• • Experiences of an Airstream Owner • • •

"On a trip to Los Angeles, I ruined the Dometic Refrigerator in my Flying Cloud." - John Bennet **#1898**

I knew that parking on a grade would affect the refrigerator but I didn't know that it would be fatal. When I got home I checked with an Airstream dealer for a new refrigerator and was told that it would be about \$1,700. I went online and found a new one at Michigan RV Outfitters for \$800. They were great to deal with and delivery went smoothly.

My brother helped me take the broken refrigerator out which wasn't difficult. However, when reading the instructions for installing the new one I saw that the manufacturer specified that there should only be about an inch between the back of the fridge and the outside wall. (This was so that the air conducted by the fan on the back would pass through the fins at the top of the unit.) The problem was that Airstream put the refrigerator in a space with several inches behind it. The result was that air didn't have to pass through the fins and during high heat it was not efficient. Dometic's instructions were to put in a baffle to narrow the gap. My brother and I solved the problem for less than \$5. We fashioned a piece of sheet metal to direct all of the air over the fins. What we did was bend the metal so it would move all the air upward to the fan. We cut the sheet metal in half to fit it into the opening and then used duct tape to put it back together. A couple of small screws secured it to the bulkhead on the side, it weighed just a few ounces. All-in-all it took about an hour to build.

I feel good about how it works now and don't know why Airstream didn't follow the specifications from Dometic. All is well now and I would be happy to show our fix to anyone interested.
