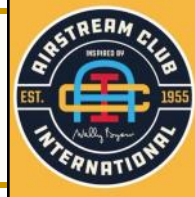

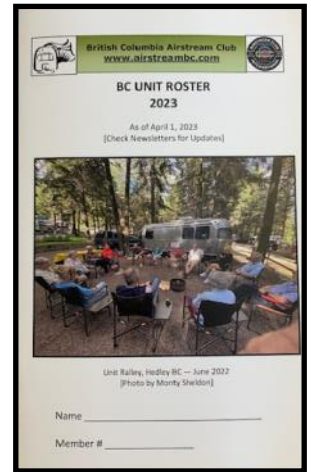

The Howell's 6 month Adventure

Stop # 4, we packed up and pulled out of Davis Mountain State Park, with a loss of one of the caravan team when they had trouble with the air bags in the tow vehicle, so after much efforts to fix the problems by a great group of team members, we had to leave them at the Park. The next day someone was coming to fix the problem, they then chose to head home. The balance of us moved onto Roadrunner Travelers RV Park in Terlingua, Texas. What can I say, this was the most interesting place. The saying goes that half the population is avoiding the police the other half the police put there. There is a wonderful resort there called Lajitas, I know next year the Caravan has reservations to stay at the their campground . Terlingua is between Big Bend State Park and Big Bend National Park. What an amazing area!



We had dinner at the Starlight Theatre that night and its all about being on the deck of the restaurant. Great food, good entertainment. The deck has an outside bar it is where everyone gathers to chat and catch up on the day, the locals love to meet the people passing through; a good time was had by all. The next night we had dinner at the Long Draw Pizza Restaurant and they opened the restaurant just for our group. I find being part of the WBCCI that this sort of

thing happens a lot, tours and places that accommodate you because of the reputation the Airstream Group has. Also, last note amazing pizza, great conversations and fun was had by all. We did get in the truck and explore Big Bend State Park, again a park with lots of hiking and biking trails, there is only one road that runs through the park. When you do the drive lots of stops along the way with different short walks/hikes into different features. The first two stops are what was left behind when they filmed the movie 'Contrabando' in the park. Other stops along the route are Big Hill, Closed Canyon, Colorado Canyon, and of course the Hoodoos. The end of the route takes you into Fort Leaton State Historical site. I think these are places that should be put on your bucket list.





Finishing up in Terlingua we moved into Big Bend National Park, we stayed at the Rio Grande Village RV Park, it was as close to the bottom end of the National Park as you can get. From the sites you could walk to the Rio Grande River, we also saw Coyotes that I do not think were very happy we had arrived; they were not a bit interested in us, they just wanted out of our way asap. What we found out the next day from the Park Rangers, was that we are right on the Texas National Park border and the Cerro Del Veinte, Mexico National Park. The residents of Bouquillas, Mexico have an agreement with the park service to allow their cattle and horses to just roam free, so we did see cattle and we did have the opportunity to see a horse with her baby wander through the grounds.

Upon our arrival we were on our own... the suggestion was to drive up to Sierra Del Carmens to watch the sunset, you could also, if you own a bathing suit, soak in the Hot Springs, in the same location. Sunset I am sure if the weather had been not over-cast would have been amazing, for those in the group that braved the Hot Springs, found them very relaxing (I guess I will have to invest in a bathing suit for next trip).

Day two in Big Bend, we travelled to Bouquillas—what an amazing trip. So let me explain; you drive to the park crossing; you do need to have a passport, or a Nexus card with you. When you arrive, Park Rangers explain what you can purchase and bring back, what you cannot purchase and will be confiscated if you bring it back. Now comes the fun, its a short hike down to the Rio Grande River, under normal weather you can chose to walk across the river, or you can for \$5.00 return trip be rowed across the river. Due to the height and flow of the river we all had to row across. The row boat was aluminum, no engine, just oars and duct tape patching the boat, fortunately its a very short crossing. When you arrive on the other side, you have three choices of transportation into Bouquillas. So you can walk the 1/2 mile along the dirt road, you can pay for a ride in the back of questionable trucks or ride a horse or burro. Well I grew up riding horses so that did not appeal to me, so yes I chose the Burro! It was fun and they are temperamental, or maybe just stubborn. We had an amazing time in Bouquillas, the residents live very simple lives, the kids all go to a one room school house, grades K to 7. The surprise was the amazing restaurant with a huge history. Its now run by the daughter of the original owner/developer of Jose Falcons. A great time was had by all. Good food, great Margaritas and cold beer. When Jose was injured in a work accident, he became wheelchair-bound, he decided to start this restaurant, and now it is being carried on by his daughter.



This town has no electricity, some places do not have running water, its very basic, now having said that, they have a cell tower, everyone has cell phones, and they recently installed a solar field, so they can run pumps and fridges. One thing we felt leaving there is that everyone seemed happy with the simplest life, it made us realize that we have way too much. I need to say great hiking, amazing views and such a diversification in plants, from the low desert to the high mountain side deserts, yes, they still call the mountains high desert. We experienced wildlife on our hikes, Jackrabbits, when they stand on their back legs, are big. We had the pleasure of catching glimpses of the Famous Roadrunners, no Wylie coyote at same place, even though we did have as I mentioned the pleasure of seeing them at the camp site. This is a place both Patrick and I will go back to it needs more time than we had and more exploration. The final day was sort of a catch-up day, where (how boring can I be) I did laundry, cleaned the trailer and prepared for our last stop with the group.

