

In general, Kalamazoo County Parks have a no alcohol rule in any of their parks. The good news is that since the Kalamazoo County Expo Center has a campground, the staff will turn a blind eye **up to a point**. As with any state or national park, please make sure if you consume alcohol outside of your Airstream, use non-descript cups and glasses. We all need to follow the guideline of no alcoholic beverage containers out in the open and in plain sight. We appreciate everyone following this guideline!



Please note: In the first pre-rally email, registrants may sign up for a Paint and Sip session. The Paint and Sip is where you BYOB and paint your custom design on glassware. This activity will be held in the Expo Center, so we must be very discrete and again, use non-descript cups and glasses.

Animal Rescue Project, Kalamazoo, Michigan

The Animal Rescue Project focuses on saving at-risk pets in pound facilities. They save homeless pets, one at a time, give them medical care and a safe temporary home, and provide responsible adoption services to those seeking pets.



As a non-profit organization, they rely solely on private donations and receive no funds from local, state, or federal governments. Their goal is simply to ensure as many dogs and cats as possible get a second chance at the life they deserve.

Animal Rescue Project personnel work jointly with other Kalamazoo animal-related charities to share donations, so there is no worry about items expiring or not being used by this or other closely-related animal charities.

Here's the process! Look at the list below and determine what items you can bring to donate at the Region 4 Rally in Kalamazoo. There will be a time when the Animal Rescue Project volunteers and staff will be there with some of their animals. Please bring your donations to that event and place them in the back of the empty pickup truck (hopefully, we have a volunteer who has an open truck bed!). The items will be driven to the Animal Rescue Project 5-10 minutes from the Expo Center. *If you can volunteer your truck to gather/delivery the items, please let us know!*

Series on Kalamazoo and the Surrounding Area

Part III: What to See and Do in Counties Surrounding Kalamazoo

Sharing a county line with Kalamazoo County, Michigan, are the following counties: Allegan, Barry, and Van Buren. Each has its own identity, with exciting and interesting things to see and do. While traveling to the Expo Center for the Region 4 Rally, while staying at the Expo Center, and/or when returning home or to your next destination, take some time and explore this beautiful area of lower Michigan. You will be glad you did!

Allegan County

Allegan County is an overall quiet county bordering Lake Michigan to the west of Kalamazoo County. According to TripAdvisor, here are some of the "Traveler's Favorites" in Allegan County:

Saugatuck Dune Ride (https://www.saugatuckduneride.com/). If you have ever traveled to any of the Lake Michigan shore areas, you know that riding over the dunes is fun! This ride does not disappoint! Opening in early May and driven by a guide, you will learn the history and fun facts about the dunes as well as experience a 40-minute dune ride over their 300+ private acres!

Oval Beach. Being on the water is what Western Michigan is all about! The Oval Beach location is perfect for those who enjoy their beach time. The beach is located at Perryman Street and Oval Beach Drive, Saugatuck, MI, 49453, and is open from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.



Celebrated around the world for its beautiful sweep of shoreline and backdrop of rolling dunes, this is the main beach in town and the most happening place to soak in the sun. Its impressive pedigree of awards (*Condé Nast Traveler's* Top 25 Beaches in the World, *National Geographic* Traveler's Top Freshwater Beaches in the USA, and MTV's Top 5 Beaches in the USA) is proof of its status as a summertime favorite and natural beauty spot. Easy parking, concessions, and a picnic area will keep the whole group happy until the sun goes down (https://saugatuck.com/business-listings/oval-beach/). Note that parking is \$10/car, and cash and credit cards are accepted.



Butler Street, Saugatuck. According to City-Data.com, William Gay Butler founded the town of Saugatuck, Michigan, and its main street honors him with its name. The street and the area combine small-town charm, 19th-century architecture, and an abundance of specialty shopping, dining, and artistic flair. *Midwest Living* magazine ranked the Saugatuck-Douglas area #5 on its list of Best Small-Town Getaways. Together the towns of Douglas and Saugatuck, they are known as "The Art Coast of Michigan," thanks to the number of artists who have taken up residence and operate studios and galleries in the area. (http://www.city-data.com/articles/Butler-Street-Saugatuck-Michigan-a.html)

Barry County

<u>The Gilmore Car Museum</u>. At 4.9 stars, the Gilmore Car Museum is a "must-see" on any car enthusiast's list. Located in Hickory Corners, Michigan, the museum exhibits over 400 vintage and collector vehicles and motorcycles from all eras in several vintage buildings situated on a 90-acre campus. The museum claims to be the largest automobile museum in North America.



