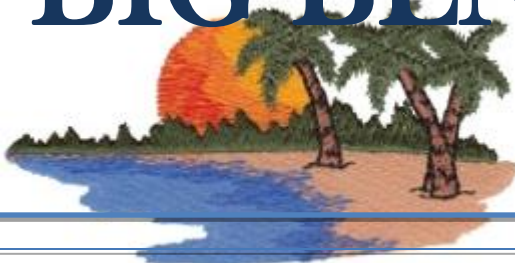

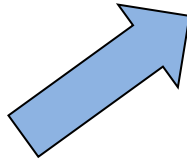

“It was a dark and stormy night...” Not really. We actually had four beautiful days and nights at the Jekyll Island rally! Twenty-two rigs gathered at this beautiful Georgia state park, located on a barrier island just off the coast from Brunswick, GA. The Jekyll Island Campground, set at the north end of the island, is an excellent RV campground, with heavily wooded sites and loads of atmosphere. It did have a few mosquitos, tho’...

Originally occupied by native Americans, including the Timucua Indians, in more recent times the island became the site of an exclusive private club, the Jekyll Island Club. Founded in 1886, the Club was a hunting and recreational playground for the super-rich of America. The Club thrived through the early 20th century; its members came from the world’s wealthiest families, most notably the Morgans (JP Sr and Jr), Rockefellers and Vanderbilts. It is said that during the height of the “season” (January 1 through March 31), when all the members were usually present, one-sixth of the world’s wealth resided on the Island! The Club closed at the end of the 1942 season due to complications from World War II. The island remained empty for several years until finally, on June 2, 1947, the State of Georgia purchased the island in order to create a state park, and it remains its current owner.

The rally was full of good food, fun, and frolic! The hosts were RoseMarie and Gary Anderson and Scott and Jan Pfaff. Most of us arrived on Wednesday afternoon, and at the Happy Hour that evening we were treated to a “Sip and Learn” presentation by Gary Anderson, regarding a brief history of Jekyll Island.

On Thursday, after a fruit and cereal breakfast, many went on the Jekyll Island Trolley Tour. We were driven around the grounds of the old Club, with its many “cottages” of the rich and famous. We went into a couple of the homes, and it was easy to imagine the grandeur of these residences when the Club was in full swing. That evening we enjoyed a sloppy joe dinner and a Sip and Learn presentation by Scott Pfaff regarding the basics of iPhone photography.

Friday started with Belgian waffles with fruit and syrup, followed by the opportunity to travel around the island on bikes along the myriad and extensive bike trails. Other than the bike excursion, Friday was a free day which was available to wander around the island, and in particular, the beautiful beaches. The day culminated in an excellent dinner at a local eatery, the Wee Pub restaurant.



Saturday brought a muffin breakfast, and more time to explore. There is a wonderful historical museum, Mosaic, on the island, as well as a sea turtle rescue hospital, providing interesting insights into the historical and modern activities taking place on the island. That evening, the Sip and Learn topic was another fascinating presentation by Scott Pfaff (a real Renaissance man!) about the uses of multimeters. Dinner of chicken tortilla soup, salad and strawberry shortcake with ice cream was really wonderful!

One of the things which interested me about the rally was the large number of e-bikes among the bicycles used by our club. Dawn and I will be travelling out to Rock Springs this summer to the International Rally, and will be bringing our 9-year-old grandson, Mercer. Mercer is a bike-aholic, and there is no way I can keep up with him on a regular bike, so it started me thinking... We met Jim and Cindy Bush for the first time at the rally, and they kindly let me try out one of their e-bikes. I was sold! I immediately ordered one, and I am just hoping it will be delivered before we have to leave for Wyoming!

In any event, the rally was great fun - a chance to see old friends, and to meet new ones. Kudos to Gary and RoseMarie, Scott and Jan for the effort they made in making the Jekyll Island Rally a spectacular success!

