## MEET JOHN CARRIKER

#### John and Sharon

When John Carriker attended his second Airstream Club rally, he was invited to the front of a room full of club members. As John faced forward, the Airstream Club president looked over his shoulder and asked, by a show of hands, who approved John Carriker's joining the club. For good measure, and some humor, the president also asked the audience, by show of hands, who would deny John membership in the club, and proceeded to "count" those non-existent raised hands.

That was 50 years ago, when John was 24 years old.

Ask John where he went and what he did on any of his Airstream travels in the past five decades, and he will be able to tell you either from memory, or by consulting the dozens of logbooks John maintains. Overall, John has:

- Owned 8 Airstreams, all with BRN 3679 and named Silver Bullet
- Travelled more than 330,000 miles
- Spent between 60 days and 4,000 miles in a slow year to 115 days and 14,000 miles in a big year, with  $7 \frac{1}{2}$  consecutive weeks his longest trip
- Visited all the lower 48 states except Louisiana.

As John says, "The more you go the more you want to go again!"

For John, though, it is less about the numbers and more about the people.

John has been blessed with partners who share his love of travel.

- John and his late wife, Sandy, travelled for 40 years together, starting 2 years before their son was born
- For 5 years, John travelled with his grandson, Jack, all over the country, racking up 209 nights, 28,751 miles and 4 international Airstream rallies, starting when Jack was 10 years old
- The first year they were married, John and his wife of 5 years, Sharon, spent their first summer together on a 7-week trip to Alberta, Canada ... with Jack, since trip was already "on the books" with John and his grandson. John and Sharon have been traveling together ever since.

John has stayed a member of the Airstream Club for all these years because the friendships he has made, all over the country. In John's experience, the more you invest in volunteering and spending time with club members, the more you get back. Tapping into his previous job as a firefighter, and his active role in the church, John has led an Airstream Club rally, and served as worship coordinator and first aid chairman at local, regional and at international levels.

What is still on John's bucket list? "Well, I have filled up my first bucket, so it's time to go out and buy a new bucket to fill." No doubt, in an Airstream.

	Locate utility hook ups
	Check AC shore power
	Safely park in any spot that is relatively level and where the ground is firm.
	When boondocking, use GPS to determine location in case of emergency
	Level unit
	Chock wheels
	Release hitch and coupler if you plan on using your vehicle
	Remove safety chains and breakaway switch cable.
	Use the stabilizing jacks to securely contact the ground
	Dismount towing mirrors
	Fully extend hitch jack; install puck
	Connect water & sewer

	Ensure LP tank valve is open
	Ensure that master battery disconnect switch is "ON"
	Turn on the LPG
	Pull out step

#### Inside Outside Securely stow all of your camping gear and goods. Do not overload. Turn off exterior lighting Bag trash for disposal Dump tanks Close windows Fill fresh water tank Close vents ☐ Close gray tank valves Lock all interior cabinet doors ■ Disconnect and stow service lines Latch refrigerator door Lock storage compartments Turn off HVAC Check generator oil level Latch TV for travel Check battery water levels Lower TV antenna Inspect electrical cords Turn interior lights off Check fluid levels: fuel, transmission, DEF, brake, coolant, windshield Fasten sliding doors by turning travel lock inward washer, power steering Ensure that master battery disconnect switch is "OFF" ☐ Ensure LP tank valve is closed Turn off water pump, relieve pressure at faucet and heater Ensure stabilizing jacks are fully retracted Remove water from toilet bowl, lower lid ☐ Check hitch and coupler for proper attachment Stow table Check safety chains and breakaway switch cable Lower blinds Fully retract hitch jack; remove and stow jack stand or wood block Secure hall dividers Check all marker lights, taillights, clearance lights, brake lights Pull up or retract step Check lug nuts Secure and Lock main door Check TPMS monitor Lock dead bolt


