#### Madison Challenge Status...

Registrations are now at <u>856</u>, an increase of <u>87</u> over last month's 769. It is hoped that as the economy improves, more will register as we continue to try and surpass our minimum goal of 1,200 Airstreams On-Site.

The deadline for 30-Amp Electrical Service has passed. However, we do have a few additional 30-Amp connections available. A \$255 deposit for 30-Amp Electricity will place your name on the 30-Amp Standby List. Those on the Standby List will be notified should 30-Amp Electric become available for you. If a spot does not come open, your 30-Amp Electric deposit will be fully refunded.

The 3-Amp Electrical service provides only enough power to keep your batteries charged and possibly run a small fan or TV. It will not support a coffee pot, refrigerator, or other appliances.




