Joint Holiday Rally, November 30 to December 4, 2022



On Wednesday, November 30, 2022, the first of nearly 60 rigs started arriving at the Sarasota Fairgrounds for the "Joint Holiday Rally," four nights of festive fun co-hosted by the South Florida Airstream Club, the Florida Suncoast Airstream Club, and the Florida Treasure Coast Airstream Club.

It was an amazing event, attended by amazing Airstreamers, in an amazing place. While "amazing" is the overused descriptor here, what's truly amazing is that the rally happened at all, for this was "The Rally That Almost Wasn't."

Earlier in 2022, the "Joint Holiday Rally" was proposed by the leadership of the Florida Suncoast Airstream Club as a binary event involving their unit and ours. Planning, logistics, and communications were handled almost exclusively by the Suncoast Unit as the rally date approached. The Florida Treasure Coast Unit joined the fun later in the year. Then, surprising everyone with less than 60 days before the rally, the leadership at Suncoast unexpectedly changed, leaving the future of the event in jeopardy.

The South Florida Airstream Club quickly assumed a primary role in reframing the execution of the rally. A core leadership team from our unit, Suncoast, Treasure Coast and Region 3 was established and in meetings conducted via Zoom, quickly regained its footing in pulling off what ended up being one of the premier Airstream rally events in Florida in 2022.

The rally featured catered meals by Publix, excellent technical and trade presentations, numerous "pop up" gatherings, a "swap meet," a wonderful (very successful) toy drive for PEPPI Head Start in Belle Glade, an excellent location, and support from Airstream of Tampa, SkyMed, and Cox Chevrolet. In addition to the spectacular weather, the Sarasota community was fantastic.

Many of us enjoyed the local Amish restaurants and others with gorgeous waterfront views. Campfires lit up the evenings at the fairgrounds as old friends reconnected, and first timers found their Airstream "legs," establishing new connections and memories that will last forever. It seems like an ever-growing list of products and goods we buy on shelves of American stores (or online) are manufactured overseas.

Well, if you'd like a refresher course on some of the most recognizable goods and products made in the United States of America, we have a caravan for you!

We hereby invite you to caravan along with us on the Made in the USA caravan. It will start on Monday, September 5, 2023 (Labor Day) and conclude approximately Thursday, October 12, 2023.

We will meet in Wapakoneta, OH and begin with a visit to the "Mother Ship" (the Airstream Factory Service Center in Jackson Center, OH) to see how Airstreams are made.

The most popular tour on the caravan, as noted from last year's attendees, will be our visit to the Wilson Football Factory (<u>www.wilson.com</u>), where they make 700,000 footballs by hand each year. College and pro football are just starting up at that time of year.

A visit to the 3-story Bicycle Museum will show you one of the earliest wooden bicycles to the latest bikes made with carbon fiber.

We then continue on to Milan, MI and the Ford Rouge Plant where you can see F-150 trucks being assembled. The Henry Ford Museum rivals the Smithsonian in DC in its originality and its display. <u>www.thehenryford.com</u>. In addition to the plant and museum, Greenfield Village lets us experience life in days gone-by. Another popular stop on this caravan is the Jiffy Mix Factory in Chelsea, MI, where you will see how the products are mixed and boxed. Jiffy makes and prints the boxes and they are shipped to 36 countries. (<u>www.jiffymix.com</u>) In Auburn, IN, we plan to visit the Duesenberg Museum (<u>www.automobilemuseum.org</u>) and the National Automobile and Truck Museum. (<u>www.natmus.org</u>)

Arriving in Elkhart, IN, the tours continue at the Studebaker Museum, (<u>www.studebakermuseum.org</u>), where we will have an awesome lunch at the Tippecanoe Restaurant, which looks like a miniature castle.. At the South Bend Chocolate Factory, we will taste samples of chocolates, and learn the history of the sweet. Those with a sweet tooth can buy to their heart's content. (<u>www.sbchocolate.com</u>)

Next in Kokomo, IN is a great two-hour tour of Kokomo Opalescent Glass Factory (<u>www.kog.com</u>). You are sure to enjoy a kaleidoscope of colors created by the artists. Some of our previous caravanners even took lessons later in the afternoon.

We will continue to Remington, Rock Island, and Moline IL, where we will dine at Bally's Casino. John Deere (<u>www.deere.com</u>), Harvester and Caterpillar (<u>www.caterpillar.com</u>) factories will satisfy your need to see big equipment which keeps our farms producing the best in American products.

