# From the Unit President

#### Happy Spring!



I hope everyone is making their reservations and prepping for the 2023 camping season. We have not traveled much in March but are getting ready and preparing the Airstream for travel! I thought now would be a good time to

dust off the cobwebs and go over some things that you should check at the beginning of the camping season to help prevent accidents or malfunctions while traveling.

**First is the outside:** A good wash can help brighten up your airstream. As you wash, you can inspect and check for cracks in the seams and missing sealant on the roof, corners and sidewall seams. You can also then go inside to see if there are any water leaks that need addressed before travel. Check the windows for leaks as well or cracked seams. While on the roof, check your air conditioner and around skylights and fans, looking for cracks or lack of sealant. Next are the tires, the only thing between you and the road. Check the air pressure, tread levels, check for cracks or other forms of visible damage. Don't forget the spare! From there let's check the battery. Look for cracks or other forms of visible damage or corrosion. Clean the connections and check the charge and replace if necessary.

It is good to do a walk around and test all of your lights and turn signals. We actually do this before hitting the road, as my grandfather would always do. Next, open doors, windows, cabinets and awning s: this will help air out your Airstream and give you a chance to check for squeaky hinges or other issues. With the awning out, spray silicone on the rails as this helps it retract easier. Spray your awning with protectant if you feel the need. Check for tears or snags as well as the pull strap. Before we go inside, check your hitch. Check for anything loose and tighten, grease the coupler. While there, do a propane test by inspecting the hoses and connections for signs of wear & tear. Use a brush and soapy water to help check for any leaks in hoses and connections or use a flammable gas detector. Get these filled so you are ready for your first trip!

Let's go inside! Test your appliances, make sure the stove will light and your heat. Check your fans for any debris. Test the lights on the inside. Finally, you will want to dewinterize your water system by flushing the freshwater tank and lines. Drain the freshwater tank and check for any leaks underneath as you do this, rinse thoroughly and fill with clean water. As you rinse, turn on the faucets and showers to clear the plumbing of antifreeze. Some like to add freshwater system cleaner to disinfect and help with any lingering odors before filling the freshwater tank. Also check your water heater bypass valve and check that water is getting into it and the temperature setting. This is a good time to also check the sewer hoses to make sure they are in good shape and the dump handles to prevent sticking. After the usual vacuuming and wipe down and of course repacking supplies you are on your way to safe traveling! Of course, you will have the random loose rivet or burnt-out light, but that comes with the adventures!

## **Dutch Oven Cinnamon Rolls**

COOK TIME: 45 MINUTES AT HOME PREP TIME: 30 MINUTES

TOTAL TIME: 1 HOUR 15 MINUTES AUTHOR: FRESH OFF THE GRID

Swirls of cinnamon, baked to golden perfection, and topped with a light drizzle of icing, these Dutch oven cinnamon rolls are one of our favorite camping breakfasts.



#### **INGREDIENTS**

#### **DOUGH**

- 2 ½ cups flour (345g)
- 3 tablespoons granulated sugar (50g)
- · 2 teaspoons active dry yeast or 1 packet
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon sea salt
- ¾ cup milk preferably whole
- 4 tablespoons butter

#### **FILLING**

- · 4 Tbsp butter softened
- 1/3 cup brown sugar (packed) (70g)
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- · 4 cardamom pods crushed and husk removed

#### ICING GLAZE

- ½ cup powdered sugar
- 1 tablespoons milk
- 1 tablespoon melted butter

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

#### AT HOME

- 1. Combine the flour, granulated sugar, yeast, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, and  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon salt to the bowl of a mixer. Add the milk and butter to a small bowl and warm in a microwave, 45-60 seconds, so that the butter is melted. Add the milk and butter to dry ingredients along with the egg.
- 2. Mix about 5 minutes on medium-low (4 on our Kitchen Aid mixer) until the dough is smooth and is no longer sticky. Transfer the dough to an oiled bowl and cover. Rest 10 minutes.
- 3. Meanwhile, prepare the filling. If using whole cardamom, crush the pods. using a rolling pin and cutting board, or a mortar and pestle. Remove the outer husks and use the rolling pin or pestle to further grind the cardamom. Combine in a small bowl along with the cinnamon and brown sugar.
- 4. Turn the dough out onto a floured surface and knead 2 or 3 times to bring it into a ball. Roll out into a rectangle about 12" by 8". Spread the softened butter evenly over the dough, followed by the cinnamon sugar mixture.
- 5. Starting with one of the long edges, roll the dough into a tight cylinder. Cut into 8-10, 1" rolls using a piece of unflavored dental floss. Slide the floss

under the roll, then wrap it over the top. Pull the ends in opposite directions to cut through the rolls.

6. Place the rolls into a Tupperware container that is lined with parchment paper. If you need to stack the rolls, place an additional piece of parchment paper between layers. At this time, you can also make the icing glaze: whisk ingredients together and transfer to a small container. Store the rolls and glaze in your cooler for up to two or three days

#### IN CAMP

- Remove the rolls from the cooler and arrange them in a 4-qt Dutch oven.
   Cover the oven and let the dough rise while you start your coals or campfire.
- 2. Once the coals are ready, place seven in a circle and place the Dutch oven on top. Place an additional 16 on the lid. Bake for 30-45 minutes, until the tops are golden. Remove from heat.
- 3. Mix the icing ingredients together (if not done at home) and drizzle over the rolls. Enjoy a fresh cup of camp coffee!

#### Water Pump Controller

Are you annoyed by the hammering of the water pump in your Airstream? A fellow Airstreamer made a modification to his Airstream by installing a water pump controller. Here is a website that explains what it does, www.IRVWPC.

com. Based on his recommendation I got one and installed it. All I can say is, WOW, what a difference. You can hardly hear the pump running, even at low flow rates. Basically it monitors the water pressure and adjusts the speed of the



pump motor to keep that pressure constant. No more on/off/on/off/ on/off... with the associated noise. Plus it has various safety settings.

I have no vested interest in this company

whatsoever but think it is a really good product. Should you have any questions you can feel free to contact me directly at hanno627@gmail.com.



Our 2016 Flying Cloud did not have a window in the bathroom door. We were wishing it had after seeing other models that did. So I decided this was a fairly straightforward install and we ordered an exterior window with a white interior back frame.

Margaret ordered it from Colonial Airstream and it arrived quickly from the factory. First, I removed the door from the frame. I cleaned the window with a product recommended by Colonial that removed the grease smears and factory









worker fingerprints on the frosted glass. Using the window frame, I drew the shape onto a piece of tracing paper and transferred that line onto the door. We determined what height was going to work for us and measured. Next, I taped around the line to protect the door surface from scratches that would be caused by a jigsaw.

I drilled a wide hole to allow a starting point for the saw blade. I carefully cut out the shape that was transferred on to the door. It's a hollow core door and really easy to cut.

When the hole was cut out, I then placed the external window on the hall side of the door. Using the existing rivet holes in frame, I drilled pilot holes in the door. Each hole received a rivet. anchoring it in the door. Lastly, I fitted the white oval frame piece on the backside/bathroom side of the door, held in place with double-face tape.

I rehung the door and the window has stayed in place ever since. It gives enough light when you are in the bathroom so you don't feel like you're in a cave; we keep a nightlight on in the bathroom and it gives a nice glow through the window.
