You've Been "Airstream Flamingo'd"! By Susan Poole

Have you received a small flamingo-themed gift or card when you were parked with your Airstream at a campground? Then you may have been "Airstream Flamingo'd"!

There is a new custom flocking around Airstreams. When one Airstream owner sees another Airstream parked at the same campground, they drop off a little gift on or near the Airstream to welcome them. The gift may be a little stuffed or plastic flamingo, card, embroidered towel, painted rock, key ring, or flamingo -themed gift bag. Most are given anonymously to someone they don't know, but you can put your Big Red Number or name on it or give one to a friend if you want. Sometimes it starts a conversation and new friendship with the other Airstream owners; other times the giver has no idea what the receiver thought about it. But either way, hopefully it leaves both the sender and recipient feeling a little pleased!



David and I were "Flamingo'd" for the first time this year when we were staying at a KOA Campground near Harper's Ferry National Historic Park in West Virginia. When we returned from an outing, a pretty pink bag with an attached flamingo key ring was sitting on our step. Inside was an embroidered tea towel and a card encouraging us to check out the Facebook page. There was only one other Airstream parked at the same campground, so when I walked by and saw them sitting outside, we chatted a few minutes. It was pleasant way to meet someone!

Maryanne and Mike Swegles were also recently "Flamingo'd at Virginia Highland Haven with a pretty flamingo bag and glass.



How did it all get started?

The practice of leaving a gift at another owner's Airstream is fairly recent, perhaps about one year, but it could have been done less formally for a longer period of time. The FaceBook page <u>"You've Been Airstream Flamingo'd"</u> was started March 15, 2023, by Heide Beecher Schlagel and there are already over 700 members. She also developed an Instagram page. She encourages people to post the pictures and stories about the gifts they gave or were given.

At the most recent Airstream International Rally in 2023 at Rock Springs, WY, the organizers encouraged attendees to leave a flamingo gift or card at "first timer's" Airstreams to welcome them to the flock. There were lots of posts of the event Facebook page with new members pleased about the little surprises they received. In fact, one of the Florida Airstream Club couples, Jean and Jake Piper, painted little rocks with a pink flamingo on the front and their Big Red Number on the back. They left them at a few friends' Airstreams and some other miscellaneous places. Later in the week, a couple of young girls came by on a golf cart from the other side of the campground and wanted to meet the owners of BRN 22373 to tell them they loved the little painted rock!

What do pink flamingos symbolize?

In order to figure out when and why flamingos became so popular with Airstreamers, it is beneficial to learn more about them and what they symbolize. When searching the internet, I found out that pink flamingos symbolize many different concepts.

Flamingos often symbolize beauty and balance, which comes from their unique pink color and ability to gracefully stand on one leg, even when sleeping. Many people associate flamingos with romance and family relationships because of their elaborate courtship, romantic appearance, and tendency to flock together in large strongly-bonded family groups (called a "flamboyance"). Flamingos can also represent truth, due to the fact that flamingos' tongues filter sludge water for food, hence the analogy with the ability to filter lies and seek the truth.

For some people, flamingos symbolize the inner potential of each individual and how it needs nurturing. This may be due to the fact that baby flamingos are born with gray to white plumage and develop a pink to orange color as they age, depending on the number of pigments in the algae, mollusks, and crustaceans they eat. As the expression says: "You are what you eat!"

Still others believe that flamingo totems, such as artifacts and jewelry, remind us to let our inner beauty shine. When given as a gift, flamingos can be a token of love, affection, and appreciation. Maybe it is simply, like flamingos who thrive in large groups, we also want to socialize with others who have similar interests and are seeking a connection to other like-minded people.





Conversely, one internet search for "What do two pink flamingos mean?" revealed a completely different meaning. An article on RVtravel.com stated that some people believe the secret meaning is an invitation to "swing" -- meaning to exchange partners and have an open relationship. Although flamingos are a social species, this connotation isn't consistent with the way flamingos commonly mate for life and make life-long friends. More people believe flamingos are a common icon of America that is displayed to celebrate the heritage of the Airstream and/or love of traveling. So, in order to prevent your intentions from being misinterpreted, just give one flamingo artifact or display any number other than two!

