President's Corner

Hi everyone. I hope that everyone that went to Madison had a good time and arrived home safely. Karen and I left for home on the 5th after the longest IBT meeting in recent history. The Rally was fun once we found out how to get around town. The restaurants were sure glad to have us and they had a few good ones close to where we parked.

I thought I would bring everyone up to date on what was voted on at the IBT this year. The first one was on the 26th of June and it was Bill Johnjulio's last IBT as President.

- 1. A new member forum at WBCCI.org was approved and is now being used and monitored.
- 2. A motion to allow units to receive votes from their members by e-mail or U.S Mail if they are unable to attend the meetings was approved. There could be another motion at the winter IBT that could change other rules pertaining to unit voting stay tuned.
- 3. A motion that would change the rules for qualifying for a numbered unit caravan from 10 days 5 nights and 10 trailers to 7-3-7 was defeated. This was revisited on the 5th of July.
- 4. A motion to reduce the International and region officers travel allowances by 10% was defeated. The club is facing a deficit in 2009-2010 and this was intended to reduce the loss.

Then it was my turn to sit in the hot seat for the July 5th IBT. What a fun day. Most IBT's last until 1:00 and we would be on our way home. This was my first one and it lasted until 5:00. Oh well at least it was interesting.

- 1. A motion to fund the newly formed marketing committee was defeated. Even though the majority voted yes, we did not have enough votes to make it 90% yes. I voted yes.
- 2. A motion to reduce the number of issues of the Blue Berets down to 6 a year was defeated. I voted no. They had not listed how many dollars we would lose in advertising.
- 3. A revised budget which projected a \$81,000 loss was adopted. I voted for it. We have a reserve that will carry us for another few years. I thought we needed more time to look at all of our options.
- 4. A motion to increase the dues from \$55 to \$75 was defeated. I voted no for the same reason as listed above. I thought we needed more time to study all options.
- 5. A motion that all future motions must have an estimated cost attached to it was approved. I voted yes.
- 6. We revisited the unit caravan issue again except this time all restrictions would have been removed. It was withdrawn. I would have voted no.

If any members have issues that they want to discuss either save them until we see you at a rally or e-mail me. I'll be more than happy to listen to your thoughts on any subject. I will say this; unless we get some new members in the next few years the club will go through some major changes.

Trailer Tips

Sonny Thompson, our Youth Chairman, recently passed along these tips for those of us that tow.

Dear friends,

As a result of Bob Eisensmidt's situation with his trailer hitch breaking on the way to the region 4 rally in West Virginia in May, I had my hitch inspected to assure that I did not wind up with the same problem.

"nondestructive test" on the hitch. They used what is called a magnetic particle inspection on all welded

parts. As a result of the test, I received a test report stating that the testing disclosed no cracks.

Cost for the test was \$70.00. Pretty cheap for piece of mind. I hope this email is a help for anyone wanting to have their hitch inspected.

In addition, we kept getting the smell of mildew in the back of the trailer. We thought that it was coming from the rug as a result of a water leak. Further investigation showed that the floor under the small chest of drawers between the beds had rotted out. When we removed the flooring (not an easy job) we found that the bottom aluminum skin of the trailer had broken loose from the rivets and was allowing moisture from the road surface to get trapped in the insulation (not being able to completely dry) which aided in the rotting process. Everything is now sealed and back together again.

You may want to check out the bottom of your trailer (especially the older trailers) to make sure that you do not have the same situation occurring

 - The sponsored child for the International was Alexander Hardin. \$9012.31 was collected for Alexander and he was given a bicycle.
 - 1962 lbs of Tabs were collected. The official value was not available in time for this newsletter, but aluminum is currently going for about .23/lb.
- Community Service. Janet Kendig, International Standing Committee Chairman for Community Service passed along these results from International:
 - Food Collection 4896 pounds of food collected in food and cash. \$1 was counted as one pound for cash donations. Collected food was Distributed to Second Harvest Food Bank of Southern Wisconsin.
 - Books for Wings & a Halo approximately 300 books collected.
 - 2239 knit hats were made.
 - 236 Lap & Baby Blankets were made.
 - 33 pairs of children's gloves were collected.
 - 71 neck scarves were donated.
 - 54 pints of blood were donated.
- The donations were spread across 16 organizations in the area.
- Church offerings of \$4250 were given to the Salvation Army.
- The Wisconsin unit distributed materials to the Humane Society.
- The North Iowa Unit made Cabbage Patch Dolls and distributed them to agencies in Madison.

Region 4 was very generous and was among the top contributors at the International Rally.







Crossword Puzzle








