### **DATES:**


The official Rally is Friday July 21st through Sunday morning July 23rd.

## **Idaho Airstream Club Website Initiative Update**

When I agreed to become President of the Club, I did so because I wanted to create stability, instantiate growth, and enjoy the outdoors with others. We weathered through Covid, but hit a wall as Covid and Unit rallies simply did not co-exist. The patriarchs of our Club were aging and seemed most susceptible to the pandemic.

From the beginning of Covid through the end, our membership dropped about 50 percent.

After our second post-Covid rally, we suffered a huge loss when one of our beloved and long-term members caught Covid and passed away three weeks later!

Like all clubs, we need growth to survive. We need a mechanism to let the world know we exist. We need to understand and utilize modern tools to reach and interact with potential new members! Because of this understanding, modernizing our website has been one of my top priorities.

Region 10 and International also see the website as a critical part of growth and is encouraging all Clubs to update their website and post rally schedules online (in addition to publishing the schedule in newsletters and elsewhere) and also provide the ability for those wanting to attend to be able to pay online.

Tony Wilson is our Webmaster and has been working diligently on our Club website. Tony and I have contacted International (and Region 10) to learn about the web framework they created. Interestingly, their research indicates that very few folks under the age of 53 use checks! So, if we want these folks to become Idaho Club members, we will need to provide the ability for them to make online payments.

We also became aware of a contract between International

(WBCCI) and Airstream Inc. that requires WBCCI and all Clubs' web presence to be contained within the airstreamclub.org domain. This means that individual Clubs are not allowed to register their own web domain to host their website. And if they already have an outside web domain (like we do), they need to migrate to airstreamclub.org and eliminate whatever domain they have that is outside of airstreamclub.org.

Our official website is now <a href="https://airstreamclub.org/idaho">https://airstreamclub.org/idaho</a> and Tony is already making changes to it. Please visit it often to see his progress.

Website support, both short and long term, is critical for us. Others within Region 10 and the Region itself can help us in the future if we use the same framework and software tools they use and recommend.

Working within International's established website framework, we are being directed to use JotForm software to manage web payments (the e-commerce part of the website). There are several valid reasons for this, one being that it removes the liability of an e-commerce data breach from our Club.

However, JotForm is not free. It costs \$20/month. I don't like to spend money, particularly when it's not mine. I also have no desire to make financial decisions without transparency. For reasons already stated, I think we need to move forward with the purchase of the JotForm software so that Tony can proceed with the development of our website. The Board has voted unanimously to make this purchase and agreed that JotForm is really our only option for online payments.


## An Unforgettable Day in the World of the Great Wapiti

## An Unforgettable Day in the World of the Great Wapiti (cont.)