How did pink flamingos become associated with Airstreams?

There is no simple answer to when and how flamingos became associated with Airstreams, but it may have started over 100 years ago. Flamingos only live in tropical and sub-tropical regions, and may have been brought to Florida from South America. During the 1920's, when Florida was the hottest vacation spot in the United States, many tourists brought back pictures and souvenirs of a unique pink bird they saw there – flamingos. Soon it became a status symbol which showed the owners were rich enough to travel to exotic places. Everyone wanted them!

So, manufactures started creating flamingo designs. The early flamingo lawn ornaments were flat and unappealing, followed by ones constructed of foam which fell apart quickly. Then, in 1957, a young man named Don Featherstone who worked for Union Plastics, created a pink molded-plastic flamingo lawn ornament on stiff wire legs. Many people started displaying them in their gardens or in front of their RVs when traveling. The plastic flamingo design hasn't changed much in over half a century, and they are still being made with Don Featherstone's name embossed on the rump.

Pink flamingo ornaments also became a way to add a little color to campsites, especially by those who travel in vintage Airstream units. Perhaps this is because it reflects back to the retro style of the 50's when the ornaments were invented. Even now, it is a common site to see flamingo-themed decorations beside Airstreams at rallies across the country. In fact, you can find a pair of the original pink flamingos for sale at Airstream Supply Company website, along with other flamingo-themed gifts.

No one knows for sure who was first to display pink flamingos with their Airstream. I was fortunate to speak with a couple a few years ago who gave me some insight at a Florida Airstream Club rally at Fort Christmas, FL. Albert and Grace Buchanan (#800) were the caravan leaders on the Alaska Caravan for many years. They live in Melbourne, FL now, but Gracie mentioned she was born in Canada and the caravan traveled near her little home town. When I complimented her on how nice the pink flamingo ornaments looked in front of her Airstream, she told me in her soft voice with a sweet smile that she was the one who started the tradition of displaying pink flamingos outside their Airstream! Since they traveled with a lot of different couples during their years of leading the Alaska Caravans, they could have influenced many others to display pink flamingos with their Airstreams. There are probably other "early adopters", but I heard it first from Gracie!

Summary

In summary, pink flamingos are associated with beauty, balance, potential, romance, family, and affection. They have become a way to welcome other Airstreamers and promote a sense of community and belonging. A flamboyance of flamingos is a sight to behold, much like a group of Airstreams parked beside each other. Maybe flamingos are so popular because they simply remind us of the warmth we feel when we rally together!

Quebec is a Delight! By John and Julie Cooke

Bonjour! Did you ever want to travel to the province of Quebec, Canada, but were more than a little intimidated by not speaking French? We were in the predicament of trying but failing miserably at learning the beautiful French language, but decided to take the plunge to see the province of Quebec with less than a few well-rehearsed words. We are very happy we did! Granted, knowing French would be the perfect way to see this beautiful province of Canada but it shouldn't be a deciding factor on your travel.

First of all, don't be intimidated by crossing the border. Crossing the border at Lansdowne/Alexandria was very easy. Remember, NO GUNS. Our conversation with the Canadian Border guard went like this:

Port Authorities @ the border, "You are from Florida?" John: Yes Border Guard: Do you have a gun? John: No Border Guard: Are you sure you don't have a gun? We just arrested someone from Florida in one of these with a gun. John: No, we really don't have a gun. We don't own a gun. Border Guard: Have a good trip.

That was the extent of our crossing. Florida has a bad reputation for guns.





We toured the three big cities Ottawa, Montreal and Quebec City, and then the Gaspésie Peninsula at Forillon National Park. At our stop in Montreal, we were trying to figure out how to purchase a three-day pass for the bus/metro. A family of five helped us with the translation and then made sure we were on the right corner before heading to their activity. We really haven't needed much translation. Most menus, WAZE, and Google translate have helped us coordinate our touring and Quebecers are very helpful!

