at the Flight 93 Memorial in Stoystown to begin the Western PA Caravan. The National Park site is a wonderful memorial to those who gave their lives to prevent the attack on the capitol. From there we headed to Hickory Hollow Campground in Rockwood and a fine rally opening dinner.




Monday – We headed to **Fallingwater**, the house designed and built by Frank Lloyd Wright for the Kaufmans of Pittsburgh. We had perfect



weather to walk the beautiful forested grounds and then explore the house from both interior spaces and outdoor cantilevered terraces, enjoying Fallingwater's intimate relationship with the mountainous landscape that inspired its design.





Tuesday found us heading to **Johnstown** where the flood of Friday, May 31, 1889, was one of the worst



disasters - natural or man made - in American history. After years of neglect the South Fork Dam, owned at the time by the South Fork Fishing and Hunting



Club, failed sending a wall of water through the Conemaugh Valley that ultimately struck and destroyed Johnstown. The catastrophe killed 2,209 people. We stopped first at the National Park Service Johnstown Flood National Memorial Site and Museum 10 miles north of town at the site of the South Fork Dam, then traveled to Johnstown driving through **Grandview Cemetery**, where the Monument of Tranquility overlooks the burial site of 777 unknown victims,

and then to the **Flood Museum** which features exhibits on the flood and recovery efforts.



On **Wednesday** we traveled to Altoona (aka Railroad City) to sightsee **Horseshoe**



Curve, a tourism destination, a target of Nazi spies and one of the primary east-west arteries of railroad travel in the nation; and the Altoona RailRoaders

Memorial Museum. Unfortunately the tram at the Curve was not operating and foliage around the track limited viewing trains, but still a good stop. Following a great Greek lunch at Athenian Restaurant we stopped at the museum, taking in the history of the Pennsylvania Rail Road and growth of Altoona during the heyday of rail travel and supply.



Thursday afternoon we headed to Mill Run, PA and Kentuck Knob where Wright built





a dramatic and serene house for I.N. Hagan, a Pittsburgh dairyman. Kentuck Knob is situated just below the crest of a great hill and appears almost part of the hill itself. An organic floor plan, cantilevered overhangs, and great expanses of glass effortlessly integrate the interior of the house with its surrounding landscape. Purchased in 1986 by Lord & Lady Palumbo of London the site was open to the public and also offers visitors wonderful sculptures on the grounds, including a section of the Berlin Wall. (The ice cream at the visitor center was really good too!!!)








As we headed to Kentuck Knob we passed the entrance to a Yogi Bear campground. Overnight Thursday, just 20 miles from our site, Yogi Bear was hit by an EF2 tornado! Fortunately no one was seriously hurt although lots of trees were down and several rigs and vehicles were totaled! We had thunder, lightning and rock-androll winds but luckily no hail or wind damage.

Friday we pulled up stakes and headed east to Carlisle, staying at Dogwood Acres

in Newville, PA. It was 'Corvettes in Carlisle' weekend so as we headed into town for a good dinner at at 1794 The Whiskey Rebellion restaurant there were corvettes of all



Saturday we visited the US Army

Heritage and Education Center. The center offers a unique history of the army through the eyes of the men and women who lived its history. There were interactive exhibits and the center's outside heritage trail (seen along Rte 81 south) which

showcases large pieces of equipment used more recently by the

Army. We ended the rally with a great 'left-over' dinner at the campground











and Don's great solo stove campfire.

Barb & Bill Earle returned from their western trip with some great pics from Colorado.




