

Carried Away

Laura and I, along with Ryan and Kelley Jilek, enjoyed a bucket list event that did not disappoint. In fact, we got "carried away" at the world's largest, annual hot air ballooning event that takes place in New Mexico the first week of October. We were able to take in the 50th Annual Balloon Fiesta with the best seats in the house!

It started with us entering our names into the lottery for coveted sites with the "Balloon Fiesta National Airstream Rally". We submitted our names into the lottery in January, along with perhaps a thousand others, and were notified in February that we were in! These sites are sought after because you are literally camping in the parking lot of the Balloon Fiesta Museum, along with 150 other shiny airstreams. It is just a short walk to the launch field and more than 90 vendors, so you are fully immersed in the experience. Don't want to get up early and walk to the launch field? Grab you coffee and watch as hundreds of beautiful balloons fly over your trailer!

The Balloon Fiesta is in early October and the experience was beyond anything we imagined. But for Laura, the fun began as soon as we knew we found out we were chosen. She started the planning process and put together a trip of a lifetime.

Ryan and Kelley left Dickinson and spent the night with us in Spearfish before we began the 900 mile journey. We knew we wanted to get beyond the Denver traffic, so drove to Colorado Springs the first day. We spent the night at Cheyenne Mountain State Park. It is just outside the city, but feels worlds away in a beautiful mountain setting. It was quiet, with stunning views of the city below. The next morning, we were off to Albuquerque and the Enchanted Trails RV Park.

The Enchanted Trails is an RV park on the Historic Route 66, but for us, it is the staging sight for our trip into the Balloon Fiesta Park. We were encouraged to spend Thursday evening at the Enchanted Trails so that Friday morning we could be caravaned in groups of 10 over to the our sites at the Balloon park. In order to be parked together with Ryan and Kelley, we just





had to leave Enchanted Trails together. Camping at the Balloon Park is dry camping with generators allowed. We filled our tanks before going, but water and pump service were available if needed.

The caravan went smoothly and quickly and it was time to get started. Ryan had brewed a keg of Hatch Chili beer, so we had a nice group of people visiting and getting to know one another. That evening was a group dinner with introductions and instructions. All of the people that put this group together are volunteers, so kudos to them.

The next morning we are treated to an outstanding drone light show at 5:45am. We make our way to the launch field for the Dawn Patrol at 6am. Dawn Patrol balloon pilots take off just before sunrise so that fellow balloonist can watch the balloons and get an early idea of wind speeds and direction at different altitudes. On Mass Ascension days, about a dozen Dawn Patrol balloons treat the crowd to a choreographed inflation and launch set to music. It is visually stunning and a great way to start our weekend.

Mass Ascension is the launch of all the participating balloons, going out in several waves. With 500-600 balloons launching, the morning is filled with a stunning onslaught of sounds and color. The first morning of Mass Ascension, the four of us made our way down onto the launch field. We are literally walking among the balloons as the crew layout and prepare the balloons for launch. Spectators being allowed on the field to feel the heat and hear the swoosh of the hot air filling the balloons is what makes this a once in a lifetime experience. Watching them grow into these fabulous shapes and colors and then launch into the sky is beyond description. You literally need to experience this for yourself.

We spent most of the morning on the field, taking hundreds of pictures and thoroughly enjoying ourselves. After lunch, we visited the Balloon Fiesta Museum and learned of the history of ballooning and of the Fiesta in Albuquerque.

In the evening, we are treated the Balloon Glow. Right at dusk, many of the balloons fire their burners and light up at the same time. It is quite spectacular as the balloons light up the evening sky like giant holiday ornaments. A fantastic fireworks show closes out the evening.

The second morning of Mass Ascension, Laura and Kelley start the morning on the field while Ryan and I have an extra cup of coffee and wait for the balloon to fly directly over the mass of Airstream trailers. It was a perfect morning for the "Albuquerque Box". The Albuquerque Box is a wind pattern that sets up during the morning hours, mainly during October. Winds at a lower flight level push balloons to the southwest toward the city. As balloons rise in altitude, upper-level winds will then carry balloons back to the northeast. It resulted in the sky above us being filled with hundreds of balloons, some at lower altitudes and some returning to the area at higher altitudes.

The Airstream Rally is Friday through Tuesday morning, while the Balloon Fiesta continues through the next weekend. So on Tuesday, after the morning festivities, we packed up the trailers and headed north on the Turquoise Trail. This is a great alternative to Interstate 25 between Albuquerque and Santa Fe. The entire route includes a drive along Sandia Crest Byway then through the old mining towns of Golden, Madrid and Los Cerrillos.

When planning the trip, we knew we wanted to spend some time in Santa Fe and also the Santa Fe Mountains before heading home. We found a gem of a campground in the Black Canyon Campground (USFS campground). It was a quick drive into Santa Fe and a nice drive to Bandelier National Monument for some hiking.

As we made the trek home, we spent a night at the Great Sand Dunes National Park and Pre-

serve in southern Colorado. From there we continued north, avoiding I-25 by driving the western side of the Front Range.

This was truly a trip to remember. While the Balloon Fiesta is an event worth doing regardless, if you can score a site with the Airstream group, it will make the trip that much sweeter.

All proceeds will go to the United Way charity selected by the Rally. Your entry does not need to be perfect – you're among friends and this is for a very good cause.

Then, for those of you attending the Rally at Rock Springs, there is also an Art Show where you can show off your hobby, but you are not limited to size of your artwork. This Art Show will be judged and ribbons awarded in the categories listed.
