If you have never been to this mill, it is worth a visit. The 32-foot water wheel, weighing almost 7 tons and producing almost 40hp powers everything in the mill including the apple press, grindstones, corn sheller & flour sifter (or bowler). If you get the chance to go, ask for Mindy, she knows everything about the mill and is great! More coverage of the Apple Festival on page 8.

We held our club business meeting on October 30th. A big thank you to everyone who was able to attend either in person or virtually via Zoom.

# **Greenwood Furnace State Park**

Jackie and I took a weekend trip to Greenwood Furnace State Park. We never knew about this little piece of Heaven hidden not far off RT-322. Most pass by the seemingly bland highway exit, 67B Bellville, on their way to Penn State.

This park is in the mountains of North Eastern Hunting County, in an area known as the Seven Mountains. A peaceful, secluded area right off route 305. The entrance to the park is on PA 305; a 10-minute drive west of Belleville or a 35-minute drive southeast of State College.

The Greenwood Forest was a community that flourished from 1834 until 1904. It was a 19th century iron furnace community. The park is small, covering 423 acres including a small but beautiful 6-acre lake that was originally dug for use by the furnace.

Greenwood Furnace State Park is surrounded by an 80,000acre state forest name Roth Rock. The campground is small, 51 sites. One site being the host, two sites being handicap, one pull through site. All sites are water only. There is a two-position dump station at the entrance. Sites range from 20 foot to 40 foot, back in, actual length for many is 70 feet and 30 feet wide. Most sites are very level. Weekday rate is \$27 and the weekend rate is \$31. All except one handicap site are well crushed, compacted, stone with a picnic table and fire ring. All sites sit beautifully positioned in mature trees.



There is a center loop section that is pet friendly. In the center of the campground is a shower and restroom facility. Water stations are plentiful on all sections. Sites two, three, and four, are 50 amp the rest being 30 amp.

Keep Greenwood Furnace State Park Campground in mind for a last-minute destination to spend a couple days off the beaten path.

# Little Buffalo State Park Apple Festival

Finally we did it! Jackie and I have been trying for three years to volunteer our services at the Little Buffalo State Park Apple Festival. We signed up the last three years to participate, volunteer, and help at the Apple Festival. Held the second weekend of October. Every year we either had an emergency or a major disaster that we had to back out of attending. I became paranoid at this time of year expecting something to happen that would keep us away from the festival. But finally we were able to volunteer. The following is a couple sentences on our first impressions.

Several years ago Central Pennsylvania Airstream Club was in charge of volunteering for the State Park Apple Festival. My understanding is volunteers would work Friday and Saturday from beginning until it ended plus clean up. LCBC church is currently, and has been for the last couple years, in charge of volunteering, cleaning the mill, making apple cider, cornbread, and cornmeal for the festival. Marty, the lead organizer, has been doing a fantastic job. Each couple works two hours each day. Two hours on Saturday, two hours on Sunday. You are given a schedule for where and when you work. Stations are the sample table, the merchandise table, or work in and on the apple press making Cider. Working just two hours each day was actually very easy to do and very rewarding. Interacting with the public, work at a mill from the 1800s on equipment from that time and helping out the friends of little Buffalo State Park, was certainly rewarding.

What's in it for you? Free campsite at Little Buffalo State Park Campground, possibly from Thursday to Monday, if you would like. A roaring bonfire each evening, Friday pizza party for those who help just knock the cobwebs out of the mill, it is spotless otherwise. A potluck dinner Saturday night. And finally the feeling you get when you're helping an organization and a State Park not only to survive but thrive.

If you have helped out in the past, 10 hours each day, or if you have never volunteered to help out at the Apple Festival, please consider or reconsider helping next year. We had at least four more spots of free camping available for volunteers. This is a wonderful time of the year to volunteer. The air was crisp, the colors were beautiful, the company is fantastic, and the gift of your time and service is appreciated. Please consider volunteering next year, being a part of Little Buffalo State Park Apple Festival.

