JOINT RALLY WITH IOWA NORTH, OCT. 5-8

Don't forget that the Iowa and Iowa North Airstream Clubs will be jointly rallying at Hickory Grove County Park at Colo, Iowa on October 5-8, 2023. This joint rally will see the 2024 officers installed for both clubs. Breezy Bay Campground has a total of 43 campsites with 30 & 50 amp electricity. Water is available, but not at individual sites. There are just 12 sites reservable, with the remaining 31 sites on a first come - first serve basis. Reservations can only be made on-line. Just Google or bring up on your computer Hickory Grove County Park, Colo, IA and follow the instructions. With the 43 total campsites, there should be no problem securing one of the nonreservable sites if you arrive at the park about mid-week. When Tom and Shirley Herron visited with the park ranger last October, he pointed out that the four units camped there were about normal for that time of year. The official website states the camping cost is \$20 per night. The earlier you can go, the better.

2024 REGISTRATIONS - INTERNATIONAL & REGION 8

It is never too late to remind you to get registered for both the Region 8 and International Rallies next year, both of which are to be in Missouri. The International Rally registration form is in the *Blue Beret*. That **International Rally**, for the first time, *will be in the fall*. The dates are **October 5-10**, **2024** at the State Fairgrounds in Sedalia and, for an additional fee, you can register to arrive one, two or three days early. At this time, there are two lowa Club members registered for Sedalia (the Lafentz's and Cabalka's) and they would love to have another two or three couples join them in a caravan. Both have signed up to arrive one day early. Sedalia is only 258 miles from Des Moines and would be an easy 7 to 8 hour drive. The **Region 8 Rally** registration form is not yet in the *Blue Beret*, but it probably will be later this fall and winter. That rally will be based at the ABC Campground in Branson. The dates for that rally are **April 24-28, 2024**. It is your newsletter team's understanding that discounted tickets to some of the Branson shows may be available at the campground office.
