Sometimes on these trips you can suffer information overload. It can be overwhelming. However, the information received translates into knowledge that will forever change how I see the world we live in.



Surviving in a Foreign Country

When you cross into a foreign country, such as Canada, you realize they measure things differently than we do in the US. You realize that you can drive 100 miles an hour, and gas only costs about \$1.90 a gallon. Once you spend some time in Canada, you realize that things are much further away than you expect. You also realize that time moves much faster than you expect.

Someone tells you that the signs are not in miles per hour, but in kilometers per hour. Then someone tells you that to get miles per hour that you need to multiply by 0.6 and then you get miles per hour. Eureka! So.....what's this business about \$1.90/gal for gasoline? Eventually you find out that \$1.90 is not per gallon, but per liter. What's a liter? A liter is a little more than a quart. You realize that this is going to be a really expensive trip. A gallon is about 3.76034 liters, and just like that gasoline is very expensive.

Then your wife asks, "what about the exchange rate?". What exchange rate? Today, Canadian money isn't worth as much as US dollars, however Canadians are very happy and very kind people. They're happy because they live on metric time*, of course! So, what is metric time?

The metric system uses powers of ten, so a kilometer is 1000 meters and a centimeter is 1/100th of a meter. In metric time, there are 100 seconds in a minute, and there are 100 minutes in an hour. This means time goes by really fast, but we have a fix for that.

We learned that if you multiplied metric time by 0.6, then all the sudden you had 60 seconds in a minute. If you multiple metric minutes by 0.6, then we had our hours. So, traveling in Canada is really easy if you remember the rules: Everything in Canada is a multiple of 10, including time.

However, while these conversions are important to survive in a foreign country, make sure not to dwell on them. If you spend too much time thinking about these conversions then you will pull away from the gas station with the hose still attached to your vehicle.

The moral of the story is you can drive really fast, gas is cheap, but time will move really fast.