We moved onto our final stop at the Marathon Motel and RV Park. Marathon is a town on the edge of the closest thing we have to the American frontier in the 21st. century. Marathon was built in the 1800's on the railroad and ranching industries. Part of that life is still there, the railway still runs through Marathon, still in existence is the town's first schoolhouse, now a museum. Captain Sheppard's house built in 1860 is named for the railroad surveyor who founded the town and is a fully restored piece to the famous Gage family Hotel. As this was our last stop we did not have a lot of time to really explore this location—it has a lot of artisans in the area, some quite famous. Art galleries to wander in, and the Rusty Rabbit, which has books, pottery, jewelry and photographs from James Evans. We had lunch in the local coffee shop, they even, for me, had gluten free sandwiches—amazing in such a small town. Other activities going on which we had a short glimpse of was local musicians all performing at the local grocery store come small restaurant, large outdoor area with a stage. Everyone was friendly and welcoming. I want to just thank Rick and Debbie Trimble our leaders and Brain and Nancy Powers the volunteer co-leaders — without them this would not have been such an amazing experience.



Leaving was bitter sweet, we said goodbye to new friends, and everyone at different times in the morning, we moved on-to Fredricksburg, I will chat about this in next addition.

Vancouver Island Airstream Caravan

Dates: September 21 to 29, 2023

1. September 21 to 23 Camping at Quatse River Campground near Port Hardy BC. To make reservations, call the Campground directly at (250) 949-2395 or check out the website <https://quatsecampground.ca/>. They have 30 amp sites with water, and a dump station at the exit. ***The best way to book is to use the website, book your***

dates and put in the note that this is for the Airstream Caravan. Cost: \$ 46.50 per night per trailer.



There are multiple activities that we can do from there including a visit to Caps Scott Provincial Park and the San Josef Bay beach <https://www.bcmag.ca/explore-san-josef-bay-cape-scott-provincial-park/>.

2. For September 24 to 26, We are planning to camp at the Crystal Cove Beach Resort – 1165 Cedarwood Place, Tofino BC, V0R 2Z0 Tel: (250) 725-4213 <https://www.crystalcove.ca/>

The cost will be between \$ 90 and \$ 110 per night depending on the site chosen. The best way book is to call and tell them you are calling for a site for the Airstream Caravan.

This is a private resort with nice facilities and a private beach access. They have space for the dates in September at this point, but sites will need to be reserved soon. I went there to look at the resort after realizing that camping at Pacific Rim National park was not going to be feasible. Of the three RV parks I visited in the area, this is definitely the nicest one. The sites have water hydro and sewer. There are great facilities for meetings, laundry and relaxing. The location is close to Tofino and access to the multiuse trail that stretches from Tofino to Ucluelet is close. A good place to bring bicycles or e-bikes to use on the trail. We can also easily get to Pacific Rim National Park and its trails, either by the multiuse trail or on the road.

The office has a large patio for relaxing and meetings. With a store for snacks and drinks.

The sites are separated by mature trees and undergrowth, giving a sense of privacy.

3. For September 27 to 29 We are planning to camp in Victoria at the Salish Seaside RV Resort and Marina, <https://www.salishseasidervhaven.com/> This resort has only 8 sites available for the dates I requested. If more than 8 units want to take part, we could look at other alternatives in the area for any extra campers. The location I across the harbour from the main marina, and it is easy to take a water taxi to the other side and explore downtown Victoria. All sites have full services and

nice concrete pads. ***They are willing to hold 8 sites for us until May 15, so we have to book and confirm by then. Cost for the sites vary somewhat by the size and location of sites. From \$ 92 to \$ 132 per night per site. Their preference would be for me to book the sites all through one person, and I would need to have first nights deposit paid. So please let me know as soon as possible if you would like to take part in this caravan.***

To organize the caravan, it would be helpful to have a list of people interested in coming. This mini caravan is nine days on Vancouver Island. We will be doing it in three campgrounds, three days each, covering the north end of Vancouver Island near Port Hardy to the west coast near Tofino and Uclulet then south to Victoria. The activities can include tours we can do as a group such as a ferry ride as walk on passengers to Alert Bay and the U'mista Cultural Centre, or a carpool to the trail leading to San Josef Beach. There are also many things at each site suitable for small groups or individual activities.

For some activities such as boat tours for wild-life viewing, these need to be booked ahead of time, and we can see how many people are interested in doing these. I will draw up a list of possible activities with costs and e-mail these out in advance of the Caravan/Rally, so that interested participants can sign up and we can book them in advance.



Many campgrounds on Vancouver island remain open year round, and if people want to extend the stay on the island that certainly is a possibility.

The best way to arrive on the island would be to come in to Nanaimo, either from Tsawwassen or from Horseshoe Bay ferry terminals, and drive up to Quatse River Campground, Port Hardy on September 21. It is an easy comfortable drive on good pavement from Departure Bay or Duke Point ferry terminals. About 385 kilometers just over 4 hours of driving time.

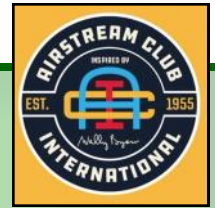
