

Rally Recipe

Low Carb Keto Zuppa Toscana Soup Recipe via Brenda Hughey by <u>Shugary Sweets</u>

You can find this and other great recipes from rallies here.

1 lb mild Italian Sausage

4 slices thick-cut bacon

32 oz Beef bone broth (or beef broth)

1 small onion, diced

3 cloves fresh garlic, minced

1 head fresh cauliflower, diced

½ cup heavy whipping cream

2 cups fresh spinach (5 oz package), or kale

salt and pepper, optional

crushed red pepper flakes, optional

shredded parmesan cheese for garnish, optional



- 1. Using a large soup pot or dutch oven, brown your sausage and bacon together. Cut your bacon into bite sized pieces to make it easier to cook.
- 2. Once your meat is cooked, add in beef bone broth, onions, garlic, and cauliflower. Cover and cook on medium heat for about 15 minutes, until the cauliflower is tender.
- 3. Once the cauliflower is softened, add in heavy cream and spinach (or kale). Cook for about 5 minutes, until spinach (or kale) is soft.
- 4. Serve with a spinkle of parmesan cheese and a pinch of salt, pepper, and/or crushed red pepper flakes. ENJOY!

This was the last International Rally Wally Byam attended. Participants were asked to spend only \$2 bills to emphasize the economic impact to the area from the Rally. Colorado has hosted only one International Rally. Loveland was the location for the 2020 Rally, which was cancelled.

Fresh Water Tank Sanitization

May is here and Rally season will soon be in full swing. The spring is the perfect time to sanitize your fresh water tank in your Airstream.

The process is simple and will ensure that your tank is nice and clean to start the season. Your owners manual outlines the process:

Use one of the following methods to determine the amount of common household bleach needed to sanitize the tank.

Multiply "gallons of tank capacity" by 0.13; the result is the ounces of bleach needed to sanitize the tank.

Multiply "Liters of tank capacity" by 1.0; the result is the milliliters of bleach needed to sanitize the tank.

- Mix the proper amount of bleach into a container of water
- Pour the correct amount of solution (water/bleach) into the Fresh Water tank and fill with potable water
- Open all faucets (hot and cold) allowing the water to run until the distinct odor of chlorine is detected.
- The standard solution must have 4 hours of contact time to disinfect completely. Doubling the solution concentration will allow for contact time of one (1) hour.
- When the contact time is completed, drain the tank. Refill with potable water and flush the plumbing of all sanitizing solution.

This double-axle trailer was manufactured before plastic interiors in the 1970s. It reflects "Vintage Charm" with a completely rebuilt wood interior featuring twin beds, a large dinette, a shower with a tub, and lots of storage.

We have recently added new black and gray tanks, plus improved drains for dumping and winterizing. The plumbing system has new valves, piping, and a pump.

The Electrical system runs on two batteries with an Intelli Power charger and all LED lighting.

A short list of upgrades includes Zip Dee awnings, a spare tire holder, a Marmoleum floor, a refrigerator, a water heater, and a toilet.

It also includes hitch and weight distribution bars. This 24' Trade Wind is completely refurbished and ready to use. It is not a project trailer.