Campgrounds vary widely, so do your research. Look for how close it is to the city and whether it is a parking lot. We prefer Provincial and National Parks but that may not be your style. Forillon National Park in one of the prettiest wooded campsites we have ever stayed in.

We knew that Quebec was its own nation within a nation, if that makes since, but we did not realize they have their own National Parks to camp in as well as the big Canadian National Parks. Check out Sepaq for the Quebec National Parks (scroll all the way down to the bottom for the English Translation) <u>https://</u> <u>www.sepaq.com/</u> In a do-over, we would explore booking Sepaq Parks as well as the National Parks. But be advised they could probably speak just French, while the Canadian National Parks in Quebec speak French and English.

So why take the plunge and do something out of your comfort zone when America has so much to offer?

The exchange rate is great... currently \$1.00 CAD to \$0.76 US. In a little less than three weeks, we toured three totally unique and exciting cities, and explored a very sparsely inhabited region of the Gaspesie where moose, whales, fishing, and summer seaside villages draw visitors.

Ottawa: Capitol of Canada, feel and vibe similar to Washington DC. Highlights include Parliament, Rideau Canal Locks River cruise, By Ward market, and National Gallery of Canada.

Montreal: wow...feel and vibe similar to Milan or New York... chic Highlights include Notre Dame Basilica, Jardin Nelson (restaurant), Little Italy, Chinatown, Montreal Museum of History and Archaeology and Jardin Botanique. If it is raining, also see the Underground City.

Quebec City: feel and vibe of old-world France. Definitely see the old city and surrounding area.

Gaspesie Peninsula: wow...we were so intimidated by this area because of language differences. If we had a do over, we would have spent an additional week or more on the peninsula and gone slower.

Things we missed but will be back for: Parc du Bic and Parc de la Gaspésie. Lots of Lighthouses, little towns and discoveries!





Quebecers really *really* love outdoor activities! Know when you come, there will be myriads of adventures to choose from. In fact, you could follow the Appalachian hiking trail all the way up from Georgia and finish in Forillon National Park at Land's End or circle all the way around and end in Maine.

For paddlers, the water is clear and the seaside is filled with coves and secret hideaways. There are nesting birds and tide pools to explore. For bikers, the province is yours to explore. Quebecers believe so strongly in biking that the downtown Ottawa has dedicated streetlights just for bikes!

Quebec is a delight to all the senses! Enjoy planning and discovering this unique province. Don't hesitate to come visit Quebec!

1. Registration

Registration for the rally is on-line at the Florida Airstream Club website. <u>https://</u> <u>airstreamclub.org/florida</u> Rally Fee is \$25 per attendee and collected online when you register. DO NOT contact the campground as sites have been reserved by the rally host. Camping fee is \$30.00 per night, and will be collected at Happy Hour.

We will be camping just to the north of the main pavilion. Follow the signs to our area. Water and 30 amp electric are at every site. Restrooms and dump stations are available on site.

2. Soggy Bottom Bluegrass

The Soggy Bottom Bluegrass group will be sharing the campground with us. They will be gathered on the east side of the park by the pavilion. We have been invited to drop by and listen to them play. There are no scheduled or named bands, just some very nice and talented people playing bluegrass.

3. Yard Sale

In addition, nearby Sebastian Inlet State Park is a short bike ride or hike away and has a fishing pier, with beautiful beaches to enjoy. For want to be treasure hunters Mel Fisher's Treasure Museum is a short distance away. If you are a space enthusiast, the Cape Kennedy Visitor Center is an hour and twenty minutes away.

One of the new short weekend rallies, this rally is dedicated to family fun: fishing, kayaking, swimming. We plan to have an old fashioned cookout on Saturday afternoon and breakfast Sunday morning. Check-in is 2 to 9pm on Friday and check-out is by 11 am on Sunday.
