April Rally: Goosenest Weavers

Sixteen of us who were camping at our Un-button-your-rig Rally at Trap Pond visited Goose Nest Weavers and met owner Jessie on the doorstep of her weaving studio. In spite of limitations from recent back surgery, Jessie regaled us with stories and information about the hobby that has now become a calling for her, patiently answering questions and sharing delightfully funny insights about fife in general and weaving in particular.

Jessie and her husband Lemuel weave mostly on antique looms. Shortly after they acquired their first old barn loom, they both enrolled in the Marshfield School of Weaving in Vermont, and it turned out that they were both naturals of the traditional techniques taught there.

Since those early days, they have founded a weaving business and

acquired several more antique looms; most are 200 years old but one is from the 1700s. The looms are built from a variety of woods, each reacting differently to humidity and temperature. Jessie and Lem believe that looms have a feminine nature, so have given them all female names. Jessie says, of her oldest loom, "You can very nearly feel all the hands that have asked her to work for them over the centuries guiding your hands."

Their one-room workshop houses 5 large looms. It is full of natural light, the walls covered with sunny and inspirational quotes, the shelves packed tight with colorful spools of yarn in natural fibers (cotton, wool, linens and tile). Jessie and Lem create textiles using traditional patterns is sizes ranging from



kitchen towels to blankets, stair runners to large rugs. One of their favorite patters dats back to a Venetian weaver from the 18th century.

Jessie's dream these days is to visit the Hebrides to see real Harris tweed being made, and to meet "Sam in Buckie" in Firth of Forth in Scotland, who weaves fabric for the Royals' clothing. We are all rooting for her to recover quickly and make that journey!

Please note the campground website states <mark>DO NOT FOLLOW GPS, as it will bring you on roads</mark> with height restrictions. Please avoid Mcintyre and Esther Furnace road due to a covered bridge.

Lake Glory Campground Entrance – <u>40°54' 08.80" N 76°27'31.73"W</u>

From I-80 West

For trailers, we suggest taking Buckhorn exit 232 Route 42 south to Catawissa. Cross the bridge and watch for Route 487 south to bear right up an incline. Stay on PA 487 south for 6 miles. Campers continue to the top of the hill and turn left into the park.

I-80 East

Take Danville exit 224 to PA Route 54 east through Danville. PA 54 turns left to Elysburg. Turn left on PA 487 north at the light. Campers bear right into the park.

I-81 South

Near Hazleton, take the I-80 and I-81 junction and follow I-80 west. Take any of the three Bloomsburg exits: 232, 236, or 241. For trailers, we suggest taking Buckhorn exit 232 Route 42 south to Catawissa. Cross the bridge and watch for Route 487 south to bear right up an incline. Stay on PA 487 south for 6 miles. Campers continue to the top of the hill and turn left into the park.

I-81 North

Take the Minersville exit 116. Turn left onto Route 901 west to PA Route 54 west. Turn right on PA Route 487 north at the light. Campers bear right into the park..

How to Sign Up and Pay for an Event Online

Our Treasurer writes:

So, I have to admit that when I first tried to register for an event online I had difficulty navigating to the online event forms. For that reason I thought I would share this information just in case others have had the same experience as me.

- 1. First, log on to https://airstreamclub.org/
- 2. Click on the EVENTS tab
- 3. A map of the US will be displayed containing pins for all the events for all the Airstream clubs. Just above the map on the right side of the screen is the **Clubs** box. Click on the down arrow to display the list of clubs then scroll down to **Watchung NJ Club**. Clicking on this will cause the map to display only Watchung club events.
- 4. Find the event you wish to sign up for and click on the associated pin.
- 5. A text box giving a brief description of the event will be displayed. Click on the arrow in the orange box that says **More.**
- 6. A new page will be displayed. If a registration form has been created for the event this page will give you two options: online registration or mail-in registration using a download of the form. The online form allows payment via PayPal. If you prefer to pay via check download and print the form, which includes payment instructions. If there is no registration form available yet one will be at a later date.
