Members MUST be logged into the member-only portal to renew online.

International New Member Dues - International Dues for new members are \$75 per year. The membership period is on an anniversary year which is based on 12 months from the member's original join date (Example: If member joined on May 1, 2023, the membership is good until May 1, 2024). HQ will collect one year of Local Club dues.

International <u>Legacy</u> Renewal Dues - International Dues are \$75 per year. Most of our LEGACY members expiration date is Jan. 1. HQ will collect one year of Local Club dues.

Renewal Forms – Paper renewal forms are available by request only. Contact HQ at 937-596-5211 to request a paper renewal form. You can also select electronic or paper in the member-only portal.

Affiliate & Intra-Club Memberships - Members can join online anytime or when they are joining or renewing their membership.

Lifetime Membership - Lifetime Memberships **MUST** go through the renewal process to let HQ know the Lifetime Member is still active and is in good standing with their Local Club.

Member Emails - To access your membership dashboard each member must have a valid email address on file with HQ. This also enables members to vote in the election of International officers and amendments to the constitution. Each member needs to have an **individual email** on file even if you share an email address with your partner. If your current email address is not on file, contact assist@airstreamclub.org or call HQ at 937-596-5211.

Local Club, Affiliate Dues & Intra-Club Dues - Local Club, Affiliate dues & Intra -Club dues received by HQ will be paid to the Local Club.

Auto-Renewal - Auto-Renewal is now available. You can select this option online anytime or when renewing your membership online.

Published Membership Directory – Legacy members must renew before Dec. 31 to be included in the published membership directory.

Do Not Publish - You have the option of not having contact information published in Club directories. Do not publish means your name(s), region, local club and Big Red Number will be listed without any contact information.

ONE LAP OF THE US

Our "One lap of the US" - We spent eight months away from home, towed our Airstream over 10,000 miles, traveling into 22 states, staying at 60 different campsites including two national forests, with visits to seven national parks, three national monuments, and a big party with 1,200 other Airstreams!

Last year once we decided to attend this year's Airstream International Rally in Rock Springs, WY being held in June, we started making plans for our winter trip. We first thought we would go to Florida for the

winter months, come home, and then travel west to Rock Springs for the rally. After talking about this for a while, we made the decision we would just do one long trip and call it "One Lap of the US".

Our adventure began on November 28th making several stops on our way south including a stop in Myrtle Beach, SC finally ending up in Florida where we spent the months of December and January. During our stay in Florida, we had the chance to spend time with family and friends (including Jim and KC Gillio), visited a couple of tourist stops including Disney Springs, Celebration, FL and Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park, and lastly we spent several days at the Tampa RV Show!





We left Florida at the beginning of February, and made our way through Alabama - with a stop to tour Techno RV - then a few nights in Mississippi and Louisiana before stopping in Texas for a few days at one of the "Escapee's" Park to visit some friends. While traveling through Texas, we also took a few days to visit "Big Bend" National Park - while there, we took the "Scenic Drive" down to the Rio Grande River and also did the hike up to "Balance Rock."

Leaving Texas, we made our way into New Mexico where we revisited "Carlsbad Caverns" and "White Sands" Na-

tional Parks. If you've ever been to White Sands or plan to visit in the future, be sure to get a "coaster" to slide down on the dunes - is a lot of fun!! After we left New Mexico, we spent two months in Arizona spending time at several county parks in the Phoenix area, as well as a stay in Lake Havasu right along the ...



Colorado River. One of the interesting things we did during our time in Arizona was to get both dogs to "Rattlesnake Awareness" trained.

While continuing our travel to Wyoming, we stayed in Nevada visiting family, and of course, a visit to Las Vegas where we took in a "Jeff Dunham" show. In between our stay in Nevada, we took a short "side trip" into California where we spent several days exploring "Death Valley National Park", and yes, in May it was "hot" (111 degrees), but our visit there was well worth tolerating the heat.



After our second stop in Nevada, we made our way into Utah where we visited three national parks - "Capitol Reef", "Arches" and "Canyonlands" - we hiked in both Capitol Reef and Arches - both were spectacular, but the one I really felt was well worth the effort was "Delicate Arch" in Arches National Park - the hike is 3.2 miles round trip - very strenuous and at times quite narrow, but once you reach the arch, the hike was well worth your effort! We have heard that "Delicate Arch" is one of the most famous in the world! As an added bonus during our time in Moab, Utah, we had the chance to meet up with Gary and Suzanne Russo and enjoyed a great dinner at one of the local restaurants.

Finally, after Utah, we travelled into Wyoming for a few days at "Flaming Gorge" National Forest before reaching the "ultimate destination" for our extended trip - The "66th Airstream International Rally" in Rock Springs, Wyoming! We spent two weeks in Rock Springs - the first week was spent attending the rally and the many events plus visiting the Rock Springs area - one of the best events is the annual "Pet Show" where both Val Davis and her dog "Marvin" as well as Diana McIntosh and her dog "Winnie" were two of the participants. A great thing about these international rallies is the opportunity to visit with old friends and the chance to make new friends. The second week, we just hung out at the



trailer and running errands - the week ended with a spectacular" fireworks' display on July 4th that were being set off in all directions surrounding the event center!
