

Pennsylvania State Rally
PA Presidents Meeting
White Hall Camp and Conference Center, Emlenton, PA
August 12 2023

Cody Klingler (Al-Mon-O AS Club) called the meeting to order approximately 930 am beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

In attendance (Roll Call): Doug Field (Pennsylvania AS Club), Howard Mergelcamp (Keystone AS Club) via telephone; Karl Schubert (Central PA AS Club), Cody Klingler (representing AlMon-O AS Club) and Cindy Collister (Penn Lehigh). A quorum was present.

Cody explained the main objectives of this meeting are to discuss the "Seed money" and the future of the state rally. Cody explained the Howard Mergelkamp sent him some reports from 1987 minutes and 1988 State Rally Treasurer Report. Cody shared the same documents with Cindy Collister to review before this meeting. The State Rally procedure was that each of five PA units would forward \$50 to the hosting unit for the host unit to have funds for reserving places, down-deposits on services, and such. The 1987 minutes revealed the procedure for distribution of profits(losses). The \$250 "seed money", the \$50 would be returned to the five units. From the 1988 Penn Lehigh minutes and the 1988 Treasurer's Report, the \$250 seed money was returned to the PA units. During the 1988 PA State Rally held at Hughesville Fairgrounds, a unit member Natalie VanKirk made several posters and stage backdrop for decorations. They were pieces of art and participants encouraged having the artwork auctioned. The artist donated the auction profits to the state rally fund. It was decided at this point that \$500 would be the "seed money" to be transferred to host units and there would be no need to collect and return the seed money from each unit. From thereon the host unit would pass the \$500 seed money to the next year's hosting unit. Then 50% profits would be retained by the host and the remaining 50% of profits would be distributed to the units based on the number of member participants from each unit. Each unit would decide whether to send refunds to each participant or become part of their unit treasury.

One the establishing of the \$500 "Seed Money" and the procedure was reviewed. Cody expressed that he didn't feel the need for the "Seed Money" anymore that most of the clubs' treasuries would support the planning process for hosting the state rallies. Whatever is decided whether to continue state rally, what should we do about the "Seed Money". George Collister felt that the Penn Lehigh AS Club would take back the \$500 and reserve it in the Penn Lehigh treasury in the event that a host unit needs to access the \$500. He was asked if the Treasurer would be acceptable to this arrangement and George and Cindy felt quite certain that this arrangement would be acceptable. Cody called for a vote and all agreed. Cody said he would cut a check to Penn Lehigh Unit before departing this rally.

The second matter was concerning the future of the Pennsylvania State Rally in current form and rotation. Cody asked Howard Merkelkamp of Keystone to share his club's feelings. Keystone's conclusion is attendance declining so much. They feel the State rally should be something special, like with entertainment and activities. Also notification needs to be sooner, so it doesn't interfere with their clubs scheduling for their rallies. Unless there is more participation Keystone suggests considering a state rally every two or three years. Howard also suggested perhaps start a committee with a representative from every Pennsylvania club, so that planning doesn't fall on one unit only. Howard thinks Keystone feels that every year not the way to go.

Cody asked that Cindy express how Penn Lehigh Club feels about the state rally. Cindy said when the first mention of discontinuing the State Rally was disappointing. Personally we like this opportunity to meet people from other clubs. Cindy added as a small club, we know we are going to a Region, State and International rally and we only have to plan for maybe three other club trailering events. Other units plan lunch events during winter months. George also expressed that the critical ingredient to the rally is the location of the event. And success is due to advertising.

Doug read the decision of the Pennsylvania Unit. Doug offered that personally would like to continue, one way of the other. However, he is concerned if skip a year or two, the attendance would go down even more. Per their club decision of August 5th meeting motion passed they would support cancellation of the State Rally if that was the decision. However, under no circumstance that they are not pulling out of participation if the state rallies continue. Regarding frequency, PAC will comply with group's decision

Karl said he emailed like 40 people and received four responses: two in favor of discontinue and two in favor of 2 or 3 years. He explained he and his wife had considered the 2-3 years; but hearing the discussion this day about skipping a year would hurt the participation, would definitely consider every year but consider creating a state rally planning committee.

Eleanor, in the audience, wanted to mention, as an older couple who really look forward to the yearly rally, they don't know how many more years they have, every two or three years you are eliminating some of the membership. All agreed this was a good point. Cody reported that Al-Mon-O Is prepared to offer they will host, but would like a committee including all the local clubs to assist. Also that all units will help with various volunteer tasks.

Al-Mon-O will try to pick a regular location and date and consider making it more as a National Event. This could help boost attendance opening up to other than Pennsylvania members, but celebrating Pennsylvania.

Cody was asked if Al-Mon-O would continue to host every year. Cody explained that he and Matt have hosted three of them so far. They feel they now have the expertise. Cody said they would do this as a trial run and address this later.

Cody called for vote for motion to continue every year not rotating between five clubs and form committee to put rally together. Unanimous agreement.

Cody would like committee formed by end of August. Cindy will provide minutes of this meeting

The C2C Caravan is an initiative of ACI Region 2. It will launch on Friday evening, September 15 and wind up 2 weeks later on Friday morning, September 29. Region 2 is unique in that its area includes the capital cities of both the USA and Canada. Our days will be equally split between the USA and Canada.

This caravan will start with 3 days and 4 nights at the closest campground to the DC area, with ready access to rapid transit downtown. We will stroll the Mall at our leisure, visit as many of the wonderful Smithsonian Museums as possible and take in the sights of this beautiful capital city. One evening will be devoted to a guided tour of the most famous monuments, departing right from our campground.

We will then head north with several stops along the way to see some local highlights. Examples will include a museum devoted to country music, an afternoon cruise in the beautiful Thousand Islands and other activities still under development. Most driving days will be moderate in length with lots of scenery to plant in your memory banks!

The caravan will end at a campground inside the city limits of Ottawa, adjacent to hiking and cycling trails and close to rapid transit. Evening campfires will give us time to relax and share our experiences. Our wind up dinner will be at a very popular buffet restaurant close by the campground.
