili

Equipment:

<u>6-qt Slow Cooker</u>

Ingredients:

- 2 boneles sskinless chicken breasts
- 1 (11-oz) can corn, drained
- 1 (15-oz) black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 (10-oz) diced tomatoes and green chilies, undrained
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1 cup cooked chopped bacon
- 1 (1-oz) packet ranch seasoning & salad dressing mix
- 1 tsp cumin
- 1 Tbsp chili powder
- 1 tsp onion powder
- 1 (8-oz) package cream cheese
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

Instructions:

- 1. Place chicken at bottom of slow cooker.
- 2. Add corn, black beans, diced tomatoes and green chilies, chicken broth, cumin, chili powder, onion powder ranch seasoning and bacon. Stir together. Place cream cheese on top of chicken.
- 3. Cover with lid and cook on LOW for 6-8 hours.
- 4. Remove chicken from slow cooker and shred with 2 forks. Return to slow cooker. Stir cheddar cheese into chili.

Notes:

Philadelphia brand cream cheese melts best in this recipe.

If needed, use a whisk to fully incorporate the cream cheese.
