Recipe of the Month

Broccoli Apple Salad

- 4 cups fresh broccoli florets (about 2 medium heads)
- 1/2 cup shredded carrots
- 2 large apples finely chopped (I used gala apples)
- 1/2 cup pecans coarsely chopped
- 1/2 cup dried cranberries

Creamy dressing ingredients:

- 1/2 cup lite mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup low fat plain greek yogurt
- 2 Tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 Tablespoon sugar (more to taste)
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper

Make the dressing ahead and pack it in your AS frig. Prep the broccoli and carrots. Place in a Tupperware container. Layer pecans and cranberries over them and refrigerate. All that is left to do in the AS is chop that apple then toss everything together. If you pick up a package of Perdue chicken strips to add to the mix, you can call it dinner when paired with a crisp Chardonnay. Enjoy!

The NC Zoo is nestled on 2,600 wooded acres centrally located in the heart of North Carolina, just south of Asheboro in Randolph County. With 500 developed acres, it is the world's largest natural habitat zoo. The zoo houses 1,800 animals of more than 250 species, primarily representing Africa and North America. <u>https://www.nczoo.org/</u>

Other suggested activities are Seagrove Pottery, NC Aviation Museum, American Classic Motorcycle Museum, hiking trails and a covered bridge.
