Member Spotlight: Larry & Terry Madden

Caught in a daydream while gazing out the window of a Greyhound bus, my eyes suddenly and involuntarily were forced to squint due to a bright light, which was being created by the sun's rays reflecting off a silver trailer.

I was ten years old, and we were living in Boynton Beach, Florida, in 1963. I was on a bus trip to visit my aunt and uncle in Fort Lauderdale. When I asked my uncle about the silver trailer, he explained to me they were called Airstream and they were the best travel trailers a family could buy; subconsciously, the seed was planted.

Forty-five years later, on a beautiful sunny day in Searcy,



Arkansas, Terry and I purchased our shiny new 2008, 25ft FB Safari. We had no idea of the positive impact the Airstream would have on our lives.

We joined WBCCI in 2010; then in August of 2012, after a friendly call with Carol Barton, we expressed our desire to join the Arkansas Razorback Club. She invited us to attend our first rally being held at The Downtown Riverside RV Park, where we officially became members of the Arkansas Razorback Club of WBCCI and received our name tags.

I had the honor to serve the Razorback Club as a Vice President and then followed Jim Pankey as President for two years, from 2014-2016. During this period, Jason Landrum was our membership chair, and Mark Magie was the newsletter editor. Their combined contributions to our club were instrumental factors in growing our club's membership numbers.

2016 was an exciting time for our Razorback club. We hosted a Spring Rally that was literally in the clouds at Queen Wilhelmina State Park. It was during this rally, while sitting around a late-night campfire, a brain-storming discussion gave birth to what is known today as the Burning Mouse Rally (aka Arkaluma)!

In September of 2016, Terry and I had the great privilege of hosting the Arkansas Razorback Club's 50th Anniversary in WBCCI. The Anniversary Rally was held in Bull Shoals, Arkansas, which had historical significance. Bull Shoals was also the same location of the very first International Rally held in 1958. It also ushered in the end of my term as President, and Mark Magie led the club forward. Former International President and Razorback Club member Charles Duran encouraged me to get involved at the regional level, so Terry and I started attending the mid-winter International Board of Trustees (IBT) meetings. During an IBT meeting in Sarasota, Florida, I spoke with then Region 6 President Kenneth Ritenour about the vacant Second Vice-President position. In just a few months, I was elected as Region 6's Second Vice-President.






