The Tatsch House was built by early German immigrant settler Peter Tatsch in the mid-1800's using local stone. Tatsch was a master cabinet maker who built furniture at his shop in town. He and his wife raised five children there. Although the house has been modified to accommodate a

modern kitchen and arched ceiling, the basic walls are the same as in the mid-1850's. Beautiful Live Oak Creek runs along the west side of the Tatsch House as it has for hundreds of years. Next to it is the golf course and a walking trail that follows the creek. Because of the excess heat, few of us were able to enjoy some

of these sights but I encourage you to come back for Octoberfest or a cooler time the year. Maria and I walked the hiking trail last year and found it to be picturesque with sights of deer, squirrels, and chirping birds.




25 years ago, we considered buying property in the Fredericksburg area and even toured some houses. The prices seemed high at the time but since then, prices have become astronomical. There
