HUGE WILDFLOWER GARDENS THIS SPRING

Due to the unusual amount of rainfall experienced in Arizona this winter and spring, the desert has decided to provide what experts call a "super bloom". This only happens rarely, so, to be here and to be able to see it, is quite a treat. The last "super bloom" that the Cabalka's can remember was in the spring of 2001, some 22 years ago. As the pictures show, entire hillsides are covered with beautiful yellow poppy blossoms.

A couple of years ago, Chuck and Doris Jean secured some "bloomed out" poppy plants from Ruth Rowzer, a lady in the park where they winter. Ruth and her deceased husband, Chuck, were Iowa Airstream Club members from Cedar Rapids. The Cabalka's just scattered the dead plants over a bare area at their mobile home site.