Because of the large number of exhibits, touring the facility as a group is difficult. The suggestion is that individuals or small groups (2-4?) may better see those cars of interest. The museum has a fee, and up-to-date ticket prices can be found at their website: https://gilmorecarmuseum.org/visit/hours-admission. Keep in mind there are over 435 cars to see on 90 acres (not all acreage has buildings). There are food vendors on site, and be prepared for a great deal of walking. If you have not visited the museum, now is your chance!

Van Buren County

This county is all about getting outside! This beautiful county borders Lake Michigan and provides opportunities for getting outdoors and exploring the area. There are trails to hike and bike, sand dunes to climb, lighthouses to see, and small lakeside towns to explore.

<u>South Haven Lighthouse</u>. If you love to tour lighthouses, then Van Buren County has you covered. The town of South Haven, Michigan, is home to the South Haven Lighthouse, whose pier is an easy walk (weather permitting). More about the Historical Society of South Haven's red and black lighthouse can be found here: https://southhavenlight.org/



Michigan Maritime Museum. Another treasure in South Haven is this museum, which highlights the maritime history along with part of the Lake Michigan lakeshore. They recently completed Phase I of their complete update and remodel of the museum. From hands-on exhibits on the authentic waterfront campus to historically immersive experiences aboard their on-water fleet, the Michigan Maritime Museum has something for every Great Lakes enthusiast. https://www.michiganmaritimemuseum.org/

Kal-Haven Trail. Although passing through more than one county, the Kal-Haven Trail is actually linking Kalamazoo with South Haven. The 33-mile former railroad bed has a limestone/slag surface, crosses over bridges, passes through small towns, and passes by historical interest points. The Kal-Haven Trail is a preferred destination for those who enjoy hiking, biking, as well as cross-country skiing, and snowmobiling. Use of the Kal-Haven Trail is completely free through donations, grants, and state/federal funds, and no permit is needed to utilize the trail. https://www.michigan.org/property/kal-haven-trail-state-park

In early January, Fred Kiehl, Katherine, my wife, and I went on a trip to scout out a potential location for a Community Service Event. This location was at the Mountaineer Food Bank in Gassaway, WV. We also visited a campground 5 miles away to serve as a home base while in the area.



Mountaineer Food Bank (<u>mountaineerfoodbank.org</u>) looks to be a great organization that helps communities throughout the state. In the past conversations and during our visit, it was explained that our efforts would be most helpful in filling the approximately 5,000 boxes of food distributed to seniors each month.

A small group will be volunteering at the Food Bank at the end of April to prepare for a larger, Region-wide event planned to take place in October.

Here are the tentative details for the October event, as I know them now.

- Wednesday, October 18, 2023: Arrive at Elk River Camp and RV (elkrivercampandrv.com)
- Thursday and Friday, October 19 and 20: Volunteer at Food Bank
- Saturday, October 21: Day to explore the area.
- Sunday, October 22: Depart

Once I return from the late April event, I intend to understand the details of the October event completely. I can put a more formal itinerary together for those interested in reviewing it. I will post this itinerary in the Quarter 2 Newsletter, and those interested can reach out to me to get put on the list of those intending to attend.

Your Feedback Is Wanted About BRN Policy

At the February 23 IBT meeting, a motion was presented regarding Big Red Numbers (BRN) that has been tabled until the next meeting in May so Region Presidents can get feedback from their members.



The motion attempts to bring the display of BRNs in Policy 16.6.10 in alignment with current practices. It acknowledges that not everyone wants to permanently display their BRN on their Airstream. It also clarifies that members have alternate ways to show their BRNs other than the preferred affixed centered above the front and rear windows.

Two schools of thought revolve around whether the policy should continue to require the display of BRNs in some fashion at all WBCCI events.

The current policy states:

16.6.10 Airstream Numbers (7/19/21)

16.6.10, D, 2. 4, a. The display of Airstream Numbers is required during club activities to assist with the identification and location of club members for logistics and safety (e.g., first responder) considerations.

The proposed motion states:

"The display of Airstream Numbers is encouraged and is required for participation in some club activities to assist with the identification and location of club members for logistics and safety considerations."

