President's Message

Doing MAAC business has made for a fairly busy month of January. As promised last month, we started work on updating our club's constitution. Wally Byam Caravan Club International (WBCCI) sent us a model constitution that could be used to update our club constitution. The model contained required, optional, and recommended language which made it pretty easy to update. We were able to update our constitution and send it out to our membership for review, comment, and approval on January 26, 2023. We need to have our membership approve of the new constitution before it is sent on to WBCCI for final approval. So far, we have had 10 members approve of our new proposed constitution. We will accept approvals or recommendations for changes up through the end of February. If major changes are needed, we will re-submit to our members for consideration but if it is approved as written or if proposed changes are minor, we will forward it on to WBCCI for formal approval. Once formally approved, it will be included on our website.

We have begun work on a MAAC event calendar for 2023. We contacted the American Legion in Crisfield, MD, to schedule our annual Crabby Rally. We are asking them to reserve six camping spots, numbers 7 to 12, for the weekend of September 22 and 23, 2023. Last year we had spots 1 to 6 but they were a little too close to the Legion building making it somewhat difficult to jockey our trailers into position. Spots 7 to 12 gives us more room to turn around and back into the camping spots. We have not yet had our requests for the dates and preferred spots confirmed but we hope to have confirmation soon.

We are considering a rally at Shawnee State Park in PA for the weekend of August 11 and 12, 2023. Wayne is a big fan of Shawnee and has tried to schedule a rally there in the past but there was not much interest. Hopefully, this year will be different! You will need to make and pay for your own reservation but you need to do so soon because Shawnee camping spots fill up very quickly!

The ones we are looking at are Point Lookout, Smallwood, Susquehanna. Rocky Gap, and Cedarville State Parks.



Internet Access in an Airstream

Reliable internet access in an Airstream has become increasingly important with the proliferation of remote work. The beautiful, aluminum monocoque of the Airstream trailers, unfortunately, acts like a faraday cage preventing the

cellular signals from passing through, therefore, we have an additional challenge to overcome, particularly when the cellular signals are not the strongest.

In areas where there is a strong cellular signal, your cell phone acting as a hotspot or a dedicated hotspot router may be sufficient. Most campgrounds don't have strong cell signals, so effective remote work with video calls, Zoom meetings and VPNs requires some additional technology.



The least expensive upgrade option is to purchase a hotspot device that can support an external antenna. Personally, I have a Verizon Jetpack MiFi 8800L that has two ports that can be used

with an external Netgear antenna. This antenna uses suction cups and can be placed on any window to optimize the signal strength. Not all hot spots can work with external antennas so make sure to check before signing a contract.

The next option on the cost spectrum would be to add a signal booster. There are many options in this category and they all suffer, from one extent to another, with limited range due to signal loops between the inside antenna and the



outside antenna. My recommendation is to use a directional antenna, such as the WeBoost Destination RV. Not only does it have a better antenna, the directional nature of the antenna helps to reduce the signal looping and will provide a stronger signal to your phone or hotspot—the closer the device to the internal antenna, the better. Depending on the type of cable, the satellite port on the side of the Airstream can be used to make connecting the antenna easier. These boosters are not magic, if there is no cellular signal, they can't make one appear, but they can take an otherwise unusable signal and make it functional.

Taking things even further up the price and functionality spectrum is a dedicated router with a roof mounted antenna. I have a Peplink MAX BR1 Pro 5G mounted permanently in my 2021 Globetrotter 25FBT. There



is a Mobilemark 7-in-1 antenna mounted on the roof—I am currently only using 5 of the antennas since that is what the factory pre-wire came with. This specific antenna requires a metal ground plane to be most effective and the Airstream is the best possible ground plane to help boost the signal. Like a hot spot, this router requires a dedicated SIM card from a cell carrier and an appropriate data plan. This is where things can get complicated with finding a plan that is compatible. I tried multiple plans before purchasing a 5G Verizon MiFi that would allow me to activate the service and then I transferred the SIM card into the router—purchasing a may no longer be necessary now that Verizon has fully certified the router.

Having a dedicated router in the Airstream means that Internet connected home automation can be used. Micro-Air makes a thermostat that can be accessed on your phone; Victron GX devices for monitoring batteries, inverters and solar can be connected to upload to the Victron VRM site; pet monitors or security cameras can be used. This router can be used while traveling—I've had a strong enough signal in my truck while driving that I could work while someone else is doing the driving.

One option that is increasingly popular is Starlink. Starlink uses an external antenna and cable to connect to a router inside the Airstream. The current challenge with Starlink is that the portable plans are deprioritized and that means that the service can struggle in more congested areas. Combine this with the need to have a clear view of the sky to have uninterrupted communication with the satellites, I don't



feel it is a good primary option for most people. A few years from now, when there are more satellites, Starlink will be a much more viable option.

Something I haven't touched on is the cell data plan that you need. This is a constantly moving target with a lot of plans grandfathered in as long as they stay active. For example, I have a Verizon prepaid unlimited data plan on my MiFi 8800L—this plan existed for a short time a few years ago and is truly unlimited. My Peplink router has a 150GB postpaid Verizon data plan. There are two main differences between these plans. My prepaid plan is limited to LTE while the postpaid plan supports 5G. The other difference has to do with the priority of

the service. The Verizon postpaid plan has the highest priority on the Verizon network, with the prepaid plan being the next tier down. Other services that use the Verizon network will be even lower priority. I experienced this first hand at the Alive Music Festival at Atwood Lake in Ohio. With 16,000 people in attendance, my Peplink router worked reasonably well, my Mifi 8800L was ok for really basic services, and a friend who used Mint Mobile had no functional service at all.

Thanks to David Hewett of Sister Club Al-Mon-O for this <u>great article</u> ! On a personal note, we have had the Starlink, RV version, for about a year, and *could not be happier*. Especially for the fact that one can "Pause" (only on a *full* month basis) service. We slowed our 'Streaming down after Thanksgiving, but had "paused" our service with Starlink in September. And no bills Oct/Nov/Dec/Jan. If we are just heading out for a w/end, we likely don't turn Starlink "on". Only use it on extended trips, or a trip that I **need** to be "at work".



"Yes" one does have to have a clear line-of-sight for the best access. However, even if you have trees, you will simply get some slowdown, or "Buffering". The more trees, the heavier the buffering. I did not find it irksome, especially with a 50 foot cable.



Now, many, more skilled than me, 'Streamers have gone so far as to outfit the Ethernet cable using a SMART plug. That's my next project! As for now, we just run the cable thru the hatch, or, if on shore power, we just plug the router into an exterior port on the Silver Nomad.
