Central Penn Airstream Club extends a warm welcome to our newest members and thanks our current members for timely renewals.

Our yearly Central Pennsylvania Airstream Club report is as follows:

In 2021 we had 47 trailers with big red numbers, consisting of 89 individual members with voting rights. Two associate member trailers with four individual members.

As we close 2022, membership numbers are 54 trailers with big red numbers, 103 individual members with voting rights. Of those, four are associate member trailers with eight individual members.

My best ever traveling partner is Janie Steff. Our Janes Island State Park trip was from 10/1 to 10/10/2022. Hurricane Ian was still hanging around so the early days were very windy and wet. To break up the time we took some day trips to Virginia Beach, Virginia, and Berlin, Maryland. Other years we have visited Assateague Island, Chincoteague Island, the Harriet Tubman museum, and Ocean City. All are about a hour away. We have also taken ferry trips to the small fishing village of Tangier Island.

On this trip, after the weather settled down some we crabbed for blue crabs from our kayak for dinner. And other days we kayaked on some of the trails the park offers. The park has 7 kayaking trails ranging in distance from 1.25 to 12.5 miles. Lots of wildlife to see along the way including Bald Eagles. One special trip we took this year was a sunset paddle to eastern side of the Island where it joins with the Chesapeake Bay. The views were stunning!

Janes Island State Park is on Maryland's Eastern Shore near the town of Crisfield. There are 103 campsites and 48 are equipped with electrical hookups.

Disney's Fort Wilderness Campground and Christmas! It's a magical combination as this campground is known for its incredible over the top Christmas decorations and displays. Each year the Resort and the guests go crazy with truckloads of decorations. This year though, it was a different experience and Chris and I called it a very expensive Disney Disappointment. We have been to Fort Wilderness before during this time of year and knew how wonderful a place it can be. I had planned on writing a glowing review for our Nov 13-18th trip, but I feel I need to tell you what our experience was really like. It was a little disappointing. So, my apologies in advance for the negativity but people need to know what the parks and campground are like at this time. We made the best of it with the kids but we will not be revisiting the campground or the parks again for a few years in hopes that it can get back on track.

When we arrived at Fort Wilderness on Sunday the 13th, the Christmas decorations should have been up but they were not. The Disney Resorts and the Parks had done nothing at that point. I asked a manager if it was due to the hurricane and they confirmed it was not. They just "hadn't gotten around to it yet with staffing issues". I knew that even if the resort didn't have their decorations up, the campers like us certainly would! Our Christmas cheer dwindled a bit as we drove past the loops to get to our site and noticed only about half of the people had Christmas displays up. That was a BIG shock as there wasn't one campsite that DIDN'T have decorations last time we visited. By Wednesday, we did notice Magic Kingdom had started putting up their decorations and by the end of the week the others were up too, but we specifically planned our trip around the Christmas decorations and so it was a little disappointing for us.

We found our campsite and as Chris started to back in I noticed a pile of bright yellow rice in my side mirror. It had been dumped as well as quite a lot of trash. A dirty campsite never really makes a good first impression. They had blown the leaves off and hosed down the concrete, yet didn't clean up the garbage. I cleaned up for the first 15 min of our vacation as I didn't want our dogs to eat any of the food or garbage left outside. Now that that was done, we can start our vacation and would only be up hill from here, right? Wrong. We asked for someone to come fill our propane tank which we had done multiple times before and were told to drive to Camping World as they no longer have the person who fills propane on staff. "He quit at the start of Covid". So for two years they have not hired anyone to replace him??? More importantly, they did not post on their website that they do not offer this service any longer so that people could make arrangements accordingly.

Our days at the parks weren't much better as rides were broken down frequently and in need of repairs. The parks were littered with more trash than I have ever seen and the bathrooms which are normally very taken care of were dirty at almost every location we went to. And believe me...I saw them ALL with my bladder! Hot Tip-the cleanest were the ones JUST inside the gate all the way to the left of the entrance to Epcot. I took notice that the employees were



using that one-lol. There was also a gross random plunger that had been left on the beach by the boat docks at Fort Wilderness so that it greeted everyone as they got on and off the boats. Thousands of people and employees walked past that every day and it remained there for the duration of our stay.

Overall we were very disappointed and will not be visiting Disney or Fort Wilderness again anytime soon. I sincerely hope with Bob Chapek stepping down and Bob Iger coming back to run Disney that things will get better and that the parks and resorts will become a priority again. Disney has always been a favorite place for our family to go and make great memories!

