

We toured the Petroglyphs National Monument, the Hispanic Heritage Center, the Native American Cultural Center, the Balloon Fiesta Museum, and the National Museum of Nuclear Science and History. We found the "seniors discount buffet" at the Sandia Peak Casino and ate at Garduno's. Driving to and from our campground on Historic Route 66, we were on America's original "musical highway," a section of pavement that has your tires playing a catchy tune if you drive at the right speed.



But then we saw an unexpected opportunity while watching the local evening news. There was a story about a convention in town. It was a convention of the American Association of Private Railcar Owners (AAPRCO), and the news story said there would be a limited number of tickets sold for folks to tour a half dozen or so of these railroad land yachts the next day. Who knew?

We got to the Albuquerque train station early enough the next morning to get tickets for the railcars tour, beautiful historic railcars riding on modern mechanicals. Their owners schedule their travels through AAPRCO, which coordinates with AMTRAK, which serves as their TV. The cars are typically staffed with their own Chef and Concierge. They have sleeping, dining, and happy hour accommodations. And like private planes, many are available for charter. Who knew?

Our busy rally season is just around the corner, and I hope you are checking our events web page every day to keep up with registration openings and closings.



Mods to Share Twin Bed Modification

Ross & Shirely Chessman joined CAC in 2022, after purchasing a Flying Cloud 25 FBT. The twin beds made the trailer feel spacious.

However, Ross observed that the mattresses did not have support on the edges. When sitting near the edge of the bed, he felt as if the mattress would fall off the platform.

Ross decided to make a modification that extended the platfrom and provided a space for airflow under the mattress. This would solve the stability issue and also help fight against moisture issues between the platform and mattress.

Twin bed slats from Amazon arrived in short order, and Ross used tools in his shop to custom fit them to the unique shape of the Airstream bedroom. He ensured that all of the compartments were still accessible, and even added a rail to top off the modification.


Now, the mattresses are solidly in place. No more concern of being dumped onto the floor.

This modification solved two issues for the Chessman's and was not expensive or time consuming.


Meet a Member - Steve Libhart

Steve Libhart is the 2nd Vice President for the Colorado Airstream Club, a co-host for the Carlsbad, NM Rally, and a host for the Meeker Rally. It's also tax season, his busiest time as an accountant.

I sat down with Steve one Saturday morning in February to learn more about his involvement in the Club. Steve was back in town after a trip to Reno to pick up his new 2016 International Serenity 23D.

Last fall, I met Steve at the Dabney Ranch near Creede, Colorado. He assisted the Rally hosts in getting rigs parked in the famous wagon wheel formation. Steve's energetic personality was recognizable immediately. I knew this was someone I'd like to get to know better.




The new 23D was top of mind as we sat down for our interview. This was Airstream number three for Steve. His most recent trailer was a 20-footer, which he picked about seven years ago.

Steve's Airstream adventures started in 2006 when, on a whim, he purchased a 1966 Safari from a seller in Illinois. He drove out from Colorado and pulled the trailer all the way home. The old Safari had been sitting for a long time and had a squeaky axel. On the way home, he was a bit concerned, but all went well.

The Vintage Airstream Club welcomed Steve and his partner Guillermo(Willie), and they had many great adventures in the classic trailer.

One of his most memorable rallies was in Laramie, Wyoming, where he met <u>Michael Depraida</u>, an artist who sold everything and hit the road in his trailer, ArtStream, creating art across the country. Steve doesn't leave home without a framed piece of art he purchased during the Rally. The work has hung from a wall in every Airstream Steve has owned.

Meeker, Colorado, holds a special place in Steve's heart. He grew up in this beautiful area. Although he lives in the Denver Metro area now, Meeker is still home to Steve.

Steve had to take some time away from the Airstream Club to care for his mother and rejoined a few years ago. In 2022, he volunteered to help the Club, and then president Rob Hughey took Steve up on the offer.

Steve knew that Meeker was the place he wanted to host a Rally. He wanted to share this beautiful place with the rest of the Club. Soon, he, Rob, and Brenda Hughey took a trip to Meeker and met with the Chamber of Commerce.

The Meeker Classic Sheepdog Trails Rally was born. The 36th Annual Meeker Classic takes place September 6-10, 2023. Competitors from all around the world gather to test their skills and crown the champion sheepdog.

The town of Meeker created the event to draw tourists to the town after the mining industry shut down. Their efforts worked. The Meeker Classic draws big crowds each year and gives the townspeople an opportunity to let the community shine.



In addition to the Trials, the Meeker Rally will treat participants to another special place to Steve. Trappers Lake is 50 miles from Meeker and boasts fishing, kayaking, and hiking opportunities. When Steve was a kid, a hike of several miles was required to get to the lake. Today, you can drive to the lake and even enjoy a nice meal at Trappers Lake Lodge.

Camping has been a part of Steve's life since childhood. He grew up camping with family in everything from tents to pop-ups and 5th-wheel trailers. These days, you can find him at many Rallies with his trusty dog, Hector, by his side.

In addition to the Carlsbad and Meeker Rallies, Steve is working with <u>TechnoRV</u> on a presentation for the Maintenance Rally this May in Fort Collins.

When I asked Steve for advice for new members looking to get the most out of the Club, he suggested the following:

- Introduce yourself to a board member and ask what you can do to be more involved in the Club.
