Coffee and Grab & Go breakfast. Devotional time. Check-out!







Maintenance Tips

After your summer travels conclude, **it's time to clean your air conditioner.** If you travel heavily you should consider doing this twice a year, but once at minimum.

It's not a hard job, but does require getting on top of your trailer (stay on the rivets!). If you can't get up there, you'll need to pay to have this important and necessary service for the longevity of your A/C.

With trailer unplugged (power off) remove the A/C shroud, the *condenser coil* (with aluminum fins) will be visible.

Carefully vacuum the coils using a BRUSH attachment (careful not to bend the fins), vacuum all around the whole unit.

Next, I use Frost King Air Conditioner Coil Foaming Cleaner. Before spraying the foam, use the included comb and carefully rake upward removing debris. (If you haven't done this in a while you'll be surprised at how much dirt is there blocking air flow!) at this point you might want to vacuum again.

I can't stress enough to be careful with the aluminum fins.

Next, spray the outside of the coil with the foaming cleanser, let it sit a few minutes, rake with comb, spray it again and let it sit. I like to rinse it but it's not required with this product.

Moving now to the *evaporator coil*, it's usually under another smaller shroud. The area under this shroud goes into the coach so it's important to use something to prevent anything from falling into this area while cleaning. Switching products, I use **Evap-Fresh No Rinse Evaporator Coil Cleaner**, (but I like to use the comb from the Frost King can). Follow the same process as above, vacuum, rake, spray, rake, but *DO NOT rinse!* The evaporator coil pulls air from inside your coach and has collected dust and cooking particles etc, so do a thorough job.

Before you replace this smaller shroud, wipe everything down with a damp rag; fan surfaces, shaft etc. There's a set screw on the fan shaft that's notorious for loosening which causes a rattle (ask me how I know!), so give this a check as well. I like to put a few drops of **3-IN-ONE Oil** where the shaft goes into the motor. Inspect your wires, looking for chaffing etc. Replace your shrouds, you're all done up here.

Finish by cleaning the intake vents inside your coach (the rectangle ones that accumulate dust).

Doing this maintenance once or twice a year will add life to your A/C units.
