### MAC Share Is Starlink for RVs Right for You?

#### Here's our Story. by Laurie McLean, MAC Member

We began looking into internet possibilities as soon as we placed our Airstream order in June of 2021. We knew we wanted internet service for our laptops and we wanted access to TV. During 2020 and 2021 we were heavily dependent on high quality internet service at home for work and keeping in touch with family, friends and volunteer activities. We also joined the streaming TV crowd using Amazon Fire TV that gave us access to Netflix, Hulu, and a myriad of other streaming services. I guess we got used to being in touch remotely, with the aid of extremely high-speed internet, through Xfinity. It set the bar high.



Our dreams of retirement traveling included taking advantage of our love of both wilderness camping and sightseeing in more urban areas. And, we wanted to be on the road most of the time, often in areas with patchy cellular service. For most of the next year we kept our eyes on the portable internet services with Dish® and Direct TV connections. After investigating how they worked and where they worked best, we began to feel we were going to need subscriptions to both services. Then, we would use whichever one gave us the best connection depending on where we were.

Then, along came Starlink for RVs. It promised high-speed internet, capable of streaming especially in more remote locations. So, having made no other commitments, we jumped on the band wagon.

Considering that we don't have any actual experience with the other services, here's what we like about Starlink so far:

- We have strong internet connections for both streaming TV and video conferencing with groups of friends, family members, and organizations.
- We have been able to find a connection just about everywhere. The notable exception to this was the middle of a national forest area, where we received a message that our signal was blocked by the DNR.
- We have been pleasantly surprised by the fact that by using our internet connection, we can keep in touch by phone with anyone, even where there is no cell service.
- Although the monthly fees are expensive, you can pause them if you are not traveling and then reactivate them when you are back on the road.

Some people who enjoy Starlink, use 12 – 15' flagpoles to mount the dish to their trailers. We've considered this, but so far, we don't feel it's necessary. We have a portable storage case with wheels that provides a steady base and can be moved anywhere within 100' of the trailer. Starlink requires less open sky space than other services. We find we can often access a strong connection at the front of our site, by the open campground road, even if our trailer is pulled in under trees.

So, is Starlink right for you? Yes, if the ability to stream in remote areas where there is no cell service is important to you. If not, it might be more than you need.

### Twin Bed Troubles. by Pegeen Smith. MAC Member

Whoops....I fell out of bed.

Something I have not done since I was a kid. Thankfully, my pillow had landed first and I didn't hurt myself but I was surprised to find myself between our twin beds in our 2020, 25 ft Globetrotter, FB. Tom & I bought our first Airstream within days of his retirement in August 2020. We bought one of the last trailers on the lot. Nature & Me was getting ready for their 2021 models. Fortunately, it was just what we were looking for and equipped with Tuft & Needle mattresses that are so comfy.

The problem we discovered was that our comfy mattresses overlapped the existing bed platforms by more than 3 inches. The mattress edge did not have support to sit on and bed linens were constantly in the way of the storage cupboards underneath. The mattress moved around on the existing platform which made it really easy to make the bed but made for a disruptive sleep. To prevent myself from falling out of bed again, I had to lay close to the wall and the twin bed became a mini-twin. We





needed to get this fixed.

I am not a big fan of Facebook for a variety of reasons but one thing I appreciate are the Airstream groups. Mostly I read the posts and learned but once, in a desperate state with our batteries, I posted a question and immediately received technical information that helped immensely to understand and solve our problem. I am now a fan of Facebook Airstream groups. One time I saw someone's post about their similar problem with their mattresses and a platform solution made by Matthew Hughes, BRN 2736. of <u>Nomad Custom Crafts</u>. I knew this was the fix I needed so I immediately reached out to Matt. placed an order and made plans to go down to Jacksonville/St. Augustine area to have them installed.

Which is where we are now with our newly installed platforms and I have to say, they have exceeded our expectations. The mattresses fit perfectly in their platforms, they match our cabinetry beautifully, they provide easy access to the cupboards below, and they open up the space on either side of the nightstand. The

best thing is that we can sleep on the entire width of the bed and no more falling out of bed!!

