We bought it on a Tuesday and left home on Thursday for a truly excellent "newbie" RV adventure. From Fishing Bridge to the Tabernacle Square to the Las Vegas Strip, to London Bridge and the Grand Canyon, we spent three weeks in the little Santa Fe. But alas, I had to admit that a porta-potty and no air conditioning wasn't exactly perfect for family vacation travel.

Over the next several years, we bought and sold two other SOB's (some other brand for our new members). The second one was very poorly constructed on a 1x1 soft pinewood frame and led me to conclude that the next one would have to be an Airstream.

Jack Hendon was president of the WBCCI Colorado Unit. He was almost a retired railroad signal engineer. He was a good 6 1/2 feet tall with an infectious smile and an even more infectious enthusiasm for life. He was selling his 1976 Airstream 25-foot twin because severe arthritis had made it difficult to hitch up. But he didn't really want to sell.

The trailer was immaculate. But there was one big problem; Jack wanted more money for his trailer than I had in the bank to spend. We parted ways, with Jack asking me to go home and talk it over with my wife to see if we could find any more money for the purchase. He was a big baseball fan and invited me to come back the next day and watch the World Series with him. More money never materialized. But my son and I wound up watching the entire series with Jack in the trailer.

When the last World Series game finished, Jack told me that he had decided to let me buy the Airstream for the money I had in hand. But there would be a few conditions on the sale. First, he would pay my first year's dues to Airstream Club. Second, I would become and remain active in the club, and third, I would always carry his BRN on the front of my trailer.

A few years later, I traded the 1976 for a new 1996 Excella. I brought it to a WBCCI reunion luncheon at a Colorado Springs park. Jack was there. He was beaming as we shook hands and pointed proudly to BRN 13495, his BRN, on the front of our new trailer.

I'm frequently asked by other RV owners, "what is so special about an Airstream." Of course, it's easy to ramble on about better handling, aerodynamics, durability, and classic styling but the answer I usually give them is much shorter, "the club."

Today I believe our biggest advantage and our biggest challenge are identical. As a big club, we have the advantages of statewide reach, nearly unlimited "in-house" talents, and wide-ranging interests. But as a big club, we also have challenges finding venues for bigger events, finding effective ways to maintain communications, and working to ensure that our newest members and our much more experienced members are engaged and find a true sense of community.

The Colorado Airstream Club January luncheon took place at Cinnzetti's in Northglenn, CO, on January 28. Hosts Rich Howarth and Staci McDaniel treated 55 members to a program featuring a remastered version of the film *Africa! Capetown to Cairo*. Dale "Pee Wee" Schwamborn joined the group via Facetime for a Q&A session following the film.

Cinnzetti's was also the venue for a luncheon in the fall of 2022. Once again, the restaurant was excellent. The food options were tremendous, and no one went away hungry. Even those of us with dietary restrictions had a fantastic meal.

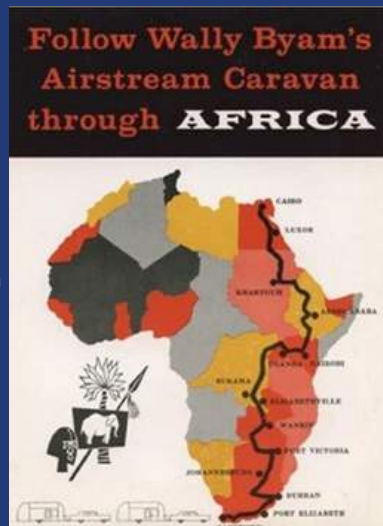
Rich Howarth worked with the [Airstream Heritage Center](#) to get permission to present the remastered version of the film, which captures the 1959 caravan from Capetown, South Africa, to Cairo, Egypt. While this amazingly updated version is not available to the public, ACI has links to an [older version of the film](#).

The caravan took eight months and members traveled through some areas that didn't have roads. Flat tires and digging stuck rigs out was common occurrence. The group concluded the trip by camping next to the great pyramids.

Dale Schwamborn, a nephew of Wally Byam, was an advance scout on the caravan. His mother, Helen Byam Schwamborn, began leading caravans in 1955 and organized the Wally Byam Caravan Club.

The Q&A session provided behind-the-scenes insight into this fantastic journey through Africa. Dale noted that his most memorable experience was the opportunity to shake the hand of the [Lion of Judah](#), Emperor of Ethiopia and direct descendent of the Queen of Sheeba.

Brenda's Baked Beans

This recipe was a hit at the 2022 Wagon Wheel Rally. You can find this and other great recipes from rallies [here](#).

1 pound of bacon, diced
 4 large onions, diced
 1 cup of sugar
 1 teaspoon dry mustard
 ½ teaspoon garlic salt
 ½ cup vinegar
 2 -15-ounce cans butter beans
 1-16 ounce can green lima beans
 1-15 ounce can of dark kidney beans
 2-14-ounce cans of New England style baked beans (small type)



Fry onions with bacon and add all other ingredients, except beans

Cook 20 minutes

Drain all beans except the baked beans and add to cooked mixture

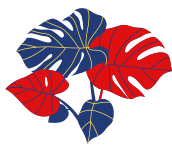
Bake uncovered 1 hour at 350 degrees

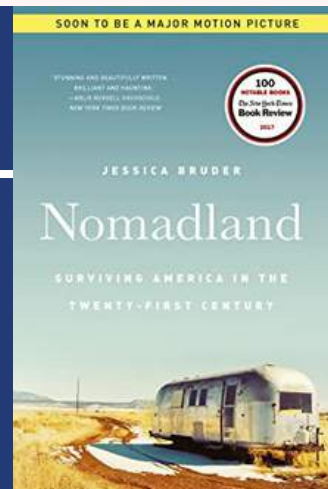


Book Recommendation

Nomadland: Surviving America in the Twenty-First Century
by Jessica Bruder

Jessica Bruder follows several people, including Linda, an RV and van-dwelling migrant laborer, as she travels between physically taxing seasonal jobs and reunions of her new van-dweller family, or "vanily". Bruder tells a compelling, eye-opening tale of the economy's dark underbelly and the resilience and hope of these hardworking Americans who have traded rootedness for the dream of a better life.

The story became a motion picture in 2020 and won three Oscars, including Best Motion Picture of the Year. The big screen could not capture all of the brilliance of Bruder's writing. This book will make you think about the harsh economic realities in our society.

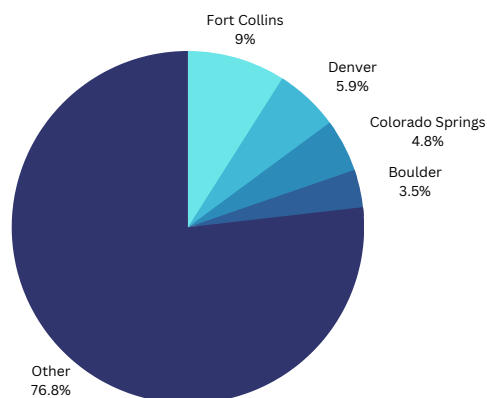


Quiz Answer