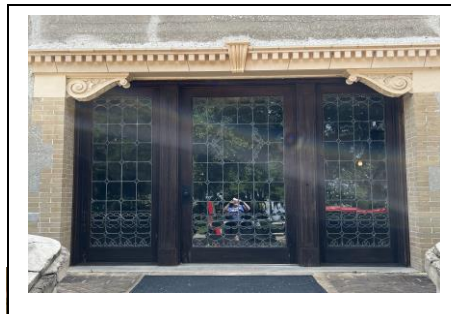

Jekyll Island Rally Recipes:

Debbie's Dutch Oven Bread by: Debbie Stair

3 cups bread flour

1 ¼ tsp. table salt

½ cup well-fed sour dough starter (at least 2 hours after feeding) and ¼ tsp. yeast or ½ tsp. yeast. (Use instant or active dry yeast.)

1 1/3 cups cool water

Parchment paper- place between the trivet and the bread.

Olive oil

Kosher or sea salt

Charcoal briquettes to produce 450 deg. (Use the lodge temperature guide to determine number needed and distribution pattern). I have a 12 inch oven and use 11 briquettes beneath the oven and 22 briquettes on the lid.

Note- I use a cast iron Dutch oven trivet (available from Amazon) to prevent burning the bottom of the bread.

Combine flour, yeast and table salt in a one gallon ziplock. About 18 hours before baking add water and sour dough starter (if making sour dough version). Mix very well by squeezing bag to blend evenly. Dough should be sticky so add a little more water if needed. Leave the ziplock open but tucked to prevent surface from becoming dry. Place opened ziplock of dough in a bowl or prop to assure that it remains upright. I stick it behind the kitchen sink faucet). Leave at room temperature. When ready to bake open bag a little and place ziplock of dough in a warm place for final rise. This is when I start preparing the briquettes and preheat the oven. Spray your Dutch oven with oil. Place the trivet in the bottom of the oven. Top trivet with parchment paper. Arrange briquettes and preheat oven for 10-15 minutes. Empty ziplock of dough onto parchment paper. Brush dough with olive oil and sprinkle with sea or kosher salt. Cover with lid and bake for 30 minute rotating base and lid 90 deg. in opposite directions every 15 minutes. Remove lid and bake for 15 minutes. Remove bread from oven and let cool for at least 1 hour before slicing.

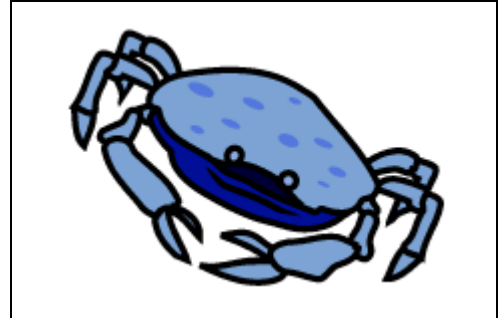




Debbie's Crab Cakes by: Debbie Stair

Crab Cakes

1 lb lump crab (buy the best quality available)
4 medium scallions, green part only, minced (about ½ cup)
2 TBS chopped green pepper
1 ½ tsp Old Bay seasoning
½ sleeve crushed Ritz crackers
¼ cup mayonnaise
1 tsp dry mustard
Sprinkling of cayenne pepper
Sprinkling of ground sea salt
1 TBS Worcestershire sauce
1 egg
Italian bread crumbs



Creamy Chipotle Chile Sauce

¼ mayonnaise
¼ cup sour cream
1 chipotle chile in adobo sauce, minced
1 small clove garlic, pressed
2 tsp minced fresh parsley, 1/4 tsp. dried parsley
Juice from 1 small lime

1. Make Chipotle Sauce and refrigerate.
2. Mix together all ingredients except crab and bread crumbs. Gently mix in crab. Form into patties using a small ice cream scoop. Drop into bread crumbs and gently into a patty and place on a greased cookie sheet.
3. Form into about 12 mini crab cakes each about 2 inches in diameter.
4. Cover with wax paper and refrigerate at least 30 minutes or freeze and store in zip locks.
5. If crab cakes have been frozen let them thaw before baking.
6. Bake at 400 deg. F. for about 10 minutes. Turn over and bake an additional 5 minutes.
7. Serve with Chipotle Chile Sauce.
