Airstream Club International Rally

To my brothers and sisters in the Las Vegas Airstream Club who attended the 66th Annual Airstream Rally in Rock Springs, Wyoming this June.

On Wednesday June 28th at about 2 pm for about 45 minutes, you probably were frightened by a very alien condition that is unknown in Las Vegas.

You should not need to fear for your health as this is a normal event that regularly occurs in Wyoming.

As the summer approached, it was time to get out of the city known as "Boiling Water" (AKA: Palm Springs). But where to go? Friends told us they summer in Prescott and encouraged us to join them. Have you checked your shock nuts lately?

A month prior to the International Rally in Rock Springs we replaced one of our Airstream tires due to uneven wear. The cause of this uneven wear was unknown to us at the time...

Fast forward to the rally, during a random conversation with a stranger on the last day resulted in learning of a little known, yet relatively common issue with Airstream shock nuts. He told a tail of uneven tire wear on a 2022 Flying Cloud and the realization that he had a missing shock nut. He went on to tell all of his friends to check their nuts as well. In the end, it was found that 5 out of 6 trailers had at least one missing shock nut.

Upon our return home from an amazing trip to Wyoming, I finally climbed under our Airstream to check the shock nuts. Low and behold, the tire we replaced due to uneven wear, was in fact missing the upper shock nut. Further research on this topic resulted in the discovery of an AirForum thread in which people discuss the issue and the replacement of the nuts.

Long story short, no matter what year or model Airstream you have, it's highly recommended to check your Shock Nuts once in a while. It may not hurt to replace your shock nuts with nylon threaded lock nuts and a bit of Locktite for good measure.