Personally, my perspective is:

- Caravan leaders may require BRNs displayed at all times during the caravan with expectations clearly stated in the caravan description and the registration process.
- Event leaders may require BRNs displayed when arriving to be parked with expectations clearly stated in the event description and the registration process.
- Members must clearly display their BRN once the Airstream is parked and set up at an event.

My rationale is that BRNs are like name badges or house addresses for our Airstreams. We all know that name badges are helpful for new members to get to know people and for those of us (like me) who quickly forget names and faces. Having the BRN displayed and the ability to look up the members is a massive help. Displaying BRNs on caravans and events eases the burden on directors/hosts, and volunteers and can provide an important safety piece when our Airstreams all look alike at rallies and caravan events.

Displaying BRNs is vital to me both as a participant and an event leader. Wally Byam came up with BRNs for excellent reasons that have not changed, and it is a visible legacy that connects him to our Club to this day.

RECIPES FOR THE ROAD

Salads that Travel Well!

Over the years of camping, it seems to me one of the best ideas for having ready-to-go food upon arrival at your next destination can be a hearty salad. These salads are also great for potlucks, which have started showing up again at rallies and local club events. I often prep the ingredients for the salad before we leave home, making it a snap to put together once we arrive. Here are a few of my favorites, and as we are heading to Region 3's State Rally in a few weeks and a potluck is on the menu one night, you can bet I will make one of these to share!

Make-Ahead Taco Salad

Ingredients

Ш	1 lb. lean ground beef
	1 pkg Taco seasoning, any brand

☐ 1 head of lettuce shredded

☐ ½ cup red onion chopped

Directions

- 1. Cook ground beef in a frying pan over low-medium heat until brown.
- 2. Add taco seasoning mix packet, but do not add any liquid.
- 3. While beef is cooking, combine shredded lettuce, onion, beans, avocado, tomato, and cheese in a bowl.
- 4. Add ground beef to the mixture. If you are going to serve this Taco Salad the next day or later today, cover the bowl and refrigerate until serving time.
- 5. When you are ready to serve, add salad dressing (I use about ½ of a bottle, but you can add more if you like). You can also use a light Catalina dressing, which is really good. The sweetness of the dressing is a nice offset to the mild spices in the meat seasoning.

Food-Wine-Travel's Chopped Salad

Serves two as a main course or six as a side dish. Chopped, grilled chicken or grilled salmon can easily be added to make this a heartier, more protein-filled salad as well.

Ingredients

- 1 Lebanese cucumber (any cucumber will do)
- □ 3 spring onions (green onions)
- ☐ 4 small red radishes, quartered
- □ 200g grape tomatoes, halved (about 1 cup)
- ☐ 1 tablespoon finely sliced mint leaves
- ☐ 1 tablespoon parsley leaves, torn
- □ ½ lemon
- ☐ Extra virgin olive oil for drizzling
- □ Salt flakes and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

Directions

- 1. Quarter the cucumber lengthways, then cut it into thick slices.
- 2. Thinly slice the spring onions and separate them into rings.
- 3. Combine cucumber and onion with radish, tomato, mint, and parsley.
- 4. Add a squeeze of lemon juice, a drizzle of oil, salt, and pepper, and toss well.



Macaroni Coleslaw

This recipe is a *Taste of Home* recipe award winner. The next time I make this, I might try adding in canned tuna or diced imitation crab meat to make it a heartier pasta salad with more protein.

Otal Time Prep: 25 min. + chilling Makes 16 servings



Ingredients

1 package (7 ounces) ring macaroni or ditalini
1 package (14 ounces) of coleslaw mix
2 medium onions, finely chopped
2 celery ribs, finely chopped
1 medium cucumber, finely chopped
1 medium green pepper, finely chopped)

1 can (8 ounces) whole water chestnuts, drained and chopped



Dressing:

 - - -
1-1/2 cups Miracle Whip Light (Don't love Miracle Whip? Use mayonnaise instead.)
1/3 cup sugar
1/4 cup cider vinegar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions

- 1. Cook macaroni according to package directions; drain and rinse in cold water. Transfer to a large bowl; add the coleslaw mix, onions, celery, cucumber, green pepper, and water chestnuts.
- 2. In a small bowl, whisk the dressing ingredients. Pour over salad; toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour.

Kool factoid: The term "coleslaw" is derived from the Dutch word "koolsla," literally translated as "cabbage salad." The term has evolved to refer to many types of crunchy, shredded-vegetable salads that hold up well after being dressed.
