'Fixer Upper' Comes to Life at The Silos

Whether you call it "The Silos," "Magnolia Market" or a combination of the two names, this place is full of home and garden inspiration. The two 120' silos were built in 1950 as part of the Brazos Valley Cotton Company. The Brazos Cotton Oil Mill closed in 1958. Chip and Joanna Gaines of HGTV's "Fixer Upper" fame opened their first business on the site in 2015 and haven't stopped expanding and improving the area around the Silos.

While we think the Magnolia Market is very cool and obviously a huge gift to Waco, it only took us about 45 minutes to check everything out. This is not really a place for us to shop (we do live in an Airstream!), but it is a terrific location to enjoy beautiful grounds (the gardens are awesome). Don't hate me, but I think it is pricey and the items are similar to what can be found in Joanna's collection in Target. The antiques were super cool (but also pricey). Use this place for inspiration to go antique shopping somewhere else.

There is no mistaking what the Silos and their surrounding businesses mean to Waco and that's a terrific thing. We saw several armed security guards, housekeepers (the many bathrooms are impeccable), as well as shopkeepers, restaurant, and bakery employees. This place has created jobs and tourism,



We loved our stay at Airport Park (a Corps of Engineers' park). Our site was awesome (#63) and overlooked the water. The bathhouses were not great. We had to use pliers to turn the water on and off, but the beauty of this park and the quick access to the sights of Waco made it a favorite anyway. Cost \$20 -\$28 per night.



We started our day with a yummy breakfast at the Magnolia Table. Terrific staff, beautiful décor & delicious food. We would love to dine there again.


