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



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Saturday, July 8

Today we went to see Oregon caves national Monument. We had to drive 19 miles up a very winding road to the caves entrance. Now you could also take half of the tour which is just a little over 100 steps but we chose what they call a sneak peek. We saw just a very small portion of the entrance and then we went right back out. I don't think we could handle over 500 steps or stairs and ladders.













Today we drove an hour south to see the famous redwoods. So glad we did. Then we drove along the California coast. All I can say is beautiful.








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Well, it's been several days since I last made a report. Tuesday we left and drove up the Oregon coast on route 101. We did something that we have never done before. We stayed at Cracker Barrel, we have stayed at Cabela's,

Took a boat ride in Gig Harbor Washington. That's what these pics are. Can you find the bald headed eagle? Those seals are called harbor seals. And another great picture of Mount Rainier. They said that Mount Rainier and Mount Saint Helens are still active volcanoes. Mount Rainier still have hot springs coming up and few places the hot gas escapes. So I guess that's why it's still active. Mount Saint Helen's is still active but I don't know why. The last time it erupted was back in 1980. I think I read somewhere that volcano is still considered active if it has erupted within the last several hundred years or something like that.















This is at Washington's Airstream Park. This is the ninth Airstream Park out of 10 that we have visited. We have one more to visit and that's in Minnesota and we will visit that on our way home. After we visit that, that means we've had a chance to visit all 10 Airstream only parks in the United States.





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Sunday, July 16

Today my friends, we spent pretty much all day driving east, and somewhat south. Spent an hour at Whitman Mission National Historic Park and then drove onto Nez Perce National Park in Idaho, but we were too late. We'll see that tomorrow morning. Pretty much this whole trip temperature wise, it has been great. Down in the 50s at night and may be up in the 80s during the day. Didn't get that high every day but still it has been wonderful, until today. It's 104 and we're at a state park camping for the night with electricity so I can run the air conditioner. Thank goodness for air conditioning. Can't boondock in these kind of temperatures.

Saturday, July 22

Well last night and in the next couple of days, we're spending at a campground right next door to the Theodore Roosevelt National Park, southern entrance of the park in North Dakota. Town called Medora ND. Getting a little weary traveling so we're gonna stop here for a few days. New few pictures is our campsite and a short walk to the little Missouri River.















These pictures are taken from glacier national park and northern western corner of Montana. It was beautiful. In order to get in since we did not have reservations, we spent a night there and since we're already in, they couldn't refuse us. That's what we were told to do.







As the sign says, this is the Whitman National Historic site. The Whitman's were missionaries out west, and well to make a long story short, the Indians killed him and his family. Main because they thought that Whitman was killing the Indians through disease. They believe the white man was getting better from the disease, but the Indians were dying. And the Indians thought Mr. Whitman was purposely letting them die. But all faults.







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Pompeys Pillar is where actually Clark of the Louis and Clark expedition signed his name in the sand stone. It is the only known spot that still visible from that great expedition. Clark wrote his name on the sandstone after he and Louis split up when they were going east back to St. Louis Missouri. If you know anything about the Lewis and Clark expedition, on their way back, they split up, Louis went north and Clark went south. They followed two different rivers, and they were supposed to meet where the Yellowstone and the Missouri river meets. I find that completely amazing that they actually were able to fight each other again.







Here, at the battle of Little Bighorn, I found most intriguing and interesting. Yes, a lot of the soldiers lost their lives there, but in some respects, it was all the white man's fault. They wanted to take away the land that belonged to the Indians, and that was previously





given to the Indians. That is just a short part of the story. Because it's quite a long story. We took a tour there, and our tour guide was great. She was a direct descendent of the crow Indians. You can see in the pictures of the markers where the soldiers fell. Very few red markers, which indicate where an Indian fell, because when the battle was over the Indians quickly came and gathered their







dead. Where the white man let the dead lay for a couple of days before they gathered them or buried them.

This is basically a trading post between the white man and the Indians.

And anybody else who wants to make a trade.

The military fork was just a few miles away called
Fort Butte.











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Wednesday, July 26

Well friends, we are camped for the day right beside the Mississippi River for tonight. Just a small county park with just electric. That's all we need for now. We have seen several National Parks/Monuments/Historic areas. Some of them wasn't much to take pics of. The visitor center was like the museum. Again, very interesting. A few pics will follow.




























Now tonight, we are camping right along the Mississippi River in Dubuque Iowa.

THE CAPITAL TO CAPITAL CARAVAN

September 15 to September 29, 2023

The C2C Caravan is an initiative of ACI Region 2. It will launch on Friday evening, September 15 and wind up 2 weeks later on Friday morning, September 29. Region 2 is unique in that its area includes the capital cities of both the USA and Canada. Our days will be equally split between the USA and Canada.

This caravan will start with 3 days and 4 nights at the closest campground to the DC area, with ready access to rapid transit downtown. We will stroll the Mall at our leisure, visit as many of the wonderful Smithsonian Museums as possible and take in the sights of this beautiful capital city. One evening will be devoted to a guided tour of the most famous monuments, departing right from our campground.

We will then head north with several stops along the way to see some local highlights. Examples will include a museum devoted to country music, an afternoon cruise in the beautiful Thousand Islands and other activities still under development. Most driving days will be moderate in length with lots of scenery to plant in your memory banks!

The caravan will end at a campground inside the city limits of Ottawa, adjacent to hiking and cycling trails and close to rapid transit. We will tour the city on an open top bus, take a boat ride on the historic Rideau Canal (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) and visit a few of the museums and galleries in the city. Typically, by this time of year the Ottawa Valley will be resplendent in Fall Colours and we will direct everyone to some of the most spectacular drives. Evening campfires will give us time to relax and share our experiences. Our wind up dinner will be at a very popular buffet restaurant close by the campground.

As Caravan Leader, I like to run caravans that are rather laid back in style where everyone gets to know everyone else and people have opportunities to pursue some of their own interests. Biking, hiking, ziplining, enjoying a cold brew on a patio, whatever floats your boat! We will do our best to accommodate every interest. The estimated Kitty Fee is \$1700 US or \$2400 Cdn for an Airstream with 2 people. Deposit will be \$500 US or Cdn (lets keep it simple).
