in Barnstable County. It lies at the extreme southwest corner of Cape Cod, near Martha's Vineyard and the Elizabeth Islands. From there you can take a quick 45 minute ferry ride to Oak Bluff, or Vineyard Haven, Martha's Vineyard.

We met at the <u>Woods Hole Science Aquarium</u> at the Oceanographic Institute. We spent time watching the seals play in the water outside the main entrance while we got caught up on Club happenings and the fun we had in the season just ended.

Admission to the Aquarium is free; they do take donations to offset cost. We wandered through

the two story building and enjoyed fishes from many of the local areas. Our tour lasted about an hour and half. It is well worth visiting and is only 12 miles for the Barnstable Fairgrounds.


