


North Texas Airstream Club is ON THE MAP!

Of all the many wonderful experiences that such a rally brings, there are two things that struck me at Rock Springs which also made an impression at our first International Rally in Fryeburg last year. The first was the pageantry of the parade of flags during the opening ceremony. There's something uplifting about seeing the various region and club officers, not to mention the representatives of each branch of the military, proudly displaying their colors as they are announced by the emcee or accompanied by the club band. Second, the sheer magnificence of seeing hundreds upon hundreds of shiny silver bullets and Airstreams and Argosys of every conceivable type and era assembled all in one place. If a smile has ever crossed your lips when you pull into a campground and see another Airstream or two, or pass one out on the road, you will have the faintest inkling of what it's like to see a vast multitude of them, not on a sales lot, but being occupied and enjoyed by their proud and friendly owners.

I must also give honorable mention to a third event which I thoroughly enjoyed. This one speaks to the spontaneity of what can happen at International. On consecutive nights, rally owners promoted "Airstreams Aglow" in each of the two camping areas. At dusk, each attendee was invited to turn on their interior lights, running lights, and any other festive lighting displays they may have had. The idea was to flood the campground with inviting warmth. This, in itself, was rather spectacular, but I experienced something a little extra. Our site was in the upper campground and the first night of "Airstreams Aglow" took place in the lower campground. I decided to ride my bike down to experience it up close. I soon fell in behind 3 or 4 golf cart shuttles, also on their way down. Soon we arrived at the lower campground and began snaking up and down the rows. As we made our way, another buggy, then a few bicycles, then more carts and bicycles tagged along. Before long I glanced back and discovered that I was in a parade! Waves and smiles and laughs and cheers were exchanged along the route for a good 20 minutes. The IBT meeting on July 13, 2023 resulted in the following:

Election of Executive Officers for 2023-2025

Eric McHenry, President; **Millie O'Donnell**, Vice-President; **Terri Warren**, Secretary **Per Hamnqvist**, Treasurer; **Tye Mott** will continue as Past President **Lori Grassi** will assume Parliamentarian duties in August

Motions were approved that result in the following bylaw/policy changes in the way publications are provided:

- 1. Publication of a monthly electronic edition of the Blue Beret
- 2. Publication of 4 editions of the Blue Beret annually, which may be received as electronic or print editions
- 3. Creation of an updated, downloadable pdf version of the Club Directory
- 4. Continued use of the online Club Directory, and
- 5. Availability for a printed copy of the Club Directory (Special Committee will decide with member input what information will be included in this printed directory)

The following is Matt Hackney's letter to the Board and his summation of his balanced budget which was submitted and approved by the IBT:

Treasurer's Report - July Special IBT


I want to thank the members of the IBT for working through this budget. It has been a real challenge to incorporate all the initiatives from the Strategic Planning Meeting in Jackson Center, couple those with the pending acquisition, and align those with the necessary consensus on changes to the Blue Beret. I appreciate the input from the Region Officers, especially Brad Briggs and Christine Baum, and our Historical Standing Committee, including Chair Joe Peplinski.

Today I bring forward three separate motions. One revising Bylaws, one revising Policy, and the last bringing forward the operating budget for the coming year. These reflect the consensus position reached after two months of discussions. The major changes brought forward in these motions are:

- Changes to our club publications, the Blue Beret and Club Directory
- Continuation of the ability for members to obtain a printed copy of the Club Directory
- Elimination of the Abinity Benefit Program, started last year
- · A balanced budget with an allocation to begin building a designated reserve fund
- Full funding for Region Officer Travel to their local clubs, at an increased reimbusement rate
- An absence of funding for International Officer/Executive Council Travel
- Inclusion of the income and expenses associated with the pending acquisition of 707 E. Pike St.

Of these changes, those related to printed publications have brought the most interest, discussion, and concern. I want to reiterate that costs have and will continue to increase rapidly for print publications. The graph (next page) demonstrates that:

It is important to note that all costs are going up, but the costs of printing and postage were significantly higher this year than in the past. Additional postage rate increases are scheduled for the coming year. It is also important to note that advertising income for the period has been essentially flat. Some advertisers are exiting print media entirely, as they can better track effectiveness and target their message with digital publications. We are excited by the opportunity to increase our advertising income in the coming years as a result of these changes. Some on the IBT pointed out that the Blue Beret used to be self-supporting. With these changes, we expect that to again be the case.

I also want to thank Eric McHenry and Joe Peplinski for developing a proposal to fill a void in our current Digital Directory. During our discussions it was noted that historical information, including past offices held and numbered caravans taken, did not port over when we implemented the new system. Work is planned to fill that gap, to ensure the Club Directory, in the future, will again have all the information we have had over the years. It has been my pleasure to serve this club and this Board over the past year.