And now on to converting the cabinets below the beds into drawers with a carpenter recommended by fellow Airstreamers...





# We Rally

### **Too Many RV Shows**

We bought our first Airstream following a RV show in Virginia. We had a RoadTrek Class B and went to look at a larger Class C. There was a single Airstream at the show and it was a Bambi which quickly became our Bambi. It was 2005 and it was Airstream number 1. Airstream number 2 was an 2003 International 22 CCD. We bought it in 2012 because we felt we needed more room as we were finally able to take longer trips due to my pending retirement. We were half right. We did need more room but the International 22 was not the answer. We made the mistake of going to Alumapalossa in 2014.

Not actually a RV show but pretty close. We saw a new International 25 and soon ordered Airstream number 3. It was great. Just the right size. During the 7 years we owned her, we travelled over 50,000 miles and visited most of the western National Parks and 8 Canada Providences. Fast forward to 2022. We loved the 25 but knew that as we got older we would probably find it too much to handle. We went to the fall RV show in Detroit and 2 weeks

later ordered Airstream number 4. An Airstream Atlas.



The Atlas is Airstream's B+ motor coach. During the 2 week period between the RV show we did a lot of research on the Atlas to make sure it was a good choice for us. What clinched the deal were two new options. The first is the El power system. It is made by Volta in Holland, MI and it replaces the generator, house batteries, and the propane system. It is essentially a lithium battery pack based on automotive electric vehicle technology. It has the same battery capacity as 12 100aH lithium batteries! It can run the AC for 8 hours and recharges in just 2 hours using the 54v alternator on the engine. The gas stovetop is replaced with an induction cooktop. The weight savings allows for the second option which is self leveling jacks so no more messing around trying to level everything on an uneven campsite. I can see myself pulling into a campsite, getting a cold one, going to the picnic table and setting everything up using my iPhone! It's easier to maneuver then our International 25 and F-150. It fits into smaller campsites, it's a lot less hassle to get going in the morning or to set up at night, and now both of us can drive. Are there negatives? Sure. It only sleeps 2. Maybe that's not a negative and if it doesn't work, there's always Airstream number 5.

### Airstream Repairs on the Fly by Fred Bryant, MAC 1st Vice President

The one thing you can count on while traveling with your Airstream is that something unexpected is going to happen and all your tools are at home. The hard part is you never know when but it will happen. This happened to me recently. Our drain backed up and needed attention now! While I approached it with quite a bit of trepidation. I found it to be a very simple repair so no need to worry. I will walk tell you how I fixed it.

The first thing I thought of was that the drain stopper was slowing the water flow down the drain. This proved to be more of a challenge disassembling it than I expected. It was not like other drain stoppers I have seen that are disassembled from below the sink cabinet by disengaging the linkage to allow the stopper to be removed. What I finally realized is that the stopper is threaded into a nut that gets captured when the stopper is pushed down in the drain of the sink to close the drain opening. The stopper must be pushed down into the drain opening to allow the stopper to be unthreaded from the housing. Otherwise, the nut spins with the stopper. The stopper and drain were clean. It was not the cause of the slow drain.

The second thing I thought of was the P-trap. I have disassembled P-traps in my home and it was pretty easy. I was surprised to see no P-trap when I looked under our 2016 Flying Cloud, 26U cabinet sink. Instead, I found a cylindrical unit that was a complete mystery to me. After some internet research, I learned it is called a <u>HepvO</u> <u>Waterless Valve</u>. It is basically a tube with a very flexible inner tube that collapses closed to keep drain odors and water from backing up into the sink. This device turned out to be as simple as the P-Trap to service. Just remove, rinse clean and reassemble.

I unthreaded the HepvO valve from the connecting pipe and took it outside to rinse it clean. After I reassembled and tested it, now the water flows down the drain quickly. A major inconvenience averted, we were able to enjoy the rest of our travel adventures with full use of the sink.

So, fear not! Grab those pliers and take it apart!
