Airstream's Electrical System - Part 2

Chargers are a direct link to the longevity of your batteries. Batteries use chemical reactions to store energy (current) that can later be used. Chargers replace the depleted energy by reversing the chemical reaction using high current. Depleted batteries can handle a high charging current, but the voltage needs to be reduced as the batteries near full capacity. Older chargers use maximum charge voltage until the battery reads full charge. The problem is the battery is not full. The charger is reading feedback from its own current because the battery can't absorb the high current the charger is providing. These over-charge your batteries and reduce battery life over time. Older Airstreams frequently used inefficient single-stage chargers. A modern multi-stage charger uses its full charging capacity and slows down the closer it gets to a full charge so it will not overcharge, and your batteries will become fully charged.

Modern multi-stage charger stages:

- **Bulk Stage**: Charger will use full charging current up to 80% charged. Batteries will reach the end of this stage quickly with a properly rated charger.
- **Absorption**: Current is reduced nearing full capacity. This stage will take much longer than bulk stage, but this keeps the battery from overcharging.
- **Float**: Current is applied just above the battery's output voltage to maintain the battery's capacity when the batteries are not in use. Batteries can self-discharge 3% to 20% per month in storage.
- **Balancing or Regeneration**: This fourth stage can help older batteries by removing chemical corrosion that builds up on the plates that occurred though chemical reaction. This stage works differently for every manufacturer and should not be used often as it will shorten the battery life if used too often.

If you want to replace your charger, it is important that it supports your battery's chemistry. Flooded, AGM, and GEL batteries have the same chemistry, but each type requires a different charging algorithm.

Note: Lithium is a completely different chemistry and requires a completely different voltage and charging algorithm.

Many quality chargers are compatible with several chemistry types. They can offer convenient features like apps for your phone so you can monitor the battery's charge history and charging stage. Access to most Airstream chargers can be difficult to regularly monitor, so choosing monitoring features using Bluetooth is a very beneficial option.

Now for the enviable technical stuff. How do you choose a charger that is compatible with your batteries? Battery manufacturers use a complicated algorithm called the "C Rating." Most deep cycle batteries have a (.5C) rating. Explaining this rating system is a little out of scope for this article, but there is plenty of material that explains how to determine the rating. Enjoy and good luck, it is complicated!

If you take your combined battery's amp-hours (this should be listed on your battery) and multiply it by .5c-rate (ex. 100 amp-hour x .5 = 50 amps). Using the example, your charger should have a maximum charge and discharge rate of 50 amps in one hour. Remember, lead based batteries can discharge up to 50% and lithium 80% to 95% before damage to the battery's cells.

Replacing your charger is a very straightforward process. There is a power connection to the shore/generator and two battery connections. Just be sure to get the polarity (+/-) correct.

A temperature monitor can connect the battery to the charger to protect the batteries from over-heating during charging.

The all-Carolinas units rally, officially known as the "NC/SC States Joint Rally" scheduled for September 21-24 at Palmetto Cove in Cleveland, SC is still open for reservations. This is the first multi-club rally of this kind since around a dozen years ago when our clubs would schedule these joint rallies. At this time, we have around 35 units signed up and we can handle up to one hundred trailers. Hey, that's 25 units per club, so if you haven't signed on, now's the time to do it before it's too late. 



- 2-15 oz. cans Black-eyed Peas, drained
- 1-15 oz. can Whole White Kernel Corn, drained
- 1-10 oz. Diced Tomatoes with Green Chiles, drained, or Ro-Tel

- ½ cup Jalapeño Pepper, chopped