Alumalina 2022

Wendy and I attended Alumalina 2022 at Camping World Rally Park in Marion, NC (outside of Asheville) the weekend of October 28-30. This was our first year attending the rally which began back in 2011 near Charlotte, NC. It has moved locations several times over the years and grown to 287 Airstreams this year. We were #278 arriving on Friday. The rally officially runs from Thursday-Sunday but folks arrive as early as Monday. The park has nearly 400 sites most with full hookups. This year the rally fee was \$65/adult and a campsite fee of \$35 per night.

There was a USA/Canada map with stick pins at registration showing where everyone was from. Rigs were from 32 states and Canada. It was great to meet up with Robert (Hanno) and Dianne Jacobs from Central PA at the rally.

All of the rally activities are held at the very large open-air pavilion. Breakfasts (coffee & donuts) are available Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Friday night was a super BBQ dinner and Saturday night was all you can eat fish fry. It was amazing how quickly over 600 people could get thru the lines.

A number of Airstreaming seminars were held on Friday and Saturday. Saturday afternoon also included a flea market, craft fair, bourbon trail, beer swap, and wine tasting. Suffice it to say a large amount of alcohol was consumed.

Since it was Halloween weekend, decorations and costumes were everywhere. There were various competitions including the best decorated Airstream. The winner was a 1959 Milk Truck and vintage Airstream. Awesome!!!

Next year's Alumalina 2023 is scheduled for October 19-22, 2023 at the same location. Look for it in Airforums (www.airforums.com) next year. Hope to see more Central PA Airstreamers there.

**Well Call Me “Flush Pink”!**

I didn't know. Did you know? I didn't. Who knew? You probably knew.

Well, it turns out we must also winterize our Black Tank Flush System.

Who knew? On a recent YouTube binge watching evening, an RV Technician pointed out that newer RVs that have a Black Tank Flush System have a separate water system for the Black Tank Flush. I'm probably the only one who didn't know that. It does make sense to keep the black water system separate from the rest of the water system.

The black tank flush systems don't have a water pump. They use the pressure from the water supply. I had to purchase a hand water pump with a male hose attachment on a hose section. The hand pump also must have a siphon intake with a section of siphon hose. The other item is a gallon of RV antifreeze. A tube of Ben Gay muscle cream. Lastly, don't forget a shop towel for any drips or spills.

I pumped about a gallon into the black tank flush system. That's it! Finished! It took about ten minutes from start to finish. There is some force required in drawing the fluid out and pushing it all the way through the flush line and spray head, so take your time. You will find an arm muscle or two you forgot about the next morning.



One gallon of RV antifreeze- \$7. Siphon Hand Pump with necessary tubes and connectors- \$20. Muscle cream- \$5. Shop towel- free, one of your wife's socks. Job satisfaction- priceless.

Recipe Corner

Bagel Breakfast Casserole

Bagels are one of life's simple pleasures. They're so doughy, soft, and at their best when toasted. Bagel Breakfast Casserole emphasizes this delightful morning munch and pairs it with more of your sunrise staples like fluffy eggs, salty ham, crispy bacon, and of course, lots of melty cheese. There won't be a single worry about being hungry after a hearty meal like this. Start your morning strong with all your delicious favorites, thanks to Bagel Breakfast Casserole! You are sure to have a great day! Serves 6.



Ingredients

- 10 eggs, large
- 1/2 cup light cream
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 2 teaspoons onion powder
- 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 1/2 cup yellow onion, diced
- 1 cup honey ham, chopped
- 3 plain bagels, chopped into bite-size pieces
- 1/2 cup mozzarella and cheddar cheese blend, shredded
- 6 slices bacon, precooked and chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon dried chives

Directions

- Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.
- Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.
- In a large mixing bowl, add the eggs and the cream and whisk until the eggs are beaten.
- Add the salt, the pepper, the onion powder, and the garlic powder to the egg mixture and continue mixing until well combined.
- Pour the egg mixture into the prepared baking dish.
- Sprinkle the onion, the ham, and the bagel pieces over the egg mixture.
- Use a spatula to evenly spread the bagel pieces out, then gently press them into the egg mixture.
- Sprinkle the bagel pieces with the shredded cheese.
- Top the cheese with the bacon.
- Bake until the bacon is crispy and the tops of the bagels are starting to brown, about 20-25 minutes.
- Serve with the chives.

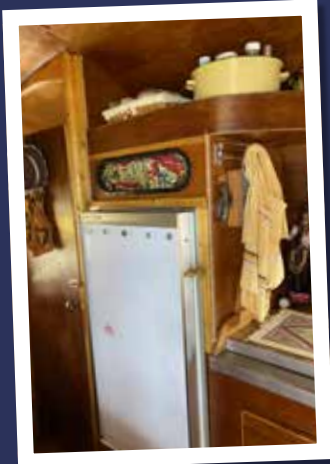