# Our New Favorite Bath Mat for the Airstream **The Sutera Stone Bath Mat**

The Sutera Stone Bath Mat is a mat that is made of Diatomaceous Earth. Although I have used Diatomaceous Earth before, I had no idea these existed until recently. Now that we have tried it out, we have been switching out our old bath mats and use these in our bathrooms at home.

So, what is Diatomaceous Earth? DE is actually Diatomite, a naturally occurring soft sedimentary rock that was created from fossilized algae found in bodies of water. The ancient Greeks used DE to make building materials like bricks and blocks. If taken by mouth DE has been used for many things including high cholesterol, brushing teeth, etc. Once harvested, it can be crumbled into a fine power and made into many things including a bath mat apparently!

When traveling for a few days, our traditional bath mats collected every speck of dirt and dog hair that entered the Airstream. This has been the perfect solution for us. We love that it's totally non-slip. In fact, our feet seem to stick to it the second we step out of the shower dripping wet. It is super absorbent, it dries in seconds, it's not cold underfoot, is not overly large (23.5" x 15") and the best part is there is no washing it and nothing sticks to it. It can also pull double duty below pet bowls to catch drips of water.

If you are feeling frustrated with keeping your bath mat clean give it a try. Autumn can be a time of beauty in nature, but there are also concerns that we must be aware of when it comes to staying safe. Remember the following tips:

#### Fallen Leaves and Rain

• Be cautious when driving over leaves on the road. Take extra care and slow down if the roadway is also wet. Wet leaves can be as slippery as ice if a sudden stop or turn is necessary.

• While walking, be aware of wet leaves which can be slippery or hide additional hazards such as holes or broken/cracked sidewalks.

#### Wind

• Changes in the season can also include increasing or unexpected winds, which could be enough to snap a weakened branch. Be careful while driving or walking on windy days to avoid any falling debris.

#### Driving in the Dark

• Shorter days means more driving at night. Depth perception, color recognition and peripheral vision are all reduced in the dark. To prevent driving incidents, make sure headlights are clean, dim dashboard lights, look away from oncoming lights, clean your windshield and drive slower.

• If driving at night is difficult, get an annual vision exam, reduce speed and check with your doctor about side effects from prescription drugs.

• Daylight Saving Time ends every year on the first Sunday in November (this year, November 6, 2022). This means it starts to get darker earlier as we set our clocks backward by one hour. *Cross Tip:* When you change your clocks, it's also a great time to check the batteries in your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors.

#### Deer

• When traveling, be cautious of deer. Deer behavior is unpredictable, and they are pack animals, so if there is one there may be more coming along. If there are deer on or near the roadway, slow down, do not swerve, brake firmly and if necessary, blow the horn.

### **Creamy White Chicken Chili**

1 can sweet corn (Undrained)

1 can black beans (drained and rinsed)

1 can Rotel tomatoes

1 tbsp chili powder

1 tsp garlic powder and onion powder (or measure with your heart like me)

1 block of cream cheese

2 boneless, skinless chicken breast

1 packet of ranch seasoning



Place chicken breast at bottom of crockpot. Dump undrained corn, tomatoes, and black beans on top of chicken. Top with seasonings and ranch packet. Lay the cream cheese on the top and cover crockpot.

Cook on low for 6-8 hours. Uncover, shred chicken, enjoy! One of my fall favorites! -submitted by Beth Schubert



### Travel Tool from the Past by Beth Schubert Mile-O-Graph

On a rainy day, Karl & I were going through some things in the trailer and found one of these. This sparked my interest as I have never seen one of these. What did we do before Google maps, use a Mile-O-Graph!

This device is held like a pen with a small brass wheel that rolled along the lines on a map, either along a road or path, and measured the distance. You could use this to measure straight or curved distances of various scales with no need to calculate the distance, since it did so as you rolled it along. This was available in a range of colors, the cream colored version was used with nautical charts and the red one for road maps. The Mile-O-Graph was invented by Louis J. Petion of Garden City, NY in 1955 and patented in 1956.
