The latest news is that the October Bakersfield rally was cancelled due to lack of interest. So the next rally after Felton will be at the Coast Village RV Resort in Pismo Beach, hosted by yours truly, Ed of course, and the Sallingers. Our club has rallied there several times, albeit not since John Bibby was installed as President a few years ago. It is always a fun place to rally, if only for the location. The two rallies of 2024 that were featured in last month's Poppy (the Flash Rally in Death Valley and the August Rally in Costanoa) had their registration challenges since the Club is trying new things. Attempting to reserve camping spots in popular National Parks can be difficult because people scam the system, going online before the dates they want and reserving sites early, locking up to two weeks worth of camping, then weeks or months later cancelling the sites they do not need. With the result that when you log onto the reservation site to camp on certain dates six months in advance, the sites you want may be all unavailable. If you missed obtaining a site at the Furnace Creek Campground during February dates of the rally, don't despair. The odds are that someone will cancel so keep checking back on recreation.gov. Lori is keeping a waiting list so those from our group who cancel can let her know, and she will let you know about the vacancy.

As for Costanoa, people reported that it was a fairly easy process. The rally filled up by Tuesday afternoon, but there is a waiting list and odds are that if you are on it, you will probably get in given that the rally is almost a year away. If you have reservations for either rally and have not yet done so, please contact Lori and provide her with your reservation number and dates of your stay so she can keep track in the event of cancellations, and let others in.

So enjoy your September and I will be back in October.

New info shown in green. Dates are arrival and departure, although you can often request early arrival or Monday departure. Sign-ups are accomplished by submitting a completed Registration form and payment by the deadline to the Club Registrar. If a rally is full, there is a wait list. "Buddy" events allow you to invite a non-member even if they don't own an Airstream. Events lacking hosts or the minimum number of campers may be be cancelled. Rallies are subject to COVID restrictions and protocols and any refunds are covered by Club policies as shown on the rally coupon.

Ahoy matey! Our silver ships be dockin' at The Pismo Coast Village RV Resort this November, in a salute to the possible pirate past of the area, including Pirates Cove, located between Avila and Pismo Beaches.



Arrrgh! Fly your Jolly Roger and make a point to be there. Lore has it that Sir Francis Drake (pirate), after looting Spanish settlements, stopped at the nearby Pirates Cove on his way up the Coast of California in the 1570s and buried treasure in the area. 
THIS RALLY'S REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

TOTAL RALLY COST

- On the first of the month, either directly register online using the jotform link:
 or follow the 'Register for the Rally' link on the webpage (https://airstreamclub.org/northern-california/rallies-and-events), or send this form and payment to the registrar at norcalregistrar3854@gmail.com. It is preferred you register online, which makes it easier for the Registrar and Treasurer to keep track of rally registrations.
- You can now choose to pay your rally fee online via Zelle (initiate through Zelle App or bank app if your bank participates) or send check directly to registrar Lori Bibby, 3029 Black Hawk Lane, Lincoln, CA 95648.
- If you pay by check, make your checks payable to WBCCI/NorCal and mail to NorCal Registrar Lori Bibby
- If you want to pay via Zelle but do not know how or if your bank participates, check out: https://www.zellepay.com/
- Refund Policy: Cancellations and/or changes to registration must be received no later than Wednesday of the week prior to the rally, in other words, a week before the start of the rally. Refunds will be available depending on funds recovered in all categories. Parking fees are refunded according to RV park cancellation policy. Meals, tours, rally fees, etc., are refunded if money has not been spent by the hosts.
- Please contact the Rally Registrar if you have ANY changes to your registration, or wish to register after the deadline. 973-270-4132. She will contact you as soon as she can.
- Under no circumstances are members to contact the RV Park with changes or cancellations.
- NorCal abides by the federal, state and local COVID19 mandates to keep not only its members safe but also the
 employees of the RV Parks and the communities we visit safe, which in turn allows us to continue to rally during
 the pandemic. If you are unable or unwilling to do so, please do not sign up for this rally. If you are ill or not feeling
 well, please stay home and get better. Thank you for your courtesy in this regard.
- Please inform the Registrar if you need a handicap accommodation, or if this is your first NorCal rally.
- Your registration is incomplete and not confirmed until we receive BOTH your registration and payment. Typically,
 Zelle payments will confirm your registration quicker than sending in a check. Do not wait until the last minute to
 pay or you may not have a site regardless of when you initially apply.

A Message to Those who use Zelle to Pay for Rallies

The Treasurer and Web page Manager say "thanks to all of you who are using Zelle to pay for rally registration." However, some caution needs to be taken when completing the transaction. They and the Registrar request that **each time** you use Zelle for a rally, you take notice of the "message" or "reason" area on the "send" or "transfer" money page of your banking app and type in the following three things:

- your name(s)
- the month and year of the rally you are registering for
- either the email address or cell phone number you used when you registered with Zelle. This is necessary in the event of a refund, as the they otherwise will not know. If you do not remember what you used to register, the log-on page of the Zelle app should let you know. For purposes of this, the email address in the message cannot contain the '@' sign, so the example below uses "(at)" instead.

Sample:

- Jane & John Doe, May 2023 Rally, 555-333-4576
- Jane & John Doe, August 2023 Rally, johndoe(at)yahoo.com
 Click HERE to see an example in the app. This information helps the
 Treasurer and the Registrar identify which payments belong to which rally
 when they do their accounting and also in expediting refunds. They
 appreciate your cooperation, and of course it benefits you. Juggling a lot
 of information behind the scenes is not easy, especially after a rally, so
 any help we give them is appreciated!

Recipe Corner: Lynn Hurley's Jambalaya Bread Pudding Serves 10

At the August rally, Lynn Hurley's jambalaya bread pudding was reportedly a big hit on potluck night, with many requests for the recipe. It is reprinted here.

Pudding Ingredients

- 1 loaf French bread
- 3 eggs
- 2 tablespoons vanilla extract
- 1 cup raisins (FYI: Lynn has never used raisins)
- 1 quart milk
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 3 tablespoons butter

In a large bowl break bread into bite-size pieces. (She leaves the crust on and cuts it up into about 1-inch cubes.) Mix other ingredients, except butter, pour over bread and soak about an hour. Melt butter in a 13 x 9 x 2 baking dish, tilting to coat all sides. Pour in pudding and bake at 1 hour at 375 degrees. (She has used individual ramekins also)

Sauce Ingredients

1 stick butter 1 cup sugar 1 egg, beaten 1/4 cup bourbon

In top of a double boiler, melt butter and sugar. (You can get away with not using a double boiler.) Very gradually whisk in egg. Cool slightly. Add bourbon. (Brandy would probably work quite nicely as well.) If serving right away, pour warm sauce over pudding. If not, warm sauce slightly before serving and serve in a sauce boat.

Note: Lynn reports sourdough French bread is "yummy." She has also used \$weet French bread for the recipe.