One of the top three rated factories by our caravanners is the two-hour Subaru Assembly tour. We won't miss seeing the Fair Oaks Dairy Farm (<u>www.fofarms.com</u>) where they milk 10,000 cows three times a day! Check out the website to see the whole experience.

Belvedere, IL is a great stop for the railroad enthusiast: the Illinois Railroad Museum (<u>www.irm.org</u>) is the largest in the country. This stop also includes our "Chicago day." It begins with a round-trip coach excursion to Chicago for an architectural tour of the city. Fun continues as we board a boat for a tour of the Chicago River. The Bean is an architectural marvel that's worth a stop. We will also visit the Navy Pier (<u>www.navypier.org</u>) before we leave the city.

Milwaukee, WI is the last stop. We will tour the Miller Brewery factory and taste the bubbles of Miller Brewery (<u>www.millerbrewerytour.com</u>). The Pabst Mansion (<u>www.pabstmansion.com</u>) has beautiful woodwork. If you like the wind in your hair, you'll likely enjoy the newly designed Harley-Davidson factory which is scheduled to re-open in July 2023 in time for its 100th anniversary (<u>www.harley-davidson.com</u>).

We also have a day trip to Sheboygan to see the Kohler company factory. <u>www.kohler.com</u> Well, if you are retired and living the dream, it is only reasonable to say you need a throne. A Kohler \$10,000 toilet/throne is there for you, and you'll see why it costs so much! This was one of the top-rated tours by Airstream caravanners in 2022. We will then tickle your palate by taking you to the final banquet at a Mader's German Restaurant in Milwaukee. <u>www.madersrestaurant.com</u>

South Florida Airstream Club Planning Guidelines

January 21, 2023 – The South Florida Airstream Club Planning Guidelines.

PLANNING TEAM:

The planning team will consist of the President, 1st VP, 2nd VP and Past President. This team will plan the master calendar dates keeping in mind that we want to extend each rally through the weekend to encourage attendance by members who may still be working. This team will identify the region of Florida that will be targeted for each of the rallies.

This team will identify areas for future rallies within a **<u>2 year time frame</u>**.

This team will solicit new camping venues from the members.

LOGISTICS TEAM:

The Logistics Team will consist of the 1st VP, the 2 one year Trustees, and 2 club members from different families. This team will develop the schedule for each rally. This will include the day, time of day for each activity and will also include free time. The schedule may be adjusted as the Action Teams share their suggestions.

One or more members of this team will visit the campground to assess arrival information or campground information that must be shared with the members. This team will work with the Communications Team (Fun Times, Facebook, Website) to create enthusiasm and to promote attendance at the rallies.

The Logistics Team will contact individual members to be in charge of one small activity at the rally. The objective is to involve members in a variety of activities at future rallies. This team will provide the Action Team with specific written job descriptions. This team will work with the Member Outreach Team to recognize new members and invite them to share their interests with the club members at some time during this rally.

ACTION TEAM:

One member (family unit) will be responsible for one small activity during a rally. The person organizing an activity may ask other members to help if needed. The idea is to have many others helping. This team will be provided a specific written job description.

MEMBER OUTREACH TEAM:

Team leader chooses 2 additional members for the team. Here are some of the important activities of this team.

- Contacts new members
- Phone call/email welcome to new members
- Introduces new attendees at the rally
- Recognizes birthdays and anniversaries through a phone call and at the next rally.
- Informs new members of Facebook page and privileges

COMMUNICATIONS TEAM

- Fun Times Editor email newsletter to all members
- Directory Editor keeps the membership list updated and sends a directory to new members.
- Facebook Administrator (chooses 2 members as manager assistants) to keep page updated with club information, monitors posts and enters new members to our page. Will keep the WBAC website up to date with club activities.

Rubber Moldings & window seals.

Proper lubrication of all windows and doors rubber moldings is critical to ensure proper function and life expectancy of material. Lubrication will prevent the material from drying out, discoloration, and breakdown due to the sun exposure to the Airstreams trailers while camping or outside storage.





I found this product to work the best for me, it is simple to use and it has it's own applicator attached to the bottle. Simply apply to all rubber surfaces and wipe with a clean microfiber cloth. Project time and cost, approximately 45 minutes, cost \$15.00.

<u>Door Latches</u>

I was having problems with the closet door during travel it would swing open and would not stay closed.

I installed a second latch on the door and now it remains closed and secure during travel. I have taken three trips, approximately 2000 miles with no issues. There are 13 latches total in my 2018, 28 ft Flying Cloud. Project time and cost, approximately 15 minutes, \$8.00.
