## President's Message


Greek philosopher Heraclitus is the credited author of one of my favorite truisms. He apparently

of you who made the drive to join us in March. We had members from Woodland Park, Monument,


Denver, Longmont, Boulder, Fort Collins, Pueblo, Castle Rock, and Falcon.

I met Art Rouse in 1987. He was the retired publisher and owner of Trailer Life, a magazine he had bought in the late 1950s, and from it, he grew several other RV publications and the Good Sam Club.

I interviewed him for an hourlong network radio show. He was, as you might expect, an energetic, engaging, and interesting lifelong traveler.

In one of his columns, he wrote:

"My coffin better have wheels, because I'm gonna keep rollin' down the road until they park me permanently in that great trailer park in the sky."

Art was an Airstreamer for many years. He wrote many articles about his Airstreams and tow vehicles. Airstream was also an important advertiser in Art's magazine. But friendly competition heated up in the 1970s between members of the Airstream Club (WBCCI) and Good Sam members. Pictured is a photo of a box of Rice Krispies, which was modified by a competing RV brand to fit the curved cabinet in Art's Airstream and given to him at a Good Sam rally.



Good Sam Grand PooBah Marcus Lemon reportedly explained that the word club was being dropped because young people just don't want to join a club. I hear that from Rotarians, Lions, and Kiwanians as well. But how can that be when so many are trying to increase their number of "friends" on Facebook and "likes" on their posts?

#### Bidet in a Silver Bullet

I found a great how-to in <u>Airforums.com</u> and easily added a bidet to our travel trailer. This mod took less than a half hour to complete and less than \$70 in parts. Your choice of bidet will impact the total price.

#### Parts needed:


- Bidet (We chose a <u>Veken Ultra-Slim</u>) \$30
- SharkBite 1/2 x 1/2 x 3/8 Tee Stop Valve \$25
- SharkBite Pipe Cutter Tool \$10

#### Benefits:

- Use less toilet paper
- Encourages using enough water to avoid the dreaded poop pyramid
- A clean heinie

## Rally Recipe

Flourless Zucchini Chocolate Brownies via Brenda Hughey by <u>The Comfort of Cooking</u>

You can find this and other great recipes from rallies here.

1 cup creamy almond butter

2 medium zucchini, shredded (unpeeled)

1/3 cup honey

1 large egg

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 cup semisweet chocolate chips, melted



- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 9 x 9-inch baking pan; set aside.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine all ingredients and mix thoroughly until smooth. Pour into prepared pan.
- 3. Bake for 35-40 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.
- 4. Let cool completely before cutting into squares.
- 5. Enjoy!

Apparently we are not in jeopardy of being overrun by AI yet:)





The 2009 34' PanAmerica Toy Hauler was the first production Airstream travel trailer with a hatch. This edition was short-lived, but the hatch lived on appearing in special editions for Eddie Bauer, Pendleton, and Tommy Bahama, before arriving as a option in standard product lines for model year 2021.

#### The First Airstream Hatch

The first rear entrance appeared in the <u>Funeral Coach</u> in 1981. The vehicle was built from an Excella Motor Home and the hatch provided access to flowers for funerals.

# Spring Maintenance



#### Bathroom Exhaust Foam Gasket Replacement

Does your bathroom or shower exhaust fan make a bunch of racket when it's running? If you haven't replaces the foam gasket in the unit recently, you likely have a problem that is easy to solve.

These foam gaskets notoriously fail and get tangled up in the fan. Thankfully, it only takes a ladder, screwdriver, and \$10 of <u>M-D weather strip tape</u> to permanently fix your exhaust fan.

Spring time is a great time for this project.

The exhaust covers are connected with two phillips screws.

Once the cover is removed, pull out the old foam gasket.

Install the new weather strip tape and reinstall the cover.



The new gasket will end your struggles with a noisy exhaust fan. The old foam gaskets don't last long, especially if your trailer is out in to the sun often.
