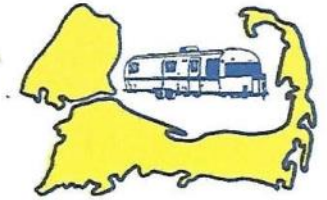
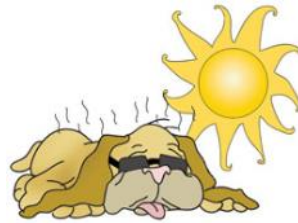

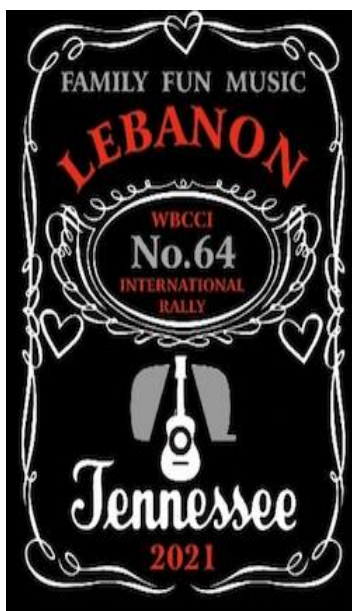

We had 20 rigs at the rally, which included folks from Cape Cod, Connecticut, New England Units and Texas as well as some newcomers to the Club. We welcomed Linda Ward and Andrew Dunkinson from Texas, Kathryn and Mark Collins of CCMAC, Kathy and John Wesp, Mark and Deni Van der Voort, Betsy and Bruce Frey as new members to the AIC and Cape Cod, Connecticut and New England Units respectfully. Author Washington Irving visited Orford in 1832 and is quoted as saying “In all my travels in this country and in Europe, I have seen no village more beautiful than this. It is a charming place – nature has done her utmost here” [2] I think Irving capture how most folks who have attended the rally feel after visiting the Pasture and the local area

Region One News

REGION 1 NEWS - SUMMER 2021

Save the Date April 29 – May 1, 2022 for the Region 1 Gathering to be held in Sandwich, New Hampshire. A “gathering” is similar to a region rally but will be less extensive in the entertainment, food and programming. It will still feature the annual region business meeting, great fellowship and fun between members of all our local clubs.

This year at the International Rally in Tennessee your International and Region officers and you, as members through your club’s delegates, made a multitude of changes in our rules of governance for the club which will improve our club as well as making the Constitution, Bylaws and Policies easier to understand. Most of us would like to wish we could dismiss the legislative part of our organization. That is understood, however rules of governance are required to keep our large multi-faceted club as a non-profit and to function fairly and efficiently. To that end, it was necessary to have an updated Constitution, Bylaws and Policies.

It was found that, over the years, much of the operating protocol and procedures had been placed incorrectly into the club’s Constitution. One must remember that the Constitution should define what WBCCI “is”, its Bylaws define what WBCCI “does” and its Policies state how WBCCI “performs the actions defined in the Constitution or Bylaws”. Extensive reorganization of the governing documents was put before the membership for approval to be consistent with proper protocol. Three constitutional amendments were presented to you, the membership, most typically at the local clubs’ Spring Business Meetings. The delegate from each of the local clubs brought the membership vote to this year’s Delegates Meeting at the International Rally. All three constitutional amendments passed. To recap, these three constitutional amendments dealt with the following:

Constitutional Amendment #1 dealt with the duties of the International officers that were in the Constitution, and more correctly placed them into Bylaws and Policies. This amendment also allowed the Nominating Committee to be altered and moved its duties to Bylaws and Policies.

Constitutional Amendment #2 dealt with the Delegates’ Meeting at the International Rally. This change separates the voting for new International officers from the traditional Delegates Meeting. The voting will now be done prior to the International rally and allows it to be done electronically.

Constitutional Amendment #3 dealt with how to make Constitutional changes. It clarified that a change requires a 2/3 vote and moves the mechanics of approving the change to Policy.

