
Airstream's Electrical System – Part 4

AC/DC is not just a rock band! AC/DC are two separate ways to transmit electricity. Airstreams deliver both AC and DC energy.

Batteries and solar panels transmit DC (direct current) in a constant one direction. Positive charge travels in one direction (red wire) and negative charge travels in another direction (black wire). Electronic equipment works best using DC power because of its constant and consistent electrical flow. DC power does not travel long distances well. The more power (amps) and/or distance (Ohms) requires wires to become larger. If the wires are too small, heat is created and will eventually fail.

Shore power and generators transmit AC (alternating current) in the form of a magnetic wave. When a generator rotates it passes through a magnetic field, and energy is produced in the form of an oscillating wave. The wave is measured in hertz (Hz), and there can be more than one cycle at different hertz called phases.

What does that mean? The image gives you a visual representation of an AC cycle (sine wave). The top curve is a magnetic pole, and the bottom is the opposite pole. This is the alternating in AC power. Common household



current is two 120 volt phases for a total of 240 volts. AC power is very efficient traveling long distances, and the more phases used the more efficient the power is utilized.

The production of 110 volts is buried in the early days of electrical history. In the early days light bulbs were the primary use for electricity. At the time light bulbs could not sustain higher voltage until the technology in material became available. This set the stage for our current voltage standard for 120 volts. With the development of energy-hungry devices like air conditioners and refrigerators, a higher voltage (240 volts) was needed for common households. Not every state produces the same amount of voltage due to phase setting. Most shore power produces 120/240 volts, but others produce 110/208 volts.

So, what does that have to do with your Airstream? Shore power delivers either 120 volts, 30 amps or 240 volts, 50 amps. Most older Airstream's use 120 volt, 30 amps when plugged into shore power. Airstreams with multiple air conditioners and more electronic devices need additional power. Modern Airstreams come with 240 volt, 50 amp service to supply the necessary power.

Most portable generators can provide for one phase of power. An Airstream with 30 amp service benefits as it only has 120 volt service. Airstreams with 50 amp service will need an adapter to split (Figure: dog-bone) the 30 amp power source to both phases (commonly called leads). You will be limited to 30 amps, and you will have to take precautions to not trip the circuit breaker on the power pedestal or generator.

- 30 amp service | 3600 watts at one phase.
- 50 amp service | 12000 watts with two phases.



No matter the Airstream's capacity, you are limited by the energy production of your generator. More information will be in another article discussing generators.

Calhoun Falls State Park

Calhoun Falls State Park is a state park located on the shores of Lake Russell near the town of Calhoun Falls in Abbeville County, South Carolina developed by the *U.S. Army Corps of Engineers*. The campsites are very spacious and shaded by trees. The park has a nature trail, marina, basketball and tennis court, a public beach, fishing piers and all the sites are paved.

The majority of Lake Russel is not developed so the water is clear and clean. You can swim, kayak, fish and relax by the lake without all the boats and jet skis, unlike the majority of the lakes in SC. They also have a rental company at the State Park Store, if you want to rent kayaks for the day. The park does not have full hook-ups, but the dump station is close by. We highly recommend the park and it is one of our favorite local parks.



Recipe submitted by Sandee Welch (BRN 01399)

S'more Monkey Bread

Makes 5 servings – Serve Warm

Ingredients:

¼ cup graham cracker crumbs

- ¼ cup packed brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 package (7-1/2 ounces) chocolate chips ¼ cup milk
- ¼ cup mini marshmallows

10 buttermilk biscuits, refrigerated



Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- Spray five 4-ounce ramekins or custard cups with nonstick cooking spray.
- Combine graham cracker crumbs and brown sugar in a medium bowl.
- Place melted butter in small bowl.
- Separate biscuits; cut each biscuit unto four pieces with scissors. Dip four biscuit pieces in melted butter; roll in crumb mixture to coat. Place in prepared ramekin; sprinkle with about 7 chocolate chips and seven marshmallows, pressing chips into biscuit dough. Dip four more biscuit pieces into melted butter; roll in crumb mixture to coat. Arrange pieces over bottom layer in ramekin; top with chocolate chips and marshmallows. Repeat with remaining ingredients and ramekins.
- Place ramekins on baking sheet.
- Bake about 18 minutes or until golden brown.
