We hope to enjoy the many wild flowers that line the roads during this time of year. Multiple wineries, walking and bike trails, and a must to visit the quaint town of Napa and surrounding area.

Wednesday we will all gather for our Happy Hour with announcements of the upcoming tours. We will provide a delicious Welcome Dinner after Happy Hour.

Thursday begins the day with coffee, tea, and PB & J at the clubhouse. A guided tour of Historic Nichelini Winery TBA, and for those of you that would just like to relax and mingle; bring your own picnic lunch as there is a picnic area for our enjoyment. There's not a lot of parking so we will need to car pool. Later we meet for Happy Hour, followed by dinner on your own with many options in historic Napa Valley area.

The RV Park offers 15 full hookup sties (first come, first serve) and 19 partial hookups (partial hookups have electricity and water), and most sites are back to back sites. Dump station and Wifi. Check in between 10:00 and 4:30. After 4:30 you would need to be escorted in by the RV Management.

Looking for Rally Hosts!

If Not You Then Who?

How would you like to host a party with other people's money? And be appreciated for it too. Then sign up to host a NorCal rally.

NorCal is a popular Airstream Club in part because it has a rally almost monthly at nearby but different venues, with a wide variety of activities. This gives members a chance to enjoy their Airstreams almost all year round, and to regularly visit with their Airstream friends that they otherwise would not see very often, if at all. But these rallies don't just happen. They are planned and executed by volunteers who (1) participate in and enjoy the rallies, (2) step up and host to express their appreciation to those other members who also host, thereby making the rallies possible, and (3) want to keep the different rallies going as a club amenity.

You see, for several reasons the Club cannot expect the same people to continually host rallies, nor does the Club want that. If there are no volunteer hosts for the rallies, they will be canceled. This will lead to no rallies, or to informal no-host rallies, which means everyone is on their own to reserve and pay for their own site (no more group rate), cook their own food and plan their own activities. Which is fine for the occasional flash rally, but is not healthy for the Club as a whole

that strives to be inclusive and provide a variety of experiences for all its Club members without the inevitable volunteer burn-out. That is why we need new blood to sign up and co-host our rallies.

THE GOOD NEWS

As a rally host, you will not be involved in the registration hassles or collecting money, just the fun, party planning part. Most rallies are put on by co-hosts, so you will not be doing the whole thing by yourself. Tasks can be easily divided up and delegated, which makes the whole process easier. Additionally, there are plenty of people you can contact for any input or assistance you might need in planning and/or executing your rally that would be delighted to help, e.g., the Smithsons, Carole Echols, the Murrays, Jane Malone, the Davisons, the Christies, the Crutchfields, Pat L, the Bibbys, the Verdegaals, Carmen Ortiz, etc. Just ask! Finally, numerous people in the Club have special talents that can be tapped to facilitate your rally, such as cooking, craft making, music making, technical knowledge, or just great ideas.

HOW TO GET STARTED

The easiest way to start is to pick a theme. Once you have a theme, the rest falls into place with some logistical planning.

Figure out the basics of the rally you are co-hosting and the per person costs of a site per night (get this information from Pat L.); the Welcome Dinner on Wednesday and the final Dinner on Saturday, both of which can be anything including catering by a local restaurant or caterer, pot luck, a steak burn, BBQ, group cooking, whatever, and the cost of any activity you think a group of Airstreamers would be interested in engaging.

Two months in advance of your rally provide a synopsis of your rally and coupon information to the Newsletter Editor for inclusion in the Newsletter and on the Website so that people can register to attend your rally. There are always examples of this in back issues of the Poppy. Then commence working on your rally: welcome bags, table décor, signing up caterers and coordinating activities, if any. Tip: keeping track of your expenses on a chart or spreadsheet and putting all receipts in an envelope or file scanned to your computer will keep everything handy when it comes time to submit your receipts for reimbursement after the rally. You will be reimbursed for any decorations, food costs, welcome bag items, door prizes, up front activity expenses and hospitality purchases.

When the time comes, execute and enjoy your rally. Afterwards, submit receipts and spreadsheet for reimbursement to the Treasurer, and send article and photos to the Newsletter Editor about your rally.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Is it work? Yes. But I would say most of the work is in the planning. The more you plan, the better the Rally. It is very helpful to research your rally location on the Internet and even visit the site of the Rally months ahead of time so that you can pick caterers and plan activities, etc. with enough advance time to be successful and not stressed.

Is it fun and gratifying? Oh yes! Most people are very appreciative that you hosted them. Plus, you can enjoy all the other rallies guilt free because you stepped up and volunteered to do your part to keep what sets NorCal apart from other Airstream Clubs. If enough people stepped up (after all we have well over 150 members) and volunteered to host the nine rallies a year that the Club hosts, the same people would only co-host every couple of years, if that, unless they want to do more.

STILL ON THE FENCE?

NorCal has published a booklet that helpfully and specifically sets forth what you need to do for a successful rally. Plus, our Rally Master Pat L. will be hosting Rally Host Workshops at several upcoming Rallies for those of you still on the fence.

So C'mon, get involved and host a rally! The rewards are truly worth it. Call, email, or button-hole Pat Lazzereschi to sign up. We are looking forward to you joining the ranks of Rally Host!



Once at their web site, note of any discount code pop-ups. The standard price for the flag is \$19.99 plus shipping, however discount codes are almost always available. Write down the discount code to use at time of checkout to apply discount.

Click the "Customize Now" button to start your order.

Enter your personalization in the text editor on the left. You will see your personalized text appear on the flag to the right. Click the fonts button in text editor to view and select from available fonts.

When you are happy with the personalization, click the "love the design? Add to cart" button above the flag. You will see a pop-up screen to confirm the personalization is exactly how you

want it. If all is good, click the "YES my design is ready to fly" button.

Next you will see another pop-up screen to select your fabric. There are two options: Flagtastic and Flip-it. The Flagtastic fabric will have slightly more vibrant colors, however please note that the TEXT WILL APPEAR BACKWARDS ON THE BACK OF THE FLAG. The Flip-it fabric is \$5.00 more, but the personalization text will appear normal on both sides of the flag. Chose the fabric you prefer.

When you arrive at the shopping cart, enter your shipping preference (standard or priority) and remember to enter your discount code in the coupon box. before proceeding to checkout. At checkout you can pay by credit card or PayPal.

You can purchase a stand separately at almost any hardware store. I purchased one from Lowe's for \$7.99 that is sturdy and breaks down for easy storage and transport.

Have You Got Yours Yet?