The International Board of Trustees (IBT) also met at the International Rally. The IBT essentially consists of the International officers and the Region presidents. The following were voted in by the IBT:

1. Revising the Marketing Committee’s roles and responsibilities now that we have hired a WBCCI Marketing Communications Manager.
2. A policy revision for the printed and digital directory to now include all members names, region, local club, and big red number (BRN). Note that one can still opt out of permitting use of one’s personal contact information.

3. A policy revision that provides guidelines for qualifications and responsibilities of the Region President's position. Most notably, it allows the votes of Members-at-Large to be cast through the Region President at a Delegates' Meeting.
4. Consistent with the housekeeping of the Constitution, Bylaws and Policies revisions, the Long-Range Planning Committee chair and member requirements were moved from Policy to Bylaws.
5. As part of the housekeeping of the Constitution, Bylaws and Policies by the Delegates, who had removed the International officers' duties out of the Constitution, they are now more appropriately placed into Bylaws by the IBT.
6. Another housekeeping revision places the duties of the International officers into the Bylaws section.
7. A new bylaw establishes a ten member standing Nominating Committee. The original three member Nominating Committee had been removed from the Constitution at the Delegates' Meeting. This will expand the scope of the club's search for qualified candidates.
8. A new policy that establishes the duties of the International President by providing a summary of the qualifications and his/her responsibilities.
9. A new bylaw clarifies that the Delegates' Meeting will only need to be held when a Constitutional amendment is being considered. The name of the Delegates' Meeting will now be "Constitutional Delegates' Meeting". This was made possible by the amended Constitution that moved the election of International officers from the Delegates' Meeting to a direct membership vote.
10. "Constitutional Delegates' Meeting" will now appear throughout the Constitution, Bylaws and Policies as appropriate.
11. A policy that presents a revised path and timeline for evaluation and informing the Membership of any proposed Constitutional amendment.
12. A bylaw revision that establishes the right of any member (Regular or Member-at-Large) to affiliate with any local club in WBCCI.
13. Revised policy expanding the Heritage Number Program to honor those who were participants in the 1956 European Caravan along with those who have already been honored by the other two major caravans those being the Around the World Caravan and the Cape Town to Cairo Caravan.
14. Ratification of a policy stipulating that proof of a COVID vaccination, or exemption from vaccination, may not be used as a prerequisite for attendance at any official WBCCI event. WBCCI will continue to be guided by CDC guidelines and local recommendations.

Your Region One Officers, Doug Hart, Bard Fuller and RJ Dominic, meet monthly to discuss how we can improve our Airstream club experience. Should you have any questions or comments on how we can serve you better please contact any one of us. By the way, Doug will be completing his term of office next summer and over the next several months we will be looking for other enthusiastic club members to be considered in guiding the region over the next several years. Please consider "throwing your name into the ring" or suggest a fellow Airstreamer from your local club to be a potential region officer.

RALLY FEES – \$435 for an RV On-Site with 30 amp electric, water, and pump-outs; \$130 for each Adult (18+); \$40 for each Youth 13-17; Free for Children (12 & Under).

ADA ACCESSIBLE PARKING – Special parking, if requested, is near the central rally area for members. We ask that you bring your government/state-issued placard or supporting documentation with you to the rally.

REGISTRATIONS – Through the courtesy of Airstream, Inc., members registered before the start of the rally are entered into a prize drawing. Over \$2,000 in gift certificates for parts and service will be given away. Registrants must be present at the Airstream presentation to win.

STAGING AREA – In an attempt to keep the rigs moving, you will receive a rally arrival date in the Spring of 2022. If you can't make it on that date, the Rally Arrival Team will be ready to park you when you arrive from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. Arrivals after 8:00 pm may stay overnight in the Staging Area, with no hookups, until parking begins the next morning.

CANCELLATION POLICY – Refund requests received by May 28th, 2022, will be assessed a \$50.00 fee. Refund requests after May 29th, 2022, will be assessed a 50% fee. NO refunds after July 9th, 2022. *If you might have to cancel after that day, please consider obtaining travel insurance.*

RALLY PARKING DATES – General parking is tentatively scheduled to begin around July 20th. Parking dates will be sent via email in Spring 2022. Caravans of 5 or more need to contact HQ at rally@airstreamclub.org for arrival date.
